# SHRUBS

Abelia, Abelia x grandiflora 'Hopley's Twist of Lime™'



1 gallon pot, \$21.00 Height: 4-5 feet tall and wide variegated broadleaf evergreen shrub Plant in full sun in well-drained soil Blooms all summer Color: pale pink summer flowers over vivid green and yellow new growth, which matures to variegated ivory and green Deer resistant, drought tolerant

# Azalea dwarf, Rhododendron x 'Gumpo White'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 2 feet tall, 3 feet wide broadleaf evergreen shrub Plant in well drained, moist acidic soil, in part sun or filtered shade Blooms in late spring to early summer Color: a profusion of white flowers with ruffled edges, with glossy evergreen leaves Prized for its petite habit, this compact evergreen is ideal for containers, woodland gardens and low borders surrounding tall shrubs. 'Gumpo White' performs best in partial shade and well-drained, acidic soil and draws pollinators into the garden with an abundance of nectar-rich blossoms.

Performs best in part sun or filtered shade, morning sun and afternoon shade is ideal Attracts butterflies and other pollinators

#### Butterfly Bush dwarf, Buddleia x 'Pugster Blue®' (Proven Winner)

Height: 2 feet tall, 2-3 feet wide deciduous shrub
Plant in full sun in well-drained soil
Blooms nonstop from early summer through fall
Color: true-blue flowers, each with a tiny yellow-orange eye in the center

# Camellia (early spring bloom), Camellia japonica 'White by the Gate'





1 gallon pot, \$12.00

Height: 10-12 feet tall, 6-8 feet wide broadleaf evergreen shrub

Plant in acidic soil and provide some shade to protect the plant from direct summer sun (morning sun is preferred)

Blooms in late winter/very early spring over a long period

Color: pure white geometric shaped blooms set this variety aside from other white camellias which tend to contain a hint of pink

Prized for their long bloom time, 'White by the Gate' is a long-time favorite for landscapers and gardeners. Unusually cold temperatures can damage or kill buds and flowers, shelter from cold wind. Mature plants can withstand more sun, and are more drought tolerant than smaller plants.

Slow growing, dense and upright shrub with glossy evergreen leaves. An old and reliable favorite.

Camellias are an important early nectar source for bees.

Resistant to drought, heat and humidity, fairly deer resistant.

#### Chinese Fringe dwarf, Loropetalum chinense 'Cerise Charm'





3 gallon pot, \$28.00

Height: 3-4 feet tall and wide broadleaf evergreen shrub

Plant in full sun to part sun, in well drained acidic soil

Blooms on old wood in mid-spring

Color: very dark plum foliage, hot pink fringed flowers in spring

This is a new dwarf loropetalum which retains its bright burgundy foliage year-round with no reversion to green, even in the unforgiving heat of the Southeast. Cerise Charm is a true breakthrough with dark plum, almost black, small leaf foliage that doesn't fade. It has graceful, arching branches on a well behaved habit.

Pruning is seldom needed, has a natural mounded shape. Deer resistant and very drought tolerant once established. Big 3 gallon plant

#### Creeping Rosemary, Rosmarinus officinalis 'Prostratus'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 1 foot tall, 4-6 foot spread, evergreen culinary herb Plant in full sun Blooms in midsummer, and sporadically all year round Color: light blue flowers on fragrant evergreen foliage Attractive to bees, butterflies and birds Beautiful cascading over a wall Drought tolerant Deer resistant (this and lavender are two of the best deer deterrents) Useful herb with roasted meats and in winter stews

# Florida Anise, Illicium Floridanum





1 gallon plant, \$9.00 Height: 7-8 feet tall, broadleaf evergreen shrub Plant in partial shade Blooms mid-spring Color: small dark red flowers Decorative seed pods similar to star anise but not edible Leaves have anise scent when crushed Native to Southeastern woodlands Attracts butterflies and bees Deer resistant

