- Reports from youth art day at the YMCA January 6. Participants indicated it was a successful day, and everyone had a good time. Changes for next time include purchasing or reimbursing for art supplies for presenters. Also, we decided that next time we would make fewer packets for distribution. Leftover supply packets were donated to a group of kids with disabilities and to Turning Pointe shelter, both of whom were delighted to receive them.

Help with Spring show – The board approved to hire Gethsemane ministries to help set up and break down the display boards for the spring show. When Becky S arrived, she said that she and her crew had it covered and it wasn't necessary to hire someone. **Publicity** We need to work on getting the word out to the community about PAA and what we do. It was mentioned that it has been difficult to get noticed in the Journal. However, later in the meeting, Dave (?) from the journal arrived, so maybe they notice us more than we think. Another suggestion was that we reach out to local churches to publicize our events.

Art supply packets While we enjoyed giving out packets of art supplies, it was suggested we would need to offset the cost with a fundraiser.

PAA Coloring book We are still exploring the option of creating a coloring book to sell as a fundraiser

Shelton Saturday market Another option for PAA exposure is having a table at the Saturday market. In addition, it was suggested that we can have a kid's activity table at the market, so kids would have something to do while their parents shopped. *Renee M* said she can help coordinate. Rent for the space is \$25 or a percentage of sales, whichever is less.

Youth connection another suggestion was to have PAA members work with kids for 2-3 hours a week to teach art to kids at the Youth Connection.
