<b>SHRUBS</b>		
	<p><b>Aucuba</b> Aucuba japonica <i>'Picturata'</i></p>	<p>Height: 4-6 feet broadleaved evergreen shrub Plant in part to full shade, but will tolerate morning sun Grown for glossy variegated foliage Color: shades of cream to yellow to bright green, females will set red berries Wonderful to brighten a dark spot Deer resistant</p>
	<p><b>Azalea, evergreen</b> Rhododendron <i>'Hilda Niblett'</i></p>	<p>Height: 1 foot, spread 3-4 feet evergreen shrub Plant in partial shade in moist, well-drained acid soil Blooms in April-May Color: large multicolor pink to white flowers Attracts bees and butterflies</p>
	<p><b>Bluebeard</b> Caryopteris x clandonensis <i>'Worcester Gold'</i></p>	<p>Height: 3-6 feet deciduous shrub Plant in full sun Blooms in late summer through autumn Color: golden-green leaves are mint-scented when crushed, with fragrant bright-blue flowers Attracts bees and butterflies, drought and heat tolerant, and deer resistant Hard prune in early spring, blooms on new wood</p>
	<p><b>Butterfly Bush</b> Buddleia x <i>'Honeycomb'</i></p>	<p>Height: 5-7 feet deciduous shrub Plant in full sun Blooms in late summer through autumn Color: creamy yellow honey-scented flowers with silvery green foliage, unusual Attracts bees, butterflies and hummingbirds, drought and heat tolerant, and deer resistant Hard prune in early spring, blooms on new wood</p>

	<p><b>Florida Anise</b> Illicium floridanum</p>	<p>Height: 7-8 feet, broad leaved evergreen shrub Plant in partial shade Blooms mid-spring Color: small dark red Decorative seed pods similar to star anise but not edible Leaves have anise scent when crushed Native to Southeastern woodlands Attracts butterflies and bees Deer resistant</p>
	<p><b>Flowering Quince</b> Chaenomeles speciosa 'Cameo'</p>	<p>Height: 3-4 feet tall, 5-6 feet wide deciduous ornamental shrub Plant in full sun to partial shade Blooms very early spring Color: coral apricot double flowers Small yellow fruit attracts birds and wildlife Thornless, deer resistant</p>
	<p><b>Oakleaf Hydrangea</b> Hydrangea quercifolia 'Ruby Slippers'</p>	<p>Height: 4-5 feet deciduous shrub Plant in full sun to partial shade Blooms in early through mid-summer Color: flowers open white then turn pale pink and deepen to rose, foliage dark green in summer turning mahogany-red in autumn Needs well drained soil and regular watering Blooms on old wood, so if needed prune just after flowering Attracts butterflies and bees Hybrid native</p>
	<p><b>Paper Bush</b> Edgeworthia chrysantha</p>	<p>Height: 4-6 feet deciduous shrub Plant in partial sun to light shade, sheltered from afternoon sun Blooms late winter through early spring, followed by large palmate leaves Color: clusters of very fragrant yellow flowers Prefers moist, well drained soil and regular watering first year Bark was once used to make paper</p>

	<p><b>Snowball Bush, 'Doublefile'</b>  <i>Viburnum plicatum</i>  var. <i>tomentosum</i>  '<i>Summer Snowflake</i>'</p>	<p>Height: 6-8 feet deciduous shrub  Plant in partial sun for most flowers  Blooms continuously from June to autumn  Color: clusters of white flowers in a double row along branches, followed by red berries if you have more than one plant  Prefers moist, well drained, slightly acidic soil  Attracts butterflies and bees  Birds love the red berries in autumn  Perpetual bloomer</p>
	<p><b>Spiraea</b>  <i>Spiraea x bumalda</i>  '<i>Goldmound</i>'</p>	<p>Height: 3-4 feet deciduous shrub  Plant in full sun to partial shade (foliage brighter in full sun)  Blooms in June (with second flush in August if you prune in July)  Color: pale pink flowers, but mainly grown for lime green foliage  Nice mounded shape, good autumn color  Attracts butterflies and bees  Water regularly first year</p>

## TREES

	<p><b>Flowering Cherry</b>  <i>Prunus jacquemontii</i>  '<i>Hiromi</i>'</p>	<p>Height: 6-7 feet deciduous ornamental tree  Plant in full sun to partial shade  Blooms in early spring  Color: pale pink double flowers  Small tart red fruit attracts birds and wildlife, good for jam  Golden foliage in autumn</p>