#### Gardenia, Gardenia jasminoides 'Frostproof'



1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 3-4 feet tall, 5-6 feet wide broadleaf evergreen shrub Plant in full to part sun in well-drained soil Blooms in spring through summer Color: creamy 2-3 inch very fragrant white blooms over shiny dark green foliage Most tolerant of all gardenias to frost Also tolerates heat and humidity An old fashioned favorite Deer resistant

# Hydrangea Oakleaf, H. quercifolia 'Snow Queen'





3 gallon pot, \$25.00 Height: 4-6 feet tall, 6-8 feet wide flowering deciduous shrub Plant in full sun to partial shade, prefers moist soil Blooms in early through mid-summer (good for drying) Color: pyramid-shaped panicles open white then turn pale pink and deepen to rose, foliage dark green in summer turning mahogany-red in autumn Prune just after flowering only if needed Attracts butterflies and bees Native hybrid Large 3 gallon plant

#### Rose, Rosa floribunda 'Brindabella First Lady™'





1 gallon pot, \$15.00

Height: 4 feet tall and wide deciduous shrub

Plant in well drained rich soil in full sun, or morning sun with afternoon shade in hotter areas Blooms continuously from spring to frost

Color: large, fragrant double lavender pink blossoms until frost, with glossy dark green foliage These tough shrub roses are selected for superior garden performance and show-stopping flowers. They have a bushy growth habit, excellent disease resistance and heat tolerance, and very fragrant doubled flowers. Very well suited to home gardens and commercial landscapes (as well as containers), the foliage is among the cleanest to be found in any shrub rose and the fragrance will stop any passerby in their tracks. This beauty perpetually produces an abundance of double flowers in shades of lavender pink from spring to frost! The flowers are self-cleaning which means no deadheading required. Though very vigorous, this low maintenance rose grows to only 4 feet tall and wide in 2 years time. Plant 3 to 3.5 feet apart for solid hedges; 8+ feet apart for space between plants Pollinators love them!

# Doublefile Viburnum, Viburnum plicatum 'Shasta'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 6-8 feet tall and wide deciduous shrub Plant in partial sun for most flowers Blooms continuously from June to autumn Color: flattened lacecap-like clusters of white flowers in a double row along branches, followed by red berries if you have more than one plant Prefers moist, well drained, slightly acidic soil Attracts butterflies and bees Birds love the red berries in autumn Perpetual bloomer

## Southern Magnolia semi-dwarf tree, Magnolia grandiflora 'Brittany'





3 gallon pot, \$28.00 Height: 10-15 feet tall, 8-10 feet wide broadleaf evergreen small tree Plant in full sun in well drained acidic soil

Blooms for a long period in summer, followed by decorative red cone seed pods

Color: Large 8-10 inch very fragrant white flowers, large glossy evergreen leaves with velvety backsides For those who have limited space but want the beauty and fragrance of Southern Magnolia, unlike its larger cousins (which grow to 50 feet plus in height), 'Brittany' is a new introduction that is one of the dwarfs in the family of Southern Magnolias. 'Brittany' is somewhat similar in appearance to the well-known 'Little Gem' Magnolia, but has larger flowers, grows more densely and upright, and her leaves have the velvety reddish golden undersides of the much larger Southern Magnolias.

Makes a beautiful hedge or privacy fence (space 6 feet apart for solid hedge, 14+ feet apart for space between)

Resistant to deer, pests, disease, drought, heat and humidity

An old fashioned Southern favorite, foliage is useful for holiday decorating Large 3 gallon plant

# Spirea, S. japonica 'Goldmound'





.1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 3-4 feet flowering deciduous shrub Plant in full sun to partial shade (foliage brightest in full sun) Blooms in mid-summer Color: pink flowers, but mainly grown for lime green foliage Nice mounded shape, good autumn color Water regularly first year Attracts butterflies and bees Deer resistant

