FERNS

Japanese Painted Fern 'Athyrium Niponicum 'Pictum'





1-Gallon, \$11.00 Plant size: 12 - 18 inch

Plant size: 12 - 18 inches tall, 18 - 24 inches Wide.

Part sun-full shade, deciduous

Evokes the shady tranquility of its native Oriental gardens. One of the most popular cultivated ferns, due to the beautiful combination of green and purple shades on its fronds that appear to be "painted" with silver. Easy to grow in damp, humusy soil, not too fertile. Deer tends to avoid it.

Japanese Holly Fern 'Cyrtomium Falcatum 'Rochfordianum'





1- Gallon, \$11.00 Height size:18 to 24 in. tall, Wide 24 to 36 in. Plant: Partial shade to partial sun

Popular for its hardiness and handsome foliage, this fern makes an excellent groundcover or border edging in shaded locations. The stiff, glossy, dark green fronds of holly-like leaflets with coarsely fringed margins add excellent texture to container plantings. Evergreen in mild winter regions.

Autumn Fern 'Dryopteris Erythrosora'

Height size:18 to 24in.tall, 24 to 36 in. wide. Plant Partial shade to partial sun.

Dryopteris Erythrosora is known as the "Autumn Fern"; this beauty is at its best in the spring, "autumn" describing its colors as foliage color changes with season. New growth emerges metallic coppery green, turns green in summer and bronzy in fall. Scarlet spores adorn the undersides of the fronds.

Grows best in partial to full shade and moist, slightly acidic soil.

Apple Tree 'Arkansas Black'





5-Gallon, \$30.00

Height: 4-5 feet wide and 15-20 feet Plant: Full sun, Needs full sun and well-drained soil. Blooms in: Spring

The Arkansa's Black Apple Tree flavor is described as wine and honey, with hints of almonds and a mild vanilla finish, making them amazing dessert apples! A mid-spring blooming tree and late-maturing apple, each rounded, medium-sized apple is such a deep red with a waxy skin. Appearing almost black, especially when stored, the firm skin shines purple red in the sunlight and on the tree into the fall, making it a favorite of wildlife. The crisp, whitish-yellow flesh is superb. With a sweet-tart flavor and a firm, yet juicy. It develops its best flavor after it has been stored chilled for a couple of months where it will darken and ripen where it sweetens.

Apple Tree 'Jona Gold'

Jonagold was bred in the 1940s as a cross between two classics, the Golden Delicious and Jonathan, and Jonagold has the best from both! It is a large golden-yellow Apple with large splashes of red on its thin skin. Excellent for fresh eating or sauces, salads, pies, cider, preserves and canning, is described as both sweet and sharp, and aromatically flavored! It does not store well but you can harvest over a long period of time from the tree. Pollinators adore these blooms, and the spring display is breath-taking!

Apple Tree 'Robinson Crabapple'

Blooms in: Spring lovely white flowers

This tree produces a 1"-1 1/2"sweet edible crabapple that holds tight to the tree that drops free as colder weather sets in, typically October &November for me in the Northeast. Attractive to deer? Yes! This tree produces consistent annual crops of crabapples. Disease resistant

Thornless Blackberry "Ouachita" Deciduous Fruit Bush

Height: 4 - 8 feet tall and 2 to 3 feet wide Plant: Full Sun or Mostly Sun Blooms in: July - September, self-pollinating floricane. Color: Black, Blue

These large, juicy-sweet, blue-black berries grow abundantly for five of your summer's sweetest weeks. Enjoy the firm, nutritious berries as a snack or instant dessert; and they're superb in a pie. The thornless blackberry plants are upright, orderly, and easy to maintain. Growing 4-8, the plants form a sturdy hedge with the canes supporting pounds of fruit without a trellis. Plant blackberries 100 feet away from red raspberries. The fruit will ripen from red to black, but do not pick them as soon as they turn black, wait 3-4 days and pick when the color has a dull appearance.

