About the Cover: The Annie Moore statue (or Annie Moore Monument) is a sculpture located in Cobh, County Cork. It commemorates Irish immigration to the United States, paying tribute to Annie Moore (1874-1924), who was the first Irish immigrant to pass through Ellis Island on January 1, 1892. Depicted with 2 children (her brothers) pointing to the horizon, she symbolizes all the hope and history of the former immigrants who left Ireland for America, following the Great Famine and the harsh conditions of the time.



This Program is Dedicated In Memory of Bishop Daniel Reilly



Bishop Daniel Patrick Reilly, 96, the fourth Bishop of Worcester, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, June 18, at Shrewsbury Rehabilitation and Nursing at Southgate in Shrewsbury.

Bishop Reilly, one of nine children, was born in Providence, Rhode Island on May 12, 1928, son of Francis E. and Mary A. (Burns) Reilly.

He attended St. Michael's Parish School in Providence, and studied for the priesthood at Our Lady of Providence Seminary in Warwick, R.I. from 1943 to 1948, and, from 1948 to 1953, at the Grand Seminaire, St. Brieuc in France.

He was ordained a priest May 30, 1953, in the Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul in Providence. He was appointed associate pastor there in June 1953.

He furthered his studies at Harvard University Graduate School of Business Administration and Boston College School of Business Administration where he received an M.B.A.

Pope Paul VI named him Bishop of Norwich, Connecticut, on June 17, 1975. He was ordained and installed as bishop August 6, 1975, in the Cathedral of St. Patrick in Norwich.

He was named Bishop of Worcester by Pope John Paul II, October 27, 1994, and was installed as the fourth bishop of the diocese December 8, 1994, in St. Paul Cathedral.

He submitted his resignation on May 12, 2003, his 75th birthday. Pope John Paul II accepted his resignation for reason of retirement on March 9, 2004, and he became Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of Worcester.

As a member of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Bishop Reilly held several posts. He was chairman of the International Policy Committee, during which time he traveled to Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland with the United States Delegation for Peace in Northern Ireland in 1995. He also visited South Africa and Central and South America.

As chairman of Catholic Relief Services, he visited Egypt, Ethiopia, the Near East and Eastern Europe. He also visited Cuba, South Africa, Poland, and Haiti, where the Worcester Diocese had a mission house. He served on the writing committee for the U.S. Bishops Conference's 1983 letter on nuclear weapons: "The Challenge to Peace."

Bishop Reilly received honorary doctoral degrees from the College of the Holy Cross and Assumption University in Worcester; Anna Maria College, Paxton; Our Lady of Providence College Seminary and Providence College in Providence; and Salve Regina College, Newport, Rhode Island; Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Connecticut, and Holy Apostles College and Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut and St. Michael's College in Colchester, Vermont.



This Program is Dedicated In Memory of Francis R. Carroll



Francis R. Carroll, a business and civic leader whose philanthropy stretched from war-ravaged Korea and Vietnam to Worcester's neediest neighborhoods, died on October 29, 2024.

Mr. Carroll founded the Small Business Service Bureau Inc., a national small business organization, Sterling Bridge Insurance Agency, Inc. and FRC Realty.

A champion of the poor, he spearheaded the effort to fund and maintain the St. Francis Xavier Center Food for the Poor at St. John's Church, which provides thousands of morning meals and basic services for the poor. The recipient of numerous awards, Mr. Carroll was also a vigorous advocate for small business and veterans' causes.

"We must always keep in mind the social reality of those less fortunate," Mr. Carroll once said.

Mr. Carroll worked tirelessly on behalf of veterans and active military

personnel. For example, as Commander of Vernon Hill American Legion Post 435, he spearheaded a project, with the Gold Star Mothers, to build the Living Memorial Hospital in Vietnam's Central Highlands during the Vietnam War, in memory of the men from Worcester County who died or were still missing in action.

Along with U. S. Rep. James P. McGovern, he worked for the passage of the Crosby-Puller Combat Wounds Compensation Act, so men and women veterans would continue receiving combat pay while recovering from wounds received in action.

Mr. Carroll also spear-headed a nine-year effort to build the Korean War Memorial in downtown Worcester and served as co-chairman of the Telegram and Gazette Operation Mail Call that returned about 1500 letters written during World War II by servicemen from the city to loved ones that were never delivered.

He was a member of the U.S. Small Business Administration National Advisory Council, and the U.S. China Trade Caucus on Small Business. He was re-appointed by Presidents Jimmy Carter, Ronald W. Reagan, and George H. W. Bush. General P. X. Kelley, USMC (ret.), former Commandant, appointed him as a director for the prestigious National Legal Center for Public Interest in Washington, D.C.

Locally, Mr. Carroll was a former Grand Marshall of Worcester's St. Patrick's Day Parade and was the Vernon Hill Post's Irishman of the Year (1990).

Mr. Carroll, a former Chairman of the Worcester State University Board of Trustees, received honorary doctorates from Assumption University, Anna Maria College, and the former Massachusetts School of Professional Psychology, now William James College, Boston, MA.

A Founding and Executive Committee member of the Hanover Theater for the Performing Arts, the City of Worcester has named the area in front of the theatre, Francis R. Carroll Plaza. A member of the Ancient Order of the Hibernians Div. 36, he was an associate member of the Emerald Society of the Greater Worcester Police.



Virginia Boulay Fospitality Award Sheila Caggiano

This Award is named in memory of Virginia Boulay, a deceased charter member of the Parade Committee whose warmth and generosity truly personified the Irish greeting, *"Cead Mile Failte,"* or *"One Hundred Thousand Welcomes."* Given to a St. Patrick's Parade Committee member, the Virginia Boulay Award honors one who is always welcoming to others.