# Yew, Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Prostrata'



1 gallon pot, \$12.00 Height: 2-3 feet tall, 3-4 feet wide needled evergreen Plant in part shade, but established plants will tolerate full sun Used for foundation and mass plantings or hedges Color: soft green needled evergreen foliage Loves our hot, humid summer weather A slow growing plant that needs little maintenance and has very few pests Deer resistant

# PERENNIALS

#### Beardtongue, Penstemon digitalis 'Huskers Red'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 2-3 feet tall, up to 2 feet wide semi-evergreen perennial Plant in well-drained soil in full sun, do not over-fertilize Blooms late spring through early summer Color: white tubular flowers on tall stems, with dark maroon-red leaves and stems The foliage is maroon in spring, turning greener with age but with maroon veining. The stems remain red making a nice contrast. 'Huskers Red' is drought tolerant once established. Wet winter soils will cause root rot Native hybrid Attracts bees and hummingbirds Resistant to deer and drought

#### Bee Balm dwarf, Monarda didyma Sugar Buzz™ 'Cherry Pops'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: up to 2 feet tall and wide native hybrid perennial

Plant in full sun to partial sun

Blooms July through August (deadhead to prolong bloom)

Color: cherry red flowers on aromatic green foliage

In midsummer, 'Cherry Pops' forms a solid dome of cherry red,  $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ " flowers on strong, well-branched stems. It is perfectly suited to the middle of the flower border at 18-24" tall, no staking needed.

This plant is a butterfly and hummingbird magnet!

Native hybrid

Deer resistant, mildew resistant foliage

#### Betony, Stachys officinalis 'Hummelo'





1 gallon pot, \$11.00

Height: up to 2 feet tall and wide semi-evergreen perennial Plant in well-drained moist soil in full to partial sun (needs good drainage) Blooms all summer

Color: prolific rose-lavender flower spikes on attractive, crinkled foliage

A wealth of rose-lavender spikes all summer are particularly fabulous in massed plantings. Deadhead to keep plants attractive and to keep from going to seed, which declines the foliage. Do not prune for winter; clean up foliage in spring. Benefits from partial shade in hot climates. Pollinator magnet

#### Blazing Star, Liatris spicata 'Kobold'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 2-3 feet tall, 1-2 feet wide perennial Plant in well-drained soil in full sun Blooms late summer from July through September Color: bright purple flower plumes 'Kobold' is a compact variety, with each large feathery-looking, bright purple flower plume growing up to 36 inches tall. Due to its small size, this plant requires less staking as its sturdy stems can properly handle the weight of their large flowers. Flowers are useful as fresh cut or dried Drought tolerant once established Attracts pollinators of all sorts Native to the eastern United States

#### Catmint, Nepeta racemosa 'Walker's Low'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 2-3 feet tall and wide perennial Plant in well-drained soil in full sun to partial sun, do not overwater Blooms from spring to fall Color: pale blue to deep violet small trumpet-shaped flower clusters and gray-green aromatic foliage Thrives in dry soils and is very tolerant of drought. Somewhat intolerant of the heat and humidity of the southeast, however, and appreciates some light afternoon shade in hot summer climates. Shear flower spikes after initial flowering to promote continued bloom. Attracts pollinators of all sorts Deer and rabbit resistant

#### Coral Bells, Heuchera x villosa 'Caramel'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 1-2 feet tall and wide semi-evergreen perennial Plant in part shade, well-drained moist, rich soil Blooms in early through mid-summer Color: leaves emerge gray-red in spring and mature to golden-apricot/caramel by summer with rosy colored backsides. Tiny, light pink flowers appear in sprays in early summer (later than most heucheras) Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds Humidity and drought tolerant, deer resistant Mulch to help keep its leaves in winter

