Introduction

ezPractice Certified EHR (ezPractice V15.1) meets the certification criteria. ezPractice offers access to the application and files that allow users of export files to access export format documentation to process EHI after it has been exported from it certifies EHR. ezPractice EHR (Electronic Health Record) systems provide means for exporting PHI (Protected Health Information) to allow healthcare providers to share information efficiently while maintaining the privacy and security of patientdata.

This documentation guide will provide the user an understanding of the resulting files from the PHIExport. It will explain how to read the files, understand the meaning behind fields and connections, and offer other insight to properly make use of this extensive amount of information. The document assumes the user has a technical understanding HL7 specifications such as C-CDA standards and formatting around CSV type files.

Executive Summary

ezPractice products are designed to include components of care and billing for nursing programs, home health programs, wellness programs, specialty-based programs, physician driven care, employee health programs, public health programs and mental health programs in ambulatory facilities.

Understanding resulting EHI Export Files

The resulting export may contain one patient, or a full collection of patients. The result will be zip file/s. The zip file includes files containing the patient demographics, clinical records, billing records, scanned records, and more.

The files upon extraction from the zip will adhere to the following structure:

PID_INTERNALNUMBERING.EXT and/or PID_INTERNALNUMBERING_TYPE.EXT

- PID refers to the Patient ID. This will be a unique number.
- INTERNALNUMBERING refers to an internal control number for the export. This can be ignored.
- TYPE refers to further describing the content of the file. These can be Claim Data or Echart or pat Notes.
- EXT refers to the file extension of the resulting exported data. Extensions are XML (accompanied by a HTML file) and CSV (comma separated values data).

The files are further categorized as follows:

- 1. Patient Demographics and Clinical Data HL7 C-CDA formatted
- 2. Adhoc Patient Notes such as documented telephone calls CSV formatted
- 3. Scanned Records HL7 CDA formatted.

Format of the resulting EHI Export Files

In order to successfully use or import the exported EHI files, the user must understand the formatting of the resulting files.

Patient Demographics and Clinical Data

The resulting files follows the specification as set for HL7 C-CDA R2.1 specifications. These files will always result in a pair following an XML and HTML file extension. It must be noted there will NOT be a TYPE value in the filename. The format and specifications can be referenced at:

Adhoc Patient Notes

Users within ezPractice do have the ability to document telephone calls, adhoc notes related to the patient via a feature called as Patient Notes. This data is categorized as PHI and is included within EHI. The resulting files are formatted using comma-separated values also known as CSV. This file will follow an CSV file extension. It must be noted there will be a TYPE value called patNotes within the filename. The format and descriptors are described in the following table:

Column Number	Column Name	Description
1	PID	Data reflected under this column are patient IDs. These are unique.
2	Patient Notes ID	Data reflected under this column are patient note IDs. These are unique.
3	Username	Data reflected under this column refer to the user who documented the note
3	Subject	Data reflected under this column refer to the subject of the note. This field maybe blank
4	Patient Notes Category	Data reflected under this column refers to the category associated with the note. These categories are user defined but available from a pick list for the user.
5	Patient Notes Date	Data reflected under this column refer to the date the note was created.
6	Patient Notes	Data reflected under this column refers to documented details of the patient note.

Scanned Records

The resulting files follow the specification as set for HL7 C-CDA R2.1 specifications. This file will follow an XML file extension. It must be noted there will be a TYPE value called Echart within the filename. This file contains all patient scanned and uploaded documents and is coded using Base64 encoding. It must be noted, this file could be large in size depending on the amount of scanned data. The format and specifications can be referenced at:
