

Sporting Clays

- Teams of 4 move from station to station to shoot 100 clay targets spread out over multiple stations
- 2 Clays are thrown from 2 machines one at a time (report pair) or both at once (true pair)
- Each person must have ear & eye protection on at all times when around a station. We can provide them or you can.
- You can have a volunteer at each station to press the buttons for the machines (called a trapper) or each team can do it themselves



Mulligans

Shooters can buy mulligans that add to their score at the end of the shoot. You can sell mulligans for \$20 each



Cotton Ball

A cotton ball is glued to the bottom of the target. The goal is to shoot the target to make the cotton ball land in the bucket (3 tickets), on the small tarp (2 tickets) or on the large tarp (1 ticket). Everyone shoots it as part of the 100 target course, but they can pay \$10 to have their cotton balls count and earn them raffle tickets.



Long Bird

A long bird is a target thrown from the top of the fire truck separate from the course

Shooters pay \$10 for 10 shots and the volunteer in charge records how many they hit. They can keep paying to reshoot it.

Award a prize for High Over All and you can also give out a ticket for each clay hit and give out a raffle prize.

Shotguns Only

Over & Under or Semi-Auto Shotguns are preferable over pump guns.

All shells should be 7 1/2, 8 or 9 shot. No hunting loads.
