



LIVING ROSARY GROUP

"The Rosary is the 'weapon' for these times." Padre Pio

The Living Rosary is a devotion that allows for people to pray the rosary together beyond physical limits.

It was first founded by Blessed Pauline Marie Jaricot at Lyon, France in 1826. She was inspired to create groups of 15 people who would each be responsible for praying one decade of the Rosary a day, so that the full Rosary would be prayed between all the people in the group.

Following the example of Blessed Pauline Jaricot, a young layman (Jan Tyranowski) during the Nazi occupation of Poland, formed Living Rosary groups of 15 men representing the 15 mysteries of the Rosary.

A leader of one of these groups was a young Karol Wojtyla, the future Pope Saint John Paul II. The groups met in secret for prayer, spiritual direction, and community during the length of the war. Wojtyla continued this devotion in his future parishes.