#### Coral Bells, Heuchera micrantha 'Palace Purple'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00

Height: 1-2 feet tall and wide semi-evergreen perennial Plant in rich well-drained moist soil, in sun or partial sun (preferably morning sun) Blooms in midsummer Color: foliage ranges in color from dark olive green to bronze-green to a deep purple with a dark wine-red on the leaf underside, with contrasting sprays of tiny white flowers In hot summer areas, a part-shade location will help to prevent the leaf color from fading. A great choice for adding color and contrast to borders when coupled with green foliage plants. Attracts butterflies and bees Deer and rabbit resistant

# False Indigo, Baptisia hybrid Decadence® Deluxe 'Pink Lemonade' (Proven Winner)





1 gallon pot, \$16.00 Height: 3-4 feet tall and wide perennial Plant in well-drained soil in full to partial sun Blooms in late spring to early summer, followed by eye-catching seed pods Color: bold yellow and purple flower spikes, on dark stems Has a full and bushy habit, a perfect substitute for shrubs. Can be used as a specimen plant, or in back of the border. Baptisia is easy to grow and will thrive with little maintenance. Plants are very long-lived once established. Native to North America, hybrid. Attracts bees, butterflies and other pollinators Deer resistant

# Foxglove (biennial), Digitalis purpurea 'Foxy' mix





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 1 foot tall and wide (3 feet tall in bloom), biennial Plant in well-drained moist soil in partial sun Blooms late spring through midsummer Color: flowers are a mixture of creamy-white, mauve and pink spikes with spotted throats Extraordinary cut flower, essential to cottage gardens and perennial borders. Biennials flower in their second year, and then die (but can naturalize and reseed itself where conditions are right). Both flowers and leaves are toxic if ingested. Attracts bees, butterflies, hummingbirds and other pollinators Deer and rabbit resistant

#### Joe Pye Weed dwarf, Eupatorium purpureum 'Euphoria™ Ruby'



1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 2-3 feet tall and wide, native hybrid perennial Plant in full sun to partial sun, in well drained moist soil Blooms from early summer well into fall Color: magenta purple-pink flowers on tall, sturdy, reddish-purple stems. This is a compact, early-flowering variety of our much larger classic summer flowering native perennial. Great used as an accent, in a mass, native plant garden, rain garden, foundation planting, or cottage garden. Cut back in fall or early spring to encourage healthy new growth the next season. Attracts bees, butterflies and other pollinators Deer and rabbit resistant

#### Lavender, Lavandula x intermedia 'Phenomenal'





1 gallon pot, \$10.00

Height: 3 feet tall and wide, evergreen perennial

Plant in full sun in VERY well-draining soil with neutral pH (mix soil with small gravel, on a slight mound), and do not fertilize or overwater

Blooms in mid-summer until fall

Color: fragrant lavender flower spikes in summer, with fragrant gray-green foliage

This is one of the newest and most versatile lavenders, capable of thriving in dry, hot and cold climates, and notable for tolerating our southern humidity.

Lavender 'Phenomenal' fragrance is strongest and the flowering is most spectacular in the hottest and driest summers, and when the lavender is planted in nutrient poor soils.

'Phenomenal' can live up to 15 years with the proper care. Deadhead regularly to extend the flowering time. Prune annually in late fall by no more than 1/3, removing flower spikes and shaping into a mound. Plant each lavender 3 feet apart, or every 2 feet for full hedges.

Drought resistant, heat tolerant, tolerates some humidity, cold hardy, and tolerates freezing winter temperatures.

Deer resistant (this and rosemary are two of the best deer deterrents)

# Pincushion Flower, Scabiosa columbaria 'Butterfly Blue'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00

Height: 12-18 inches tall and wide perennial Plant in well-drained soil in full sun

Blooms from spring to frost

Color: 2 inch flat, lavender blue flowers are pincushion shaped, with finely cut gray-green leaves Remove spent flowers to encourage additional bloom.

No serious insect or disease problems. Must have well-drained soil to thrive.

