PART-TIME LITURGICAL MUSICIAN

Work Hours: 3-4 hours/weekly, dependent upon liturgical season and other special liturgies

Duties:

- * Assist the Director of Music with planning/providing liturgical music for Masses, Holy Days, special liturgical celebrations, weddings and funerals, and other Special Liturgies
- * Attend and assist at rehearsals for the choirs and Schola (a small vocal ensemble familiar with Latin Chant).
- * Demonstrate integrity through a moral, upright lifestyle consistent with Catholic church teachings and customs.

Qualifications and Personal Attributes:

- * Minimum 3-5 years' experience in Catholic church music ministry

- * Knowledge of and comfort with Catholic Church music literature in all forms and styles (traditional, contemporary, Latin chant) for congregation and choirs
- * Knowledge of Latin chant preferred, but if no prior experience, then a willingness to learn
- * Strong organizational, managerial, and interpersonal skills
- * Demonstrated ability to collaborate with clergy, staff, parish committees, and volunteers
- * Understanding of, and willingness to support, Catholic Church teaching, mission, and values

CANTOR/DIGITAL PIANO RECORDING OPERATOR

Work Hours: 2 to 5 hours per month as needed to substitute when Director of Music/Liturgical Musician is unavailable.

Duties:

- * Operate digital piano recorded music setting, providing prerecorded music for Mass to include music for Processional, Presentation of Gifts, Communion, Recessional, and Ordinary of the Mass
- * Attend brief training with Director of Music/Liturgical Musician on operating the digital piano recording settings and procedure during Mass
- * Lead the congregation in singing prerecorded hymns, songs, and Ordinary of the Mass

VIRGINIA CATHOLIC CONFERENCE

Statement by Bishop Burbidge and Bishop Knestout on General Assembly Passage of Extreme Abortion Amendment

For the second straight year, the General Assembly has passed a proposed constitutional amendment that would add an extreme and deadly “fundamental right” to abortion to Virginia’s constitution. The legislature prioritized the passage of this radical amendment in a way that is truly shocking to the conscience – moving it all the way through both chambers during the opening three days of its 60-day session.

The extreme abortion amendment, which will proceed to a referendum for voters to decide later this year, would go far beyond even what *Roe v. Wade* previously allowed. It would enshrine virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy, with no age restriction. Among numerous other problems, it would severely jeopardize Virginia’s parental consent law, health and safety standards for women, conscience protections for healthcare providers, and restrictions on taxpayer-funded abortions. Most tragically of all, the extreme abortion amendment provides no protections whatsoever for preborn children.

Parental rights and the health and well-being of minors must be defended. So too must religious liberty. No one should ever be forced to pay for or participate in an abortion. Health and safety should be enhanced, not diminished. Most importantly, human life is sacred. The lives of vulnerable mothers and their preborn children must always be welcomed, cared for, and protected.

The proposed abortion amendment will appear on a ballot later this year. So too will a measure we oppose that would repeal the one-man/one-woman marriage provision approved by Virginia voters in 2006, as well as an initiative we support to restore voting rights to all who have completed their prison sentences.

We will be deeply engaged in the work of helping to educate voters on these proposed amendments, and will fight the extreme abortion amendment with maximum determination.

FATHER'S CORNER:

One hand that helps you when you're in trouble
Is far more valuable than a thousand hands clapping
When you succeed.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD:

Mary and Joseph took Jesus ... to present Him to the Lord. (Luke 2:22)
As devoted and faithful Jews, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple, in fulfillment of the Jewish law. They came to give to the Lord what they could – "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." (Luke 2:24) But God gave them more than they could have imagined: The confirmation that their child was the One who would bring salvation to the world: "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for ... Israel." (Lk 2:32) Through the words of Simeon and Anna, God confirmed that the time of redemption for all people had come.

As we celebrate The Feast of the Presentation on Monday, let's consider how simple moments of faithfulness – like Mary and Joseph's trip to the Temple that day – can become gateways to the extraordinary, where heaven touches earth. One way that we see this clearly is through the sacraments, the "signs of grace ... by which divine life is dispensed to us." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1131) Outwardly, it's easy to miss the spiritual reality of what is happening when we celebrate a sacrament. But we know, for instance, that in the waters of Baptism, sin is washed away and we are adopted into God's family! We know that in Reconciliation, we are restored "to God's grace" and joined "with Him in an intimate friendship." (CCC 1468) And we believe that the Eucharist, "the source and summit of the Christian life," unites us to Christ and enables us to "anticipate" heaven. (1324, 1326)

Just as Mary and Joseph were blessed to witness God's plan unfold through their simple act of obedience, ask the Lord to help you see how He is at work in your life through the sacraments. The next time you receive the Eucharist, thank Him for His presence in what seems like ordinary bread and wine, and for uniting Himself to you in such a personal way. As you prepare for Confession, keep in mind the joy you will experience of being reconciled to the Lord. And praise God for all the ways heaven touches earth every single day.

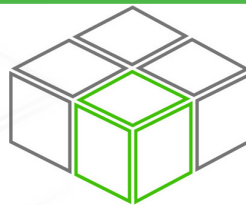
