

Members renewal information update: It is time once again to renew your American Legion Membership for the 2025 year. So far, over 50% of our membership has renewed their membership. Our goal is to have everyone renewed and reach 100% quota by Veterans Day. Please consider renewing your American Legion membership today.

When you renew your American Legion membership this year, you can take advantage of the new multi year (3 year) membership which is available to both current and potential members. Legionnaires can lock-in a three-year membership at the current rate of \$40 if you do it before 31 December by visiting legion.org/renew . THE 3YR MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL IS ONLY AVAILABLE ONLINE! Our Post Officers cannot renew you for the three years if you decide to send a check to the Post.

In other news...the resolution from the Dept of Ohio to increase dues by \$5, that was projected to start in January 2025, failed at the Department convention in July. That means the annual Membership dues for Frank E. Robinson Post 586 will stay \$40 per year for the entire 2025 membership year.

GO AIR FORCE FALCONS!



As the 2024 college football season nears, the Air Force Falcons are poised for another competitive year. Coming off a strong 2023 season, where they excelled in the Mountain West Conference and the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy competition, the Falcons are expected to build on their success.

While the team will miss key departing seniors, they return a solid core of players, particularly on the offensive line and defense. The Falcons' trademark triple-option offense, led by a new starting quarterback, will remain central to their strategy. Defensively, they'll focus on stopping the run and forcing opponents into tough passing situations.

The 2024 schedule includes challenging games within the Mountain West and key rivalry matchups against Army and Navy for the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy. An early-season game against a Power Five opponent will be a significant test.

Projected to be strong contenders in the Mountain West and likely to secure a bowl game invitation, the Falcons are set for another successful season, driven by the discipline and resilience that define their program.

HUFFMAN PRAIRIE: THE BIRTHPLACE OF PRACTICAL AVIATION



Huffman Prairie, located near Dayton, Ohio, is a site of immense historical significance in the world of aviation. It was here, on this unassuming stretch of farmland, that the Wright brothers, Orville and Wilbur, made their groundbreaking advances in flight, transforming their early experiments into practical aviation.

After their initial success at Kitty Hawk in 1903, the Wright brothers returned to Dayton and selected Huffman Prairie as their testing ground. From 1904 to 1905, they conducted hundreds of flights at this site, refining their Flyer and developing the first practical airplane. Their work at Huffman Prairie laid the foundation for modern aviation, as they perfected controlled, sustained flight and introduced crucial innovations such as a catapult launch system.

Today, Huffman Prairie is preserved as part of the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park. Visitors can explore the historic site, where interpretive displays and markers provide insight into the Wright brothers' pioneering work. Huffman Prairie stands as a testament to human ingenuity and the relentless pursuit of innovation, marking the true birthplace of practical aviation.


We will be meeting at the Post at 9am the morning of the parade.