Excellent for grouping in front of borders and rock gardens, or used as edging.

Attracts butterflies, deer and drought tolerant

# Pink Muhly Grass, Muhlenbergia capillaris 'Pink Muhly'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00

Height: 2-3 feet tall and wide perennial grass
Plant in dry to medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun to light shade
Blooms in fall with spectacular clouds of airy, open pink flower plumes up to 12" long floating above the grassy foliage. Tan seed plumes remain attractive in winter.
Color: fluffy flower plumes in pink to pinkish red
It is the fall flowering that most distinguishes this native grass.
Birds love the seeds
Deer resistant
Drought tolerant

### Pinks, Dianthus x 'Georgia Peach'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 1 foot tall, 1 foot wide perennial Plant in well-drained soil in full sun Blooms late spring to mid-summer Color: fragrant pale blush pink single 2 inch blooms with soft watercolor peach centers, edged with a ring of vibrant coral, blue-green foliage These stunning new hybrid pinks have blooms that are carried on sturdy stems that do not flop. Tidy, compact habit is perfect for patio containers, borders, and cutting gardens. May remain evergreen in warmer winter regions. Heat and drought tolerant Attracts butterflies

# Rose Mallow, Hibiscus hybrid Summerific® 'Holy Grail' (Proven Winner)





1 gallon pot, \$16.00

Height: 4-5 feet tall and wide perennial

Plant in well-drained moist acidic soil in full sun

Blooms from mid-summer through fall

Color: deep red flowers 8-9 inches across, with nearly black foliage

Once the flowers fall off, the bright green calyxes starkly contrast the dark foliage.

These North American native hybrids provide massive, tropical-looking flowers and a striking focal point to your late summer and fall garden.

Although later to emerge than most perennials in spring, these are fast growing plants capable of adding an inch of new growth a day.

Attracts butterflies, bees and hummingbirds Deer resistant

#### Salvia (perennial), Salvia guaranitica 'Black & Blue'



1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 3-4 feet tall, 3-4 feet wide tender perennial in our area Plant in full sun to part shade in well-drained soil, mulch over winter Blooms mid-summer to frost

Color: flowers deep blue with black stems, scented foliage Deadhead spent flowers to encourage additional bloom Excellent for adding dark, dramatic contrast to any garden Deer resistant, attractive to butterflies and hummingbirds

#### Tickseed, Coreopsis auriculata 'Nana'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00

Height: 6-9 inches tall, 2 feet wide evergreen perennial

Plant in moist, well-drained soil in full sun to partial shade

Blooms May through August

Color: brilliant golden yellow flowers with unique fluted petals

Cut down by half in August for a fall rebloom

Birds love the seeds, so don't deadhead after fall rebloom until spring!

This is a great plant to use to fill in around taller plants as this helps cut down on mulching needs. It can also be used at the front of the border, as an edger, groundcover or in a naturalized area. Thrives in heat and humidity, do not overwater.

Attracts butterflies and pollinators

Deer resistant, native hybrid

# Yarrow, Achillea millefolium 'New Vintage™ Violet' (Proven Winner)





1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 1 foot tall and wide perennial Plant in well-drained soil, in full sun Blooms all summer

Color: flat heads of small violet-red flowers, fern-like blue-green foliage

Unlike most yarrow, this compact variety has bold, violet-red flowers that keep their color longer into the summer.

Avoid planting in rich soil, as flowers tend to flop. Cut back flowers by half after flowers have faded to promote a second bloom.

