WHAT is the CROP WALK? Each year, our community comes together to raise money and awareness for hunger relief both locally and around the world through the CROP Hunger Walk. Roughly 1,000 CROP Hunger Walks happen every year in the United States and this year marks 42 years of our Red Bank Crop Walk. In fact, Luther Memorial has been participating since 1982. The Walk symbolizes the daily journey others must make for food and clean water.

**WHEN?** October 16th beginning at 2 PM. Registration begins at 1 PM and the walk starts and ends at Red Bank Regional High School.

WHO gets the money? One-fourth of the funds raised stays in our community to support local hunger and poverty fighting programs. Our walk this year will support the work of 14 different agencies in our area.

In addition to assisting hungry families in our area, CROP helps families in the United States and around the world who are victims of disasters from hurricanes, earthquakes, floods, etc., and refugees fleeing war or famine. CROP also supports development projects in the world's poorest communities - agricultural training, health clinics, micro-businesses, schools and fresh water wells.

WHO should participate? **EVERYONE OF ALL AGES**! CROP Hunger Walks are community events involving everyone who wants to fight hunger around the block and around the world. Our walk encourages schools, civic groups, area businesses and all faith groups.

As in the past we are also collecting rice, beans, peanut butter and soup that will help our local food pantries.

Walkers, Volunteers and Contributors are all equally important to make this a success. (Walkers can collect donations online, in-person or both.)

On Sept. 28, Hurricane Ian made landfall in Southwest Florida as a Category 4 storm — one of the strongest recorded hurricanes ever to hit the contiguous United States.

Did you know that the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod has their own dedicated team that responds to natural disasters and assists local congregations and residents recover?

"Every disaster is different," said LCMS Disaster Response Director Rev. Dr. Ross Johnson as he prepared to fly to Florida for an initial assessment in the aftermath of Ian. "But the response from the LCMS always follows the same pattern.

"As soon as we are alerted to an impending disaster, we pray. Then we establish contact with the presidents and coordinators in all districts that may be affected.

"As the event unfolds, we remain in constant communication with those district leaders, monitoring the situation and making contingency plans for a response if needed.


"Finally, when the situation calls for it, and as soon as it is safe to do so, we send a team to make an on-the-scene assessment. We never enter the disaster area until we have been given permission to do so by first responders. Our goal is to help, not get in the way."

"In the wake of a disaster, we continually proclaim the Gospel," Johnson said.
