



Vivian Guggenheim (b. 1961) is an Argentine visual artist who has lived and worked in Madrid since 2017.

Trained in Fine Arts, she studied under the renowned Argentine master Miguel Dávila. At the age of ten, she received First Prize for Best Young Artist in Santiago, Chile. She later received Second Prize from the National Endowment for the Arts in Buenos Aires.

Guggenheim was recently invited to participate in an Art Residency at the Pouch Cove Foundation in Newfoundland, Canada. Since 1980, she has participated in numerous solo and group exhibitions, as well as international art fairs, including ARCO, Spain; Art Toronto, Canada; Art Chicago and Art San Francisco, USA; arteBA, Buenos Aires, Argentina; and Art Fair Málaga, Spain.

Her work has been exhibited in museums and galleries across several countries and is held in private collections in Argentina, Brazil, Bolivia, Uruguay, the United States, Canada, the Dominican Republic, Spain, and France.

Her practice also encompasses teaching and visual arts education. She has taught and developed educational projects at institutions including ChavónEdu in the Dominican Republic, affiliated with Parsons School of Design in New York, and the Recoleta Cultural Center in Buenos Aires.

In September 2026, Guggenheim presents her solo exhibition *Into Your Waters* at LALACONTEMPORARY Gallery in Toronto.
