Developmental Milestones

Masters use of hands and finger: hold pencils, turns pages in a book, draws pictures Recognizes most common objects Understands most sentences Uses five or more words in sentences Can tell a story Can identify colors, shapes, like objects Begins to count Understands the concept of "two" Develops empathy; learns what "hurts" other children Learns to "take turns in games" Desires to make friends Can understand concept "mine" and "yours" Learns through fantasy and imaginative play Begins to remember simple rules of behavior Understands concepts of "same" and "different" Expands ability to express and interpret feelings
