- + Catholics who have been away from the Church and would like to rediscover their Catholic faith.

It is not too late to join the OCIA classes. We welcome anyone to join at any time. Classes are held every other Thursday in the Social Hall, beginning at 6:30 p.m. The meetings in November are November 6th and 20th.

#### **COMMUNION OF SAINTS:**

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) explains why Catholics celebrate All Saints Day and All Souls' Day:

Communion with the saints. "Exactly as Christian communion among our fellow pilgrims brings us closer to Christ, so our communion with the saints joins us to Christ, from whom as from its fountain and head issues all grace, and the life of the People of God itself." (CCC 957)

"Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death, and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life." (St. Dominic, dying, to his brothers)

"I want to spend my heaven in doing good on earth." (St. Therese of Lisieux)

Communion with the dead: "In full consciousness of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the Church in its pilgrim members, from the very earliest days of the Christian religion, has honored with great respect the memory of the dead; and 'because it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins' she offers here suffrages for them. Our prayer for them is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective." (CCC 958)

"We believe in the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church; and we believe that in this communion, the merciful love of God and his saints is always [attentive] to our prayers." (CCC 962)

#### A Bit of History

While All Saints Day honors those already in Heaven, All Souls' Day focuses on those still on their journey toward God—those in Purgatory. St. Odilo of Cluny, the fifth Abbott of Cluny, was born in 948. He was devoted to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Around 1030, he established All Souls' Day in Cluny and its monasteries, and it was soon adopted in the whole Church. Over time, different countries have added local customs: in Mexico, it blends with the festive *Dia de los Muertos*, while in Europe people light candles on graves and offer prayers.

#### How Catholics Celebrate

Attending Mass: Offering the Eucharist for the souls of the departed. Visiting Cemeteries: Praying, leaving flowers, or lighting candles.

Prayers at Home: Some families create a small altar or light candles for their loved ones.

Acts of Charity: Performing good deeds or offering prayers for the benefit of the deceased.

All Souls' Day is ultimately about connection, prayer, and remembrance. It's a day to pause, honor the lives that shaped ours, and trust in God's mercy for those who have passed.
