Arabian catechist honored by pope 'prepared in the Diocese of Richmond'

Catherine Miles-Flynn has lived in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, since 1995. But the director of Christian formation for the Apostolic Vicariate of Southern Arabia, who recently received the Ministry of Catechist from Pope Leo XIV, still remembers where her catechetical life began: at St. Mary of the Presentation, Suffolk.

"In a small community like Suffolk, all hands are needed in the Church," said Miles-Flynn. "My husband and I were a new couple with a tiny baby at St. Mary of the Presentation, and people

would tell us, 'We need your help with this.' We started children's Liturgy of the Word, children's catechism ... we did that for 12-13 years."

Now, she helps Bishop Paolo Martinelli, apostolic vicar of Southern Arabia, serve nearly 1 million Catholics in the United Arab Emirates, Oman, and Yemen.

"I travel often. The Church here is massive and sometimes chaotic, and it's always full," she said. "It's kind of a surprise; in Rome, I was interviewed by an Italian newspaper, and the question was, 'What's it like to be in a place with no Christians?' And I said, 'I don't know.' Because this place is chockablock with Catholics. The challenge is that we have so many people."

Part of her territory includes the world's largest parish, St. Mary's Catholic Church in Dubai, which has nearly 400,000 parishioners. But the lessons she learned in the small town of Suffolk still resonate.

"One thing that was important in Southwest Virginia was that we know we are not the majority," said Miles-Flynn. "I always felt a responsibility to be bold in my faith. I couldn't be mealy-mouthed. We're a small community, but we're incredibly faithful."

After leaving St. Mary of the Presentation, Miles-Flynn was chair of the religion department at Peninsula Catholic High School, Newport News, for four years. She married her husband Joseph, who also works for Bishop Martinelli in Southern Arabia, at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, Richmond.

"I was prepared in the Diocese of Richmond. I was always proud to be from the Diocese of Richmond. Richmond is a very special place," she said.

Miles-Flynn was one of 39 catechists from around the world to receive the special honor from the pope at Mass Sept. 28 in St. Peter's Square.

MEDITATION:

*"What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard ...
God has revealed to us" (1 Corinthians 2:9, 10).*

That's quite a bold statement! St. Paul is saying that, through Jesus' death and Resurrection, the Holy Spirit has revealed something that no one had ever seen or heard of before. Paul calls that something "God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages for our glory" (1 Corinthians 2:7).

For our glory. That's not just a throwaway phrase. It's the actual revelation that God has made manifest: the promise that everyone who believes in Christ can be glorified, just as Jesus, "the Lord of glory," is now glorified (1 Corinthians 2:8)! Sit with that truth for a moment. Prophets and kings from the past, great saints like Abraham, Isaiah, and Moses, all had amazing revelations about the Lord and His plans. But only now, after Jesus' Resurrection, has *our own* resurrection become so clearly revealed!

It's easy to reduce the Gospel to a message about right living and adherence to a moral code that we have to try hard to follow. It's easy to reduce it to a set of self-help principles that we can adopt. It's easy to reduce it to any number of things. But once you start hearing about God's plan "for our glory," you know that Jesus has done something for us that we could never do ourselves. His death defeated our death. And His Resurrection has opened heaven – for all of us.

This is part of the "mysterious, hidden" plan that God has now revealed in Christ. Jesus, the risen and glorified Lord, is our true destiny. He has made us for heaven!

Today is the perfect day to ask the Holy Spirit to reveal this glorious plan to you a little more. Read today's second reading slowly and prayerfully. Let the words sink into your heart and fill you with hope. You were created for glory!

"Jesus, thank you for revealing Your awesome hidden wisdom to me!"
