BOARD MEETING

The Board of Commissioners had a Regular meeting on July 8 2025 with a quorum present. Meeting minutes were approved for June 10th and June 18th and Housing Staff gave reports on daily operations. In Old Business, a motion was made to approve the revisions to the PNHA Admissions and Occupancy Policy. In New Business, a motion was made to table the sale price for a non-NAHASDA Lease Purchase Home; a motion was made to approve the revisions to the PNHA NAHASDA Lease Purchase Program Policy; and a motion was made to table the Determination on Purchase of House on Timberlane. In Executive Session the Commissioners had discussion only on Lease Purchase Home (NAHASDA) and the Privately Owned Homes Program. Motion to adjourn at 1:44 PM.

The Board of Commissioners had a Special meeting on July 24, 2025 with a quorum present. The Special meeting was Executive Session only and a motion was made to approve the cap for the NAHASDA Privately Owned Homes Program for the client and offer the loan program for the rest of the replacement of the roof through a housing vendor. Motion to adjourn at 12:33 PM.

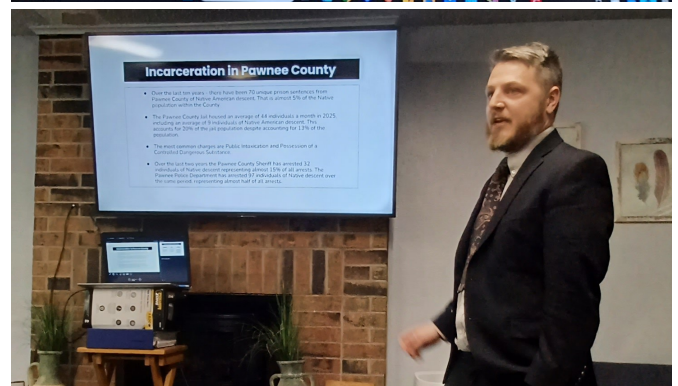
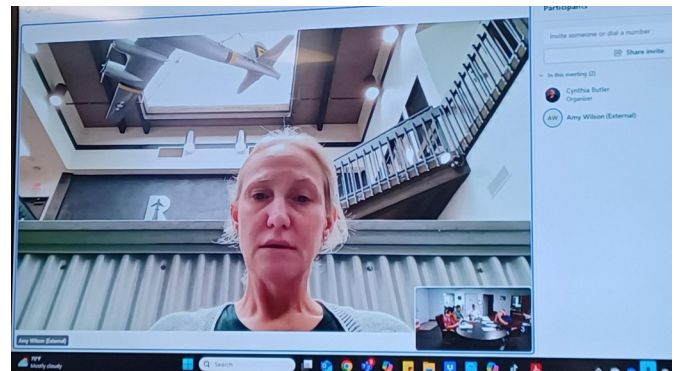
The Board of Commissioners had a Regular meeting on August 12, 2025 with a quorum present.

The Commissioners approved the meeting minutes for July 8th Regular meeting and July 24th for a Special meeting and Housing Staff gave reports on daily operations.

In Old Business, the Commissioners discussed the monthly lease amount for the Non-NAHASDA Lease Purchase home on Ash Street. Discussion only.

In New Business, the consensus was to move forward with the purchase of the home on Timberlane; a motion was made to bring back the revoked loan program with changes; discussion and action to draft a letter to the PBC President and request information about the City of Pawnee project on Yellowhorse Drive; and at 11:30 am the Commission heard a presentation from Mr. Mike Olson with Oklahoma Justice Reform.

In Executive Session, the Commissioners were updated on a PNHA Lease Purchase Property Lease Agreement; no action was taken. A motion was made to adjourn at 12:38 PM.

COMMISSIONER NEWS

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT

The PNHA officially launched the Community Needs Assessment and Strategic Housing, Land Acquisition & Land Use Project planning phase on July 3rd with an in-person community meeting at the RoamChief Event Center. The meeting was productive, with participants expressing a strong desire to assist members in obtaining homes by increasing housing options for singles, families, and elders.

During the discussion, various topics were raised, including potential partnership opportunities with the Pawnee Nation and other partners to expand housing options. Participants also discussed desired housing amenities, including master-planned developments, infill development around existing neighborhoods, and pocket parks. Three primary concerns highlighted by attendees were the lack of new housing stock, the need for an assisted care facility, and the poor condition of unmaintained homes resulting from prolonged probate periods.