Heat and drought tolerant once established Tolerates poor soil Attracts butterflies and bees Deer and rabbit resistant

# Japanese Painted Fern, Anthurium niponicum 'Pictum'





1 gallon pot, \$8.00 Height: 18 inches perennial (space 18 inches apart for full ground cover) Plant in partial to full shade Fronds silver/gray with purple, best color in light shade Weeping habit, very hardy Dies back in winter but fully hardy Deer and rabbit resistant

# Shiny Bristle Fern, Arachniodes davalliaeformis



1 gallon pot, \$8.00 Height: 18-24 inches perennial (space 24 inches apart for full ground cover) Plant in partial to full shade Shiny, dark green foliage feels as though it is made from plastic, much different from most ferns Slowly spreading clump of upright 2 foot long stiff triangular fronds Semi-evergreen Deer and rabbit resistant

# GROUNDCOVERS

Bugle Weed, Ajuga reptans 'Bronze Beauty'





3.5" pot, \$4.00
Height: 4-6 inches, with 18-24 inch spread evergreen perennial groundcover
Plant in partial sun in average soil
Blooms in mid-spring
Color: glossy, bronze-purple foliage, with bright blue bloom stalks in spring
Wonderful groundcover for between stones in paths or as erosion control on slopes
Blooms attract butterflies and hummingbirds
Deer and rabbit resistant

# Creeping Mazus, Mazus reptans (blue)





3.5" pot, \$4.00

Height: 4-6 inches tall and 1 foot wide perennial groundcover Plant in full sun with some afternoon shade in most any soil type (but flowers best in well drained soil)

Blooms in spring

Color: bright blue flowers on blue-green foliage

Can be used as a low maintenance lawn substitute as it withstands foot traffic (plant 6 plants per square yard for good coverage)

Can be mown with blade set at 3-4 inches

Drought tolerant, deer resistant

# Creeping Thyme, Thymus serpyllum 'Pink Chintz'





3.5" pot, \$4.00

Height: 6 inches tall and wide semi-evergreen perennial groundcover Plant in full sun in well-drained soil Blooms in June and July, as a carpet of salmon pink flowers Color: salmon pink flowers on fragrant blue-green foliage Can be used as a low traffic lawn, mowing to 3-4 inches tall after bloom Very fragrant blue-green foliage Attracts butterflies and other pollinators Drought tolerant and deer resistant

# Dwarf Mondo Grass, Ophiopogon japonicus 'Nana'





3.5" pot, \$4.00

Height: 6 inches tall, spreading to 6 inches wide clumping evergreen groundcover Plant in moist but well-drained soil in partial sun

Blooms small white flowers in spring, followed by bright blue berries

Color: dark green arching leaves

Dwarf Mondo can be used as a low edger, between stepping stones or a rock garden. It can tolerate some foot traffic so it makes a great lawn alternative for low-traffic areas. Useful used in fairy gardens as trees. Deer and rabbit resistant

# Japanese Pachysandra, Pachysandra terminalis





3.5" pot, \$4.00

Height: 6-12 inches tall, 12-18 inches wide evergreen perennial groundcover

Plant in partial shade to full shade, intolerant of full sun

Blooms in early spring

Color: shiny green foliage with white flowers

Good groundcover for banks, under trees, or other shady areas.

This plant prefers moist, slightly acidic soils that have high organic matter and are well-drained, but can tolerate drought once established.

# St. John's Wort dwarf, Hypericum calycinum





3.5" pot, \$4.00

Height: 12-18 inches tall, 18-24 inches wide, deciduous shrubby groundcover Plant in fertile, well-drained soil in sun or shade (blooms best in sun)

Blooms in July and August

Color: large yellow flowers that give a powder-puff appearance

The plant can grow in the heavy shade of trees and in dry shade, and is vigorous to the point where it can swamp out small plants. It can be considered an evergreen in warm winter climates, but usually dies to the ground in cold winters. However, it blooms on new growth and comes back each spring.

In areas where it does not die in winter, shear or mow plants in late winter or early spring every 2-3 years to renew and induce new growth.