	<p><b>Aster</b>  <i>Aster dumosus</i>  '<i>Wood's Aster Pink</i>'</p>	<p>Height: 1-2 feet perennial  Plant in full sun  Blooms in August to September  Color: pink flowers with yellow centers  Hybrid native  Attracts bees, butterflies and hummingbirds  High mildew resistance</p>

	<p><b>Astilbe</b>  <i>Astilbe japonica</i>  <i>'Montgomery'</i></p>	<p>Height: 2 feet perennial  Plant in partial to full shade  Blooms in June to July  Color: deep cherry red flowers  Keep well watered  Deer and rabbit resistant</p>
	<p><b>Autumn Sage</b>  <i>Salvia x jamensis</i>  <i>'Hot Lips'</i></p>	<p>Height: 3-4 feet perennial  Plant in full sun to partial shade  Blooms mid through late summer  Color: red and white bicolor flowers  Deer resistant and drought tolerant  Attracts bees, butterflies and hummingbirds  Mulch in winter</p>
	<p><b>Coneflower</b>  <i>Echinacea x</i>  <i>'Gemini Pink'</i></p>	<p>Height: 2-3 feet perennial  Plant in full sun  Blooms all summer  Color: magenta pink double  Upright vigorous branching plant, very free flowering  Attracts butterflies and bees  This cultivar was born and bred in Dahlenega</p>
	<p><b>Coral Bells</b>  <i>Heuchera</i>  <i>'Amber Lady'</i></p>	<p>Height: 6-9 inches perennial  Plant in partial shade, well drained soil  Blooms in early through mid summer  Color: velvety amber leaves with silver marbling, undersides rose pink, tall frothy white flower spikes  Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds  Humidity and drought tolerant, deer resistant  New hybrid cultivar, semi-evergreen</p>

	<p><b>Coral Bells</b> Heuchera <i>'Blackout'</i></p>	<p>Height: 9 inches perennial Plant in partial sun for darkest leaf color, well drained Blooms in early through mid summer Color: shiny leaves almost black, tall frothy white flower spikes Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds Humidity and drought tolerant, deer resistant New hybrid cultivar, semi-evergreen</p>
	<p><b>Foamy Bells</b> x Heucherella <i>'Buttered Rum'</i></p>	<p>Height: 6 inches perennial Plant in partial sun for brightest leaf color, but can also plant in shade, well drained soil Blooms in early through mid summer Color: coppery toned leaves turn red in autumn, tall frothy white flower spikes Attracts butterflies and hummingbirds Humidity and drought tolerant, deer resistant New hybrid cultivar, semi-evergreen</p>
	<p><b>Gloriosa Daisy</b> Rudbeckia hirta <i>'Orange Fudge'</i></p>	<p>Height: 2 feet perennial Plant in full sun Blooms from spring through summer Color: orange and yellow bicolor flowers with chocolate colored centers Deadhead to encourage more flowers Tolerates heat, drought and poor soil Attracts beneficial insects</p>

	<p><b>Hyssop</b> Agastache x <i>'Blue Fortune'</i></p>	<p>Height: 2-3 feet perennial Plant in full sun to partial shade Blooms repeatedly mid-summer through autumn Color: light blue bottlebrush like flowers on strong stems Foliage has a black licorice scent when crushed More tolerant of cold winters than other Agastache Heat and drought tolerant Attracts butterflies and bees Hybrid native</p>
	<p><b>Lenten Rose</b> Helleborus orientalis <i>'Yellow Lady'</i></p>	<p>Height: 12-18 inches perennial, evergreen Plant in partial to full shade Blooms February to April Color: pale yellow Deer resistant</p>
	<p><b>Plantain Lily</b> Hosta <i>'June'</i></p>	<p>Height: 12-18 inches (plus bloom stalk) perennial Plant in shade in moist soil, but for best leaf color give morning sun Blooms in summer Color: leaves variegated yellow and blue/green with lavender bloom spike Frequently eaten by deer</p>
	<p><b>Red Hot Poker</b> Kniphofia <i>'Echo Duo'</i></p>	<p>Height: 3-4 feet perennial, evergreen Plant in full sun Blooms in early summer, and reblooms until autumn Color: two-toned, orange on top with creamy white near stem Grassy evergreen leaves Drought tolerant once established Attracts butterfly and hummingbirds Deer and rabbit resistant This cultivar was born and bred in Dahlonaga</p>