Sheila is a proud member of the St. Patrick's Parade Committee and the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians. She was raised in Marlboro in a large loving Irish Catholic family of seven children and later moved to Worcester where she raised her two children, Leah and Joe, who are the light of her life.

Sheila is well known to the Our Lady of the Angels parish community and made her career in social work at the State Department of Youth Services.

Sheila offers a warm welcome to all she meets. She is quick to learn about others and offers a helping hand where needed or an ear to listen. She is a loyal friend and advocate for those in need. You cannot attend a Parade fundraiser, function or community activity without seeing her, hearing her laughter and getting a welcoming smile and greeting. Her warm persona, quick wit and sense of humor forges connections and uplifts all around her.

Sheila is one of three members who works tirelessly to support the annual parade. This committee member is on the "front lines" of the Parade, as part of the Operations Team. She, along with her daughter, is always willing to volunteer, work behind the scenes or at a raffle table and pitch in at special events.

The Cathy Donabue Good Neighbor Award Jeremiah 'Jerry' O'Rourke

This Award is named in memory of the late Cathy Donahue, a Parade Committee member and past Chairman. Cathy promoted the growth of the parade in its early years by helping to establish a financial framework for the Parade Committee organization. The *Good Neighbor Award* is given to a friend of the parade who, through his or her work, warmth and generosity has helped to contribute to the Parade Committee goals.



JEREMIAH "JERRY" F. O'ROURKE

Born and raised in Worcester, Jerry grew up in the Belmont Hill section of the city. His father, Dennis, was born in County Kerry, while his mother, Joan, was born in Worcester. Both his paternal and maternal grandparents were born in County Kerry. He has 5 siblings, Mike, Ann, Dennis, James and Maryann.

Jerry graduated from Holy Name Central Catholic High School in 1978, Assumption University in 1982 with an BA in Management, and Anna Maria College in 1994 with an MA in Criminal Justice.

He has been married to Elizabeth "Betsy" O'Rourke for 38 years. They live in the Tatnuck Square section in Worcester. They have 3 grown children, John, Tim and Julie and 4 grandchildren, Collins, Patrick, Cal and Keira.

Jerry started working as a police officer for the Worcester Police Department in March 1991. After 34 years of service, he retired on January 31, 2025. During his career, he worked in several divisions, including Operations (patrol), Community Policing (DARE Instructor), Bureau of Professional Standards, Training Division and the License Division.

Jerry enjoyed his years working with the St. Patrick's Parade Committee and was always amazed with their motivation and dedication in organizing

this family-oriented event. He was also involved with the stART on the Street, stART at the Station, Courts for Courtney and Worcester Tercentennial.





Agnes Sheehan Community Service Award Mary (Shea) Stratford

The *Agnes Sheehan Community Service Award* is dedicated in loving memory of the late Agnes Sheehan, a charter member of the Parade Committee, and the first woman to be chosen as the Parade's Grand Marshal. In keeping with the tradition of Agnes, this award recognizes an individual who has given of herself to improve her community.

MARY SHEA was born in Worcester in the Lincoln Street area to a strong Irish family. She attended St. Paul's Grammar School and the Academy of the Sacred Heart before graduating from North High School. Mary has been involved with the Worcester community through both her career work and volunteer commitments.

Mary started working with the Worcester District Court and transitioned to the Superior Court. After thirty-eight years, she retired as a Court Magistrate.

Over seventeen years ago, Mary became involved with the St. Peter's Parish Food Bank through her brother, Fr. James Shea. Mary became a devoted volunteer working with the weekly Wednesday morning Food Bank. She continued her commitment to the Food Bank when her brother unexpectedly died.

The needs for this program have grown distributing to 150 to 200 families weekly. Recently, Mary became the Manager of St. Peter's Food Bank. She directs a team of multi-skilled volunteers who all have a connection to St. Peter's. Through the years, her family has honored her commitment to the Food Bank. Her daughter, Katie LaGorce, and son-in-law, Luke LaGorce, as well as her grandchildren Maeve and James, can be seen working at major events such as Thanksgiving distribution. St. Peter's Food Bank provided over four hundred families baskets this past holiday.

Judy Wilkinson Award Mary Ellen Murphy





2025 Grand Marshal Cathryn 'Rate' McEvoy



Kate McEvoy is an accomplished senior-level executive who is well-known for her success in the areas of fundraising, strategy development, marketing, business planning, and business development, both inside and outside the health care industry.

Most recently, Kate served as Vice-President for Corporate Relations at UMass Memorial Health Care. In this role she acted as primary liaison between the health care system and the business community, with a focus on growing UMass Memorial Health Care's commercial market share. Additionally, Kate provided support for the system's Anchor Mission initiative, aligning institutional resources and corporate social responsibility to address social determinants of health challenges in central Massachusetts.

Prior to joining UMass Memorial, Kate served as the Vice-President for Central & Western Massachusetts at Harvard Pilgrim Health Care, where she managed the organization's growth strategies and Profit/Loss for a region that encompassed the geographic areas of Massachusetts situated between the I-495 corridor and the New York state border.

An active volunteer in central Massachusetts' non-profit communities, Kate has served in leadership roles for many organizations, receiving several awards for her professional achievement and community involvement, including the: YWCA's Katherine Erskine Award, Worcester Business Journal's Outstanding Women in Business Award, and Worcester State University's Distinguished Alumni Award, which is the highest non-degree honor bestowed by the institution. And in the shade of an evening, when the sun paints the sky in the west, stand for a few moments beside me, and remember only my best.


