- Did you know that Racial Discrimination happens everywhere in the world and you might not even know it?
- Experts say "Ninety-two percent of surveyed African-Americans say discrimination against black Americans exists today". This also affects many different races. For example Hispanic people, Native American etc.
- Have you been denied equal education opportunities due to your nationality? Has your child been assigned certain classes based on their race?
- In 2014 2.7 million kids were suspended in school and 31% of them were children of color

Influences of Racial Discrimination?

- Racial discrimination could affect various thing around us.
 - Racism could disrupt students learning.
 - Students who experienced racism could explain the following:
 - being bullied
 - scared of going to school
 - have trouble concentrating in classes
 - have trouble making friends
 - falling behind in school work etc.
 - Students, teachers and also the whole school experience racism in different ways.

Teacher Responses

We surveyed 21 teachers here at FMS@HSC about racial discrimination. We found that...


- 76% of the teachers have witnessed students that have been treated unfairly because of their race.
- 10 teachers addressed this issue to other staff members
- 19% teachers have treated kids differently because of their race
- 5 teachers out of the 21 we surveyed said that they have witnessed kids treating other kids badly based on their race.

Student Responses

We surveyed 95 students here at FMS@HSC about racial discrimination in the school. Our results were..


- 47% of students have witnessed other students get treated differently because of their race.
- 60% of students believe that there were times where kids were treated unfairly because of their race.

"Have **YOU** treated anyone unfairly at FMS@HSC because of their race?"*





LGBTQ+

An initialism which refers to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender/transsexual and others who supposedly do not fit the sex and gender norms set by society, being used since the 1990s. It is an adaptation of LGB which replaced the term "gay" from the mid to late 1980s.

Homophobia and Transphobia

<u>Homophobia</u> - the fear, hatred, or discomfort against people who are lesbian, gay, or bisexual

<u>Transphobia</u> - the fear, hatred, or discomfort against transexuals, transgenders, or any such persons who do not follow traditional so called sex and gender "norms"

Why Are These Issues Problematic?

Issues such as homophobia and transphobia are problematic because they interfere with the way people choose to live their lives. Whether it's a comment about someone's sexuality, or an insult that attacks the way someone chooses to identify or express their gender, these judgments about others and the way they choose to live often affect the way they feel about themselves.

What Causes Homophobia?

Homophobia is caused by...

- Being unaccepting of change
- Perspective that it is wrong to be part of the LGBTQ+ community
- Religious Reasons
- Stereotypes


What are the Effects of Homophobia?

Studies show that lesbian, gay and bisexual people show higher levels of anxiety, depression and suicidal feelings than heterosexual men and women.

These mental health conditions can be linked to, or caused by, hostility or rejection from family parents and friends; bullying and name-calling at school; danger of violence; casual homophobia and negative portrayal of gay people in the media.







WHAT IS YOUR SEXUAL ORIENTATION?










- "I don't have a problem but just don't do stuff like that near me"