Thornless Blackberry "Triple Crown" Deciduous Fruit Bush

Blueberry - Tifblue Deciduous Fruit Bush

It has a tall, upright growth habit, good freeze resistance, and is one of the most ornamental rabbiteye varieties due to its brilliant orange-red fall leaf color. Tifblue ripens in mid-late season, and produces abundant yields of light blue, medium-large size fruit, with excellent flavor. Tifblue berries also store and ship very well-which is yet another reason it has been a top selection for both home and commercial growers. Make sure to plant two different cultivars/ varieties for each season. Beneficial Pollinators and birds are attracted to the berries.

Blueberry "Titan" Deciduous Fruit Bush

Blooms in mid-late season, berries are light blue.

The largest fruit ever seen at the University of Georgia Rabbiteye breeding program! Firm, light blue berries are much better flavored than older varieties. Shelf life after harvest is outstanding. Ripens midlate season, resistant to stem canker. The "latest and greatest" from University of Georgia! Titan is not self-fertile so it should be planted with another rabbiteye. Pollinate with Powderblue or Ochlockonee. Bareroot. Zones 7–9. It is also known for its very firm, uniformly round berries. Beneficial Pollinators and birds are attracted to the berries.

Elderberry 'Wyldewood'





3-Gallon, \$21.00 Height:5-6 feet tall and 5-6 feet wide Plant Full Sun Blooms Small, sweet, dark purple fruit.

'Wyldewood' is a new American Elderberry plant with high yields and superior fruit production from its immense flower heads that often reach up to 12" across. 'Wyldewood' needs to be cross-pollinated and we recommend 'Ranch.' That is why we are also offering the American Elderberry 'Ranch,' an excellent elderberry with a short stature and it only grows 5-6' tall so the berries are easily harvested. It's also one of the most forgiving if you have non-fertile soil and it handles a zone 3 winter easily. Elderberry is well known as an ingredient in wines and jams but now the medicinal world has reported the use of elderberry helps mitigate colds and flu viruses because of its antiviral properties. It is also a great source of vitamin C and has been used for antibacterial properties as well.

Fig 'Brown Turkey'

Enjoy luscious, juicy figs right out of your own backyard. This hardy variety can be grown in the landscape or containers. Grows well in small spaces, self-fertile plants. Plant in full sun. Zones 7-9.

Peach Tree 'Loring Peach'

Pear Tree 'Kieffer'

Pear Tree 'Orient'

The fruit has smooth flesh with a mild, sweet flavor and abundant juice. It is perfect for eating fresh, sliced in salads, or canned. Strong resistance to fire blight disease, Bees and butterflies will love it! A good choice for mild winter areas. Smooth textured white flesh is sweet, firm, and juicy. Heavy producer. Medium resistance to fire blight. Does better with a pollinator such as Bartlett, Kieffer, or Moonglow.

Plum Tree 'Au Rosa'

apart Blooms: Early spring, fragrant white flowers

The Au Rosa Plum fruit is medium-sized, round in shape, and juicy with dark red skin and yellow flesh that melts like butter in your mouth. Fresh fruit ripens during summer from mid-June to early July. With high disease resistance and little issues with pests. The green leaves will cover the limbs from spring through fall until falling down to the ground in winter. The University of Auburn developed this tree as an improved version of the Santa Rose. In early spring, fragrant white flowers will explode on the tree's branches to invite pollinators such as bees and butterflies into your landscape.

Thornless Raspberry "Caroline" Deciduous Fruit





1-Gallon, \$9.00

Height: 4 - 6 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide Plant: Full Sun or Mostly Sun

Blooms in: June- July, self-pollinating floricane, berries are red

Caroline is the best-tasting red raspberry. The large berries have a very rich, sweet, full-bodied flavor. The berries are excellent for fresh eating, canning, freezing and jellies, desserts. A fall-bearing type, it ripens in late summer and produces berries until frost. Caroline is a highly productive self-pollinating variety that starts bearing fruit 2 years from the date of planting. It's tolerant to root rot and has a high resistance to gray mold. Very adaptable and well-suited for the South

Note: Do not plant red, gold or purple raspberries within 75⁻¹00 feet of Black raspberries. Black raspberries may be more susceptible to viral diseases carried by aphids to and from nearby raspberry plants. After planting, be sure to prune the bare-root canes back to about 2 inches above the ground. (This does not apply to potted raspberry plants.) Do not skip this step! It is a crucial factor in encouraging the roots to send up new growth during the growing season. It is in the nature of raspberry plants to send up new growth as suckers or basal shoots from below the ground. This means the canes that you plant may not be where you find signs of life or new growth. Beneficial Pollinators.

