2025 has been another year of significant growth and impact for Cornerstone Retreat Center (CRC). We have served 1st responders and their families with critical emotional and well-being services while helping them find healing and restorative support. Here are some of the highlights:



In 2025 CRC has provided 168 wellness services and instruction to over 710 first responders, including:

- Individual peer support sessions to 69 people
- Group peer support sessions to 70 people
- Critical incident stress debriefs (CISDs) to 13 people
- 1st Responder Mental Health and Resiliency classes to 330 people.
- Peer Support Training (3-day) classes to 176 people

What is "Peer Support"?

Peer Support is a process of listening, encouraging, sharing knowledge and skills, and providing assistance to peers in order to help them effectively deal with the challenges of stress and trauma.

Significant CRC Accomplishments in 2025

- Completed the new pumphouse (combined shower house, bathrooms and utility room).
- More than 3,409 volunteer hours of work with a value of over \$118,6000.
- Donations received of over \$105,000



The 40-acre CRC retreat property located in Orion, IL has undergone significant improvements to the landscape and structures, and is currently being used by 1st responder families for fishing, hiking, picnics and special events. In addition to regular property maintenance (e.g. landscaping, mowing, cutting, cleanup, etc.) we have been busy building a new pumphouse and performing major reconstruction on the main pond dam support wall.

What's Next (Phase 2/2026)

In 2025, your donations have helped us to provide numerous services to 1st responders and spouses, as well as complete the pumphouse and general property improvements.

In 2026, with your help, we will purchase more glamp tents and begin construction on our meeting/event center. Meanwhile, we will continue to provide our emotional wellness services and instruction to 1st responders and their families, and have the retreat property open for fishing, hiking, picnicking, and special events.

Unfortunately, 1st responders, when compared to the citizen population, continue to experience much higher rates of depression, PTSD, and suicide. And this, in turn, has a negative impact on the well-being of their families as well.
