- Complete your Medical Forms early (Parts A, B & C)

Helpful Hint: If your scout had his annual physical after 7/26/2019, physician can complete Part C based upon results of 2019 physical

Part C requires

- Forms that must be provided <u>before June 15th</u>
 - Registration & payment form
 - Medical Form (parts A, B & C)
 - Copy of insurance card (front & back)
 - Food allergy form (if applies)
 - Three Strikes Agreement (signed by scout and parent)
 - Merit Badge Planning Sheet

 - □Some have prerequisites or require a certain rank
 - Merit Badge worksheets can be downloaded meritbadge.org or Amazon.com
- Complete required prerequisites before arrival at camp
- Refer to "Notes" section for info about what scout must bring to camp for that merit badge
- COMPLETED <u>Merit Badge Planning Sheets</u> must be handed in on or before June 18th

- Special form used to record completion of requirements
- SPL can initial any of the completed requirements
- Requires at least 50% of the patrol to participate
- Turn in the completed form to the SPL

Baden Powell Award

- Special form used to record completion of requirements
- SM initials requirements as they are completed
- Requires at least 50% of the patrol to participate
- Turn in the completed form to Commissioner by 5pm Friday

Camp Payment / Scholarships / Refunds

Camp Payments – Our "early bird" discount is a \$50 discount (per week) for all Scouts who pay for camp in full by May 1, with an extension available to Webelos crossing over into the Scouts BSA until June 1.

Camp Scholarships – Understanding these are difficult financial times for many, we have extended the deadline for Warren Wheeler Adventureship (camp scholarship) requests until May 1. Please access our application by clicking here: Adventureship Requests.

- •Camp Refunds If refunds are necessary, one may apply for a refund beginning June 1 and receive a 100% refund.
- •The deadline to submit for a full refund is June 30. An online form for refunds will be developed and distributed shortly. After June 30, our standard refund policy will apply.
- •If our summer camps are unable to open this summer, we will honor a full refund on all registrations. Scouts BSA troops will have the option to apply their 2020 site deposit toward 2021 or receive a full refund.