Recent project activities have included conducting a community survey and starting a housing assessment of single-family, multi-family, and mobile home units within the planning area. The



PNHA looks forward to continuing its work with SEE Renewal to evaluate community needs and create an actionable strategy for addressing those needs and achieving housing goals. The planning team will continue to gather data and community input in the upcoming months.

HIRING ENERGY COORD

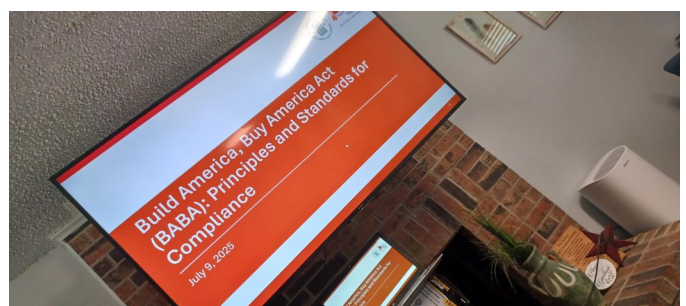

STAFF TRAINING

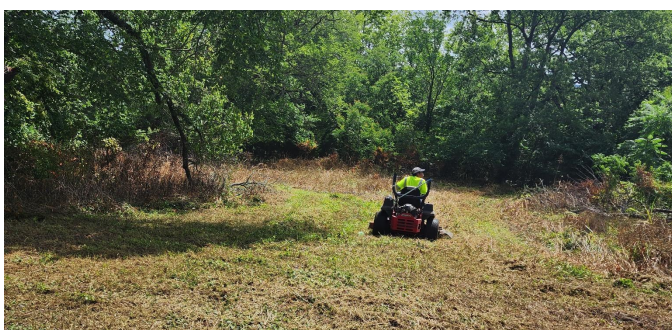

REPP PLANNING MEETING

Our Housing Staff met with the Pawnee Nation and consultants, Tribuquent, on the Rural Energy Pilot Program on Wednesday, August 27th. Staff will be working with the Pawnee Nation to complete the Housing obligations and deliverables for the grant. This will entail completing phase 4 and phase 5 of the grant. In phase 4 will include work on the Utility Grid Construction, Community Solar Garden Array, Public Access DER Charging Stations, Battery Energy Storage System and in phase 5 which includes Business Plan Development, Operational Planning, Operational Support Systems, Community Solar Platform and Routing Operations. We are hoping to enter into phase 6 of the project by January 2026 which will be the close out of the grant and reporting.

Look for flyers on workshops that will be planned, we will get more information out as it becomes available.

PN MUSEUM NEW SIGN

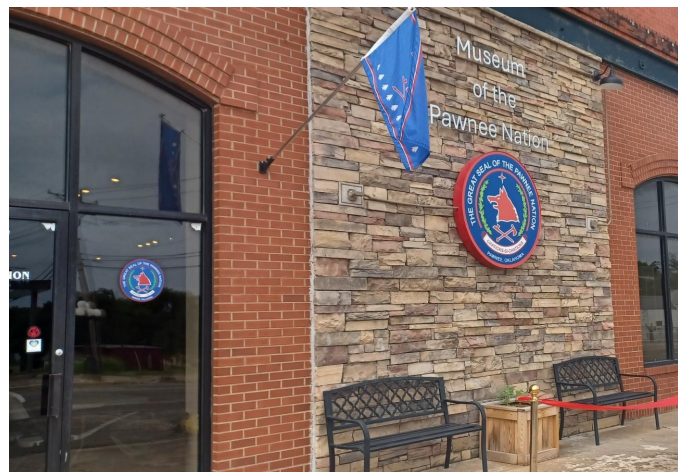

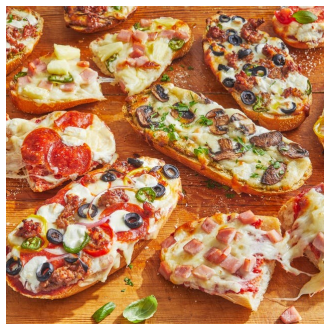


PNHA COOKING CORNER

French Bread Mini Pizzas

Ingredients:

