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Year in Review

Learning, Listening, and Looking Ahead

In 2025, we offered **28 free webinars**, reinforcing the strength of our learning community and the value of creating spaces where ideas, tools, and experiences can be shared meaningfully. Participant feedback reflected strong appreciation for the quality, organization, and continuity of our offerings, affirming our commitment to accessible, community-centered professional learning.

Across the year, the webinars addressed several interconnected themes reflecting the evolving needs of educators, scholars, and professionals. Sessions focused on adult learning theory, instructional design, and inclusive teaching practices; the ethical and practical use of artificial intelligence and digital tools; research methodologies, scholarly writing, and academic productivity; and coaching, career pathways, and professional growth. Participants consistently highlighted the high informational value of these sessions and shared that the content supported their professional and scholarly work.

Feedback also revealed a constructive desire for more applied learning. Participants expressed interest in seeing theories, tools, and frameworks enacted through concrete examples and live demonstrations, signaling readiness to move from conceptual understanding to practical implementation.

Time and pacing emerged as important considerations. While the concise format was valued, many participants wanted additional opportunities for discussion, interaction, and deeper exploration—pointing to interest in extended sessions, multi-part offerings, or modular learning experiences.

Looking ahead, these insights are directly shaping future programming. High-priority areas include ethical and practical uses of AI in education, applying adult learning theory to instructional practice, research and writing productivity, research methodologies, and global and culturally situated perspectives in adult learning.

Overall, this year's feedback confirms what matters most to our community: strong facilitation, intellectually rigorous content, practical application, and opportunities for continued learning. We look forward to building on these insights as we continue learning alongside you.

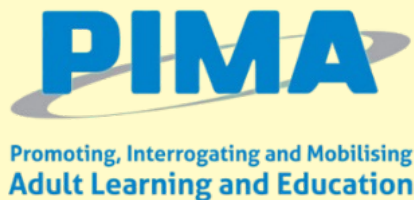
Dissertation Coaching