	<p><b>Red Hot Poker</b> Kniphofia 'Echo Rojo'</p>	<p>Height: 3-4 feet perennial, evergreen Plant in full sun Blooms in early summer, and reblooms until autumn Color: deep reddish orange Grassy evergreen leaves Drought tolerant once established Attracts butterfly and hummingbirds Deer and rabbit resistant This cultivar was born and bred in Dahlonaga</p>
	<p><b>Yarrow</b> Achillea millefolium 'Paprika'</p>	<p>Height: 2-3 feet perennial Plant in full sun Blooms all summer Color: cherry-red flat heads of small flowers with gold centers, later fading to pink and creamy yellow, fern-like blue-green foliage Heat and drought tolerant once established Tolerates poor soil Attracts butterflies and bees Deer and rabbit resistant</p>

## FERNS

	<p><b>Autumn Fern</b> Dryopteris erythrosora</p>	<p>Height: 18 inches perennial (space 18 inches apart for full ground cover) Plant in part to full shade Fronds change color from copper red to bronze to green Heat and drought tolerant, keep well watered until established Usually semi-evergreen in winter Deer resistant</p>

	<p><b>Japanese Painted Fern</b>  <b>Athyrium niponicum</b>  <i>'Pictum'</i></p>	<p>Height: 18 inches perennial (space 18 inches apart for full ground cover)  Plant in part to full shade  Fronds silver/gray with purple, best color in light shade  Weeping habit, very hardy  Dies back in winter</p>

## GROUNDCOVERS

	<p><b>Hen and Chicks</b>  <b>Sempervivum</b>  <i>'Icicle'</i></p>	<p>Height: 3 inches evergreen ground cover, spreading to 2 feet  Plant in full sun to part shade  Blooms in mid-summer in clusters of light pink flowers held on 12 inch brick red flower spikes  Color: deep red variegated foliage  Deer, drought and heat resistant  Pointy succulent leaves emerge red in spring, turning light green with burgundy tips throughout the season.  Forms low spreading cushions, with new plants appearing in a circle around the mother plant in the center.</p>
	<p><b>Stonecrop</b>  <b>Sedum rupestre</b>  <i>'Blue Spruce'</i></p>	<p>Height: under 6 inch evergreen groundcover, spreads to 2 feet  Plant in full sun to partial shade  Blooms in summer  Color: blue-gray foliage resembling spruce branches, yellow star shaped flowers  Drought tolerant, fast grower  Attracts butterflies, deer resistant</p>

## EDIBLES



**Blackberry**  
*Rubus fruticosus*  
 'Navaho'

Height: 6 foot fruiting arching canes are thornless and erect  
 Plant in full sun  
 Berries ripen in early June on 2<sup>nd</sup> year canes  
 Produces sucker plants to quickly establish a hedge row  
 Birds are attracted to the berries



**Blueberries**  
*Vaccinium ashei*  
 'Brightwell' and  
 'Austin'

Height: 'Brightwell' 6-8 feet tall and wide deciduous shrub, 'Austin' 4-6 feet tall and 6-8 feet wide  
 Plant in full sun in moist, well-drained acid soil  
 Berries ripen June to August (both early season blueberries)  
 Good landscape shrub with attractive fall leaf color  
 Birds are attracted to the berries  
**NOTE:** One of the most important growing requirements of rabbiteye blueberries is their need for cross-pollination to set fruit. You will need to plant more than one variety for cross-pollination to occur.



**Fig**  
*Ficus Carica*  
 'Celeste'

Height: 15-25 feet deciduous fruit tree  
 Plant in full sun to light shade  
 Insignificant flowers, self-pollinating  
 Birds are attracted to the fruit  
 Deer resistant  
 Water regularly first year



**Florence Fennel  
 (culinary anise)**  
*Foeniculum vulgare*

Height: 2 feet first year, 3 feet second year with flowers, biennial  
 Plant in full sun  
 Blooms all second summer  
 Color: flat-topped umbels of little golden flowers in second year over feathery foliage  
 All parts of plant are edible and have a sweet, licorice taste and fragrance similar to anise and tarragon  
 Flowers attract many beneficial insects  
 Black Swallowtail butterfly larva feed on fennel



**Goji Berry**  
Lycium barbarum

Height: 8-10 feet vining deciduous shrub  
 Plant in full sun to partial shade  
 Blooms in early summer, followed by edible berries  
 Color: flowers lavender and white, berries red  
 Berries are a superfood filled with antioxidants, very high in vitamin C and nearly 13% protein  
 Fruit ripens July through to first frost, use fresh or dry like raisins  
 Will benefit from improving soil with wood ash  
 Needs well drained soil, self-pollinating and a bit thorny



**Raspberry**  
Rubus idaeus  
*'Heritage Red'*

Height: 5-6 feet fruiting arching canes (do not need staking)  
 Plant in full sun  
 Everbearing, with moderate crop in July and a second heavy crop in September  
 Birds are attracted to the fruit