# Thrift (Creeping Phlox), Phlox subulata 'Candy Stripe'





4.5" pot, \$5.00
Height: 6 inches, with 24 inch spread evergreen perennial
Plant in full to part sun
Blooms in spring, March through May
Color: white flowers with pink stripes form a mass over the needle-like dark green foliage

# **FRUITS** Blackberry (thornless), Rubus fruticosus 'Prime-Ark Traveler'

Plant in full sun

Birds are attracted to the berries

Glossy and firm large fruit with high-quality flavor. Thornless canes have a vigorous, upright growth habit that makes berries easy to pick. Best for eating fresh, using in recipes, and offering at farmers' markets. Everbearing primocane variety (bears two crops each year). First-year canes begin ripening in mid-July, while second-year canes bear heaviest crops in June. Continues to fruit until frost. Stores and "travels" well. Early season. Self-pollinating.

# Blueberry 'Krewer™', Vaccinium ashei 'Krewer'

1 gallon pot, \$9.00 Height: 5-7 feet tall and 5-7 feet wide Plant in full sun in rich, moist, well-drained acid soil Berries ripen late May through June (both are early to mid-season here) Good landscape shrub with attractive fall leaf color Birds are attracted to the berries Feed with a good azalea fertilizer in the early spring 'Krewer™' is one of many blueberry varieties developed at UGA, and is named for the retired horticulturalist Gerard Krewer who worked many years to help get Georgia's blueberry industry off the ground. Berries are the size of a quarter, up to 4 times larger than most. It was released by UGA for home

# Blueberry 'Pink Lemonade', Vaccinium x 'Pink Lemonade'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00

Height: 5-7 feet tall and 5-7 feet wide
Plant in full sun in rich, moist, well-drained acid soil
Berries ripen late May through June (both are early to mid-season here)
Good landscape shrub with attractive fall leaf color
Birds are attracted to the berries
Feed with a good azalea fertilizer in the early spring

'Pink Lemonade' is a hybrid blueberry with gorgeous dark pink/red berries, and a slightly tropical flavor. **NOTE:** One of the most important growing requirements of rabbiteye blueberries is their need for cross-pollination to set fruit. **You must have more than one variety for a good crop.** 

# Elderberry, Sambucus canadensis 'Wyldewood'





1 gallon pot, \$12.00 Height: 5-8 feet tall and wide deciduous shrubby fruit tree Plant in full sun to part shade Will grow in well drained poor soil and is very cold hardy

Large white flower clusters followed by large clusters of juicy dark fruit

This is a newer variety of our native American elderberry that is big on yield. Huge flower heads are a full 2" wider than existing varieties, producing foot-wide pompoms of blooms in June. The fruit ripens in late summer (about 2 weeks later than other American elderberry varieties).

Fruit ripens in August (must cook before eating).

Both flowers and fruit are useful in making beverages, syrups, jams and jellies.

Good fall color

Deer resistant

**NOTE:** Like blueberries, elderberries do need another variety close by for cross-pollination, but our wild native varieties can provide that.

# Fig, Ficus carica 'Chicago Hardy'





1 gallon pot, \$9.00

Height: 10-15 feet tall, 9-12 feet wide semi-evergreen shrubby fruit tree

Plant in rich, moist but well-drained soil in full sun to part shade (best against a south-facing wall with mulch)

Insignificant flowers pollinated in spring form the fruit

Different from 'Brown Turkey' and 'Celeste' in that the dark purple/brown fruit is larger and it can take the cold.

Most dependable outdoor fig for our area

Birds are attracted to the fruit, leaves are deer resistant

# Raspberry, Rubus idaeus 'Fall Gold'



1 gallon pot, \$9.00

Height: 5-6 feet fruiting arching canes (do not need staking) Plant in full sun

Everbearing, with moderate crop in July and a second heavy crop in September

Beautiful yellow-gold raspberry is extremely sweet and excellent for fresh eating, canning and preserves Similar to red raspberries in all respects but color, vigorous and extremely hardy

Very similar to popular 'Heritage' red raspberry in growth habits, fruiting times and maintenance Birds are attracted to the fruit
