In other club news, it been suggested that we make a donation to the wild cat sanctuary on Harstine Island. Unlike a zoo, this place is more like visiting someones backyard that happens to have around 50 large kitties. The animals that are housed there were brought in from exploitative, unsafe or neglective situations and will live the rest of their lives in this safe haven.

The Wild Felid Advocacy Center was founded in 2004 and received nonprofit status in 2006. Receiving no State or Federal Funding, the Center relies totally on support from the public. All the people who care for these animals are volunteers. The current

population of cats cost roughly \$60,000 a year to maintain. This sanctuary is home to an impressive list of wild cats, including servals, snow leopards, a caracal, jungle cats and several hybrids (domestic/wild cat mixes).

A visit to this place would make a great field trip, concluding with a generous donation to help them keep these animals well cared for. Great idea, don't you think? At a future meeting we can discuss how and what we can do to help support this facility.
