FATHER'S CORNER:

At the end of life, what really matters is not what we bought, but what we built,

Not what we received, but what we shared,

Not our competence, but our character.

And not our success, but our significance.

Give a life that matters. Live a life of love.

MEDITATION:

Not a hair on your head will be destroyed. (Luke 21:18)

In today's Gospel, Jesus provides a warning to His disciples. A time will come when there will be not only "earthquakes, famines, and plagues," but even the magnificent Temple will be destroyed. (Luke 21:11) Their adversaries will hand them over to prison, their own family members will betray them, and some of them will even be put to death on account of His name. (21:16)

And yet, as frightening as His words are, Jesus assures them that "not a hair" on their heads would be destroyed. (Luke 21:18) How could that

Jesus' words make sense, both then and now, only if we look beyond this life to the next. He is promising that we will "secure" our lives for heaven if we persevere through hardship and struggle and trust in His grace no matter what comes. (Luke 21:19) Then, when our life here on earth ends, we can look forward to the promises of living forever with our Lord.

This promise can give joy and purpose to our lives even now. This life is what Jesus offered His disciples; that's why they left everything to follow Him. Then, when He gave them the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, He gave them a share in His own resurrected eternal life. They knew that sin and suffering, death and desolation, no longer had the final word. Eternal life had already begun for them.

This is the joyful witness of apostles, martyrs, and all the saints. And it can be your witness as well, no matter your situation. So don't let today's Gospel frighten you. You can know the comfort of the spirit and the joy of Jesus' victory today. You can stay faithful because Jesus will be with you in ever circumstance. He will give you all the grace you need here and now, along with the sure and certain hope of eternal life in heaven. You can trust in His loving care, now and forever!
