APPLICATION & WAIT LIST PROCESS

What happens after you turn in an application? Here are the steps the Housing Office uses to process applications.

- 1. A written application by a responsible member of the family will be obtained from each family seeking admission with all supporting documentation and identification attached.
- 2. Processing: Verified information will be analyzed and a determination made with respect for the following:
 - a. Verification of applicant as a familyBackground checks, Landlord check
 - Eligibility of applicant with respect to income limits for admission -Income verification with employer
 - c. Size of unit required for the family
 - d. Preference and/or Priority of applicant family Priority #1 Pawnee Tribal Members, Priority #2 Pawnee Descendancy, Priority #3 Other federally recognized tribes. Preference Veterans, Elders and disabled
 - e. Determination of eligibility with respect to standard of admission of Housing programs.
- After all verification is cleared, the application is forwarded to the waiting list based on preference, priority, family size and income.
- 5. Applicants should update their application annually to remain on the waiting list.
- 6. Once a unit becomes available the next applicant on the waiting list will be contacted.

A deposit of \$300 and first months rent is due before the applicant moves in.

HOUSING RECERTIFICATIONS

We have a majority of the recert applications completed. Please be sure to look for your letter, most of the new rent rates start on April 1st. If you have any questions or concerns about the recertification process, please call our office.

SMOKE DETECTOR PROGRAM

Housing will be going to each our units in the next month or two to inspect and install smoke detectors. We have partnered with the Pawnee Nation to help in keeping our residents safe and educate them on fire safety. For more information on this program go to our Housing website.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES PROGRAM

The Housing Authority has several programs for the youth who play participate in sports or participate in extracurricular activities. This program offers assistance to parents in the amount of \$200.00 to help pay for participation fees, sports gear, sports shoes, etc. This program is income and Pawnee jurisdiction based.




HOUSING MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR REPP GRANT OBJECTIVES

With rising energy costs, we need to be creative and find solutions that reduce energy consumption in order to save money. We have sensors and thermostats available for free that are able to determine what is causing energy consumption and help shrink it. This gives us insight into how to reduce your electric bill. For example, we can save 82% on energy just by switching 100W bulbs to 18W LED bulbs. The thermostat can programmed to specific temperatures at different times throughout the day; you can turn the AC down while at work and set the AC to turn up when you're on your way home. This can greatly reduce heating and cooling costs!

We are looking for volunteers that want these smart sensors and thermostats installed in their homes and/or businesses in order to help us identify what aspect of electrical consumption needs improvement. Using this information we can determine the most cost-effective way to reduce our energy consumption. There is no cost to anyone who participates in this study and installation will be done by a licensed electrician! You simply need Wi-Fi and the willingness to help the community.

We are also looking for feedback from the community as to where electric vehicle chargers should be placed. We are aiming for them to be in high use places so we get the most out of them.

If you want to become certified for solar installation and potentially run your own business, we are certifying 8 hard working members of the community. They will complete an online course and then travel to Washington State to become certified.
