

Thank you to all of our American Legion family who have renewed their membership in the American Legion for the 2025 membership year already. We currently have 303 Legion members who have renewed their membership for 2025, with around 45 Legionnaires who haven't yet renewed for this year. The Legion membership goal for this year is 319, but I think we can exceed that amount by a long shot. The SAL has a membership goal of 121 this year and 86 members have renewed so far this year. Our Auxiliary is currently at 90% with 184 members who have renewed, their membership goal for this year is 205. As you can see, we need to have a strong membership push through the end of March to

retain our current members, as well as sign up new members in all of our groups.
