To all the Saints,

To say that this year has not been without its difficulties is an understatement at best. We are only in March and life as we know it has been turned upside down and then run over by a truck. Our country by itself has been caught up in a whirlwind of turmoil from crazy weather issues to politics and now we are facing a virus pandemic. I wonder what else could be possibly thrown on top of the heap to just push us to our breaking point. That is not say that each of us has his or her own problems at home, work, school, etc. that we are dealing with on top of everything else. I have heard so many stories of what people are going through, and it just breaks my heart to hear the struggle so many people are facing.

Even the Christian Church just in our country is having to face a challenge that it never thought it would have to; that is in order to continue to deliver the Gospel of Jesus, the Church must go online. With my bad sense of humor, what I find funny is that YouTube and Facebook was not ready to handle the Christian Church going online all at once and since it has they have had to scramble to accommodate the extra bandwidth that it takes to broadcast the Gospel in the United States. Not only do I find that funny, I think its awesome in the truest sense of the word. Just because we cannot meet in person to fellowship and worship our God, Jesus Christ, does not mean that God will allow the gates of hell to overcome His Church. Our Father will always provide a way to Him through His Word and that is something that we as His children should not only celebrate but pray and give Him thanks for keeping His promise yet again.

Now that March is almost over which means that Lent is almost over and that Easter is on the horizon, I thought that I would share a verse with you that I hope will help put what we are going through into perspective and as always give us the reassurance that our hope will not put us to shame.

"A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me." John 16:16

These are the words of Jesus to His disciples before He was going to be delivered over to the religious leaders to be crucified. I know that when you read this verse it does not seem like it applies now to our current situation, but rest assured, I believe it does.

In the first part of the verse Jesus was telling the disciples that His departure from earth, that is His death on the Cross, was about to take place and that when that happens that they will not only be scared but that they will scatter and return back to the old life as if the past three years did not happen. Then in the second part of the verse Jesus tells them that He will return, that is rise from death and visit them before His ascension. You see Jesus knew how hard it would be for the disciples to continue on once they witnessed His brutal death by the cross, hear the cheers from the blind religious leaders and see the lack of complete faith from everyone else in understanding that Jesus is who He claimed to be. He knew their sorrow would be almost unbearable for them and that their fear of wondering if they're next would paralyze them into inaction. That is why He said the second part. The enemy of death would not be strong

enough to hold Him because He is in fact the Savior, the Son of God, eternal since before time even existed in creation. He would rise victorious over not only death but also sin, hell and Satan himself. He would rise victorious claiming our redemption and giving out freely to all who call on His name for salvation.

This verse is simple yet most powerful. It is the promise of Jesus made not just to His 12 Disciples but it's a promise for everyone, for you and me. It's His promise that the world cannot stop the Son of God, cannot stop the will of our Father in heaven, that God will prevail at all cost over His enemies to make sure that we have a home with Him now and forever and that we live each day with the holy and certain hope of God's love. You would think that this is enough, but Jesus goes on to tell His disciples and us in the second part of John 16:33:

"In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."

Look at how powerful these words of comfort truly are! We live in a fallen world stained by sin, more than that, it is broken by sin and we see it every day. Most of the time we do our best to ignore it and stay in our lane to just try to keep ourselves above the water line. We have tribulation, distress, aka problems that we must deal with every day and they are not pleasant. Right now, we are facing a virus that is not just causing chaos with our health, but it is wreaking havoc on our economy which in turn devastates families across our country, in our very own community. As we deal with this new crisis, we still must deal with all the other problems we had before this even began. Simply put its overwhelming in every arena of our life. Then Jesus drops the HOPE bomb! He has overcome the WORLD! It's not that He has overcome just Satan, but He has overcome the entire fallen broken crazy world! You will see me Jesus said, and He kept that promise to them. He appeared to them many times after His resurrection and even today we see Him when we see His children live on each day in hope. We see Jesus when we call to make sure our families, friends, neighbors are doing okay, we see Jesus when we pray and ask Him to intervene not just in this pandemic but to intervene in our life daily. We see Jesus when we help those who need help. Just the other day I ran into someone I know who was raking leaves for a woman who recently lost her husband. He simply told me that he was doing it because it needed to be done and he wanted to help. Tell me that is not Jesus at work! Tell me that Jesus is not involved in the lives of all children of God!

This verse, John 16:16, is our Lord knowing what we go through having walked in our shoes, knowing how hard the world is and knowing that we have Him now everyday in our life. If it turns out that we find ourselves separated this Easter because of the current tribulation, having to worship at home and not together as the body of Christ, then know that it does not matter because Christ who has conquered the world will be us all through the power of His Spirit celebrating with us all. Not just Easter but He is with us everyday until He comes again when we will see Him face to face.