6 whole deli rolls or
French bread, sliced
Jarred marinara or pizza
sauce
Jarred or refrigerated
pesto
2 lb. shredded mozzarella
cheese
Grated parmesan cheese, to taste
2 Tbsp. butter
1 onion, sliced
1/2 lb. sausage (breakfast or Italian)



Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees
2. For pizza: Slice rolls in half and lay them, cut side up, on a large baking sheet
3. Top each half with a generous portion of either marinara or pesto. Top with generous amount of grated mozzarella and parmesan cheese.
4. Melt the butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the onions and cook, stirring occasionally, until golden and softened, 8 to 10 minutes. Transfer to a plate.
5. Add the sausage to the skillet. Cook, breaking up with a wooden spoon, until no longer pink, 6 to 8 minutes
6. Top the bread with the onions and sausage. Sprinkle on your choice of optional toppings.
7. Once all assembled, put the pan in the oven on the lowest rack for 8 to 10 minutes. Increase the heat to 425 degrees and put it on the highest rack until the cheese starts to bubble a bit and turn golden, 2 to 3 minutes.
8. Remove and serve immediately. You can cut the pizzas in half right across the middle so there are mini French bread pizzas.

NO-BAKE COOKIES

Ingredients:

1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup milk
1/3 Cup Cocoa
1 3/4 cup sugar
2/3 cup peanut butter

1 tsp vanilla
3 cups oats



Instructions: In a large pot add sugar, milk, butter, and cocoa. Slowly bring to a boil while whisking. Once at a boil allow to boil for one minute. Remove from heat and add in oats. Mix well. Add in peanut butter, mix well. Last add in vanilla and mix well. Lay out on parchment paper on the counter and spoon out the dough into cookie shapes.

TACO RICE

Ingredients:

1 lb ground beef
1 packet taco seasoning
2 cups water
2 cups Minute Rice,
uncooked
1 cup salsa
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese



Instructions:

In a large skillet, brown and crumble ground beef. Drain the excess grease.

Add in taco seasoning and water. Stir well and allow mixture to come to a boil.

Turn down heat, then add in uncooked Minute Rice and stir.

Cover and cook for about 5 minutes (until rice is tender). Then remove lid and stir in salsa and cheese. Turn off the heat and it's ready to serve!

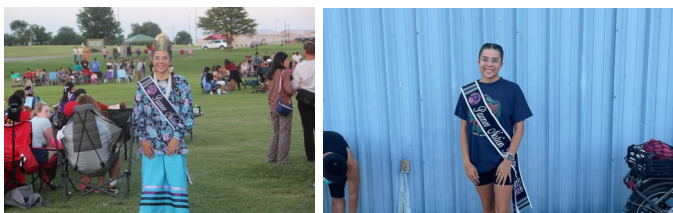

CONSTITUTION REVISIONS

At its July 15th Special Meeting, the Pawnee Business Council passed two key resolutions to formally request a Secretarial Election from the Secretary of the Interior. This election would allow citizens to vote on proposed amendments to the Constitution of the Pawnee Nation. These amendments were developed over a three-year period by delegates of the Pawnee Nation Constitution Convention. The Convention was composed of both Pawnee Business Council members and Pawnee Nation citizens, working together to strengthen and modernize the Nation's Governing Document. The Convention concluded on March 3, 2025, and the final proposed amendments were submitted to the Pawnee Business Council for review and a request to move forward with a vote of the people.

- Resolution #25-35 calls for a Secretarial Election of all eligible Pawnee Nation voters.

- Resolution #25-36 appoints the Pawnee Nation Election Commission to conduct the election and approves the format of the ballot questions.

The Pawnee Nation is currently in the initial phase of the election request process. During the Council Meeting, Governing Documents Chair Jenifer Gover LittleSun announced that the Committee

plans to host community forums in Pawnee, Tulsa, and Oklahoma City to ensure citizens are informed, engaged, and prepared to vote.

Forum dates will be posted on the Constitution Convention webpage as soon as they are confirmed. Citizens are encouraged to check the site regularly for updates and details.

Your voice matters. Please take time to review the proposed amendments and exercise your right to vote. Hard copies of the document are available upon request from the Pawnee Nation Executive Office.