Achillea Yarrow 'New Vintage[™] Series 'Red' PP25618'

Coreopsis are great cut flowers that last up to 2 weeks after being harvested.

Digitalis Purpurea 'Foxy' Foxglove

The foxglove is plant essential to English cottage gardens as well as woodland borders. It produces spikes of thimble shaped flowers with spotted throats. It is a good filler between spring bulbs & summer perennials. It should be noted that all plant parts are toxic to humans & mammals & could be fatal if ingested. Light preference- light to partial shade (but will tolerate more sun if soil kept moist) Pollinators-bees, butterflies, moths & hummingbirds. Deer resistant.

Echinacea 'Cheyenne Spirit' - Coneflower

Color: rosy-red-to-pink cheerful blossoms with bright yellow eyes

Full sun, part shade, tolerant to drought, heat and humidity, deer resistant, deciduous, butterfly attractant This flower is a showstopper with narrow petals in vivid shades of orange, red, rosy-red, yellow, purple and cream surrounding a large brown cone center. It blooms on sturdy upright branches from midsummer to early fall. This perennial requires little water, low maintenance and is a perfect plant for perennial borders, pots, and cottage gardens.

Echinacea 'Pow Wow White' Coneflower

Heuchera Dolce® 'Wildberry' PPAF Coral Bells PW®

Blooms: Early to mid-summer and Fall

If you are looking for a rich pop of purple in your garden, this plant is for you! Large clipped glossy leaves in royal purple are accented by charcoal veins. Dark stems support rosy, pink calyxes & white flowers. But this plant is grown mainly for its mounded foliage. It works well as a border plant, container plant or in mass plantings as a focal plant. Heuchera x Villosa 'Caramel' PP16560 Coral Bells

Plant in Shade to Partial Shade

Blooms: Early to mid-summer and Fall

Foliage of this perennial provides a panoply of color, starting off gold in spring & progressing to peach, amber & caramel. Pink flowers open in the spring & soar on tall stems above the foliage. Excellent plant to partner with the Wild berry Heuchera for color contrast. In the landscape, the plant can be planted in borders, as accent plants or used in containers. Attracts bees, butterflies & hummingbirds, Deer & rabbit resistant. Moist well drained soil.

Liatris Spicata 'Kobold' Gayfeather



1-Gallon, \$9.00

Height 24"-30" Inches tall and 24"-30" Inches width. Plant in Full sun Blooms: Mid-Summer to Early Fall

Liatris are excellent compact plants for perennial borders and cutting gardens. No staking is needed. Flowers form on tall spikes that rise from a basal tuft of narrow, grass-like foliage. Foliage remains attractive throughout the growing season. Fuzzy, thistle-like blossoms open on spikes from top to bottom. Excellent pollinator attracts Butterflies, Hummingbirds and is Bee Friendly. Cut back flowering spikes by one half after flowering to promote rebloom.

Seedheads can be left on to provide fall interest and to supply winter bird food.

Nepeta 'Chartreuse' on the Loose' PW

Height 8.0-10.0 Inches tall spreads and 20-24 inches width. Plant in Full sun

Blooms: Early to mid-summer and Fall

'Chartreuse on the Loose' is a perennial with season long interest perfect for lining the front of the border. The foliage allows for a full three seasons of interest with bright chartreuse yellow leaves. Clusters of lavender blue flowers are produced just above the foliage and appear all summer long. Unlike most catmint, it will continue to produce flowers without being cut back. When the stems are broken, they release an aroma into the air that tends to attract cats, thus its common name, Catmint. Attracts Butterflies, Hummingbirds and is Bee Friendly. Deer Resistant and Rabbit Resistant.

Phlox Subulata 'Scarlet Flame' Creeping Phlox, Thrift

Rosmarinus Prostratus 'Trailing Rosemary'

Salvia 'Black & Blue' Blue Anise Sage
