

<u>Troop 75 May Campout</u> Ricketts Glen May 13 - May 15

Troop 75 will be visiting Rickett's Glen State Park in Benton, Pennsylvania at the height of the spring water season. The weekend will feature a six-mile hike with 23 waterfalls.



Depart: Meet Friday evening May 13, 2022 at 5:30 PM (arrive well fed, or bring a sack dinner for the car ride) **Return:** Sunday afternoon May 15 at approximately 1:00 PM **Cost:** \$25 per Scout and Adults

Troop 75 Camping notes for parents of new Scouts: The Troop provides all tents, cooking gear, and general campsite equipment. Scouts should bring appropriate day clothes and separate sleep clothes, a warm sleeping bag, air mattress or foam pad, rain gear (always), and an eating kit (plate, cup, and spoon). Everyone should wear hiking boots for the hike (preferred) or bring a second set of dry sneakers and extra socks. A backpack is not required, but a knapsack will be helpful to carry the Scout Essentials (page 264) during the hike. Please ensure the scouts bring an extra set of clothes as we will be getting wet. Be sure your Scout's name is on absolutely everything. Cell phones are discouraged, and iPods / Handheld games are prohibited.

Food: Individual food is not permitted in the tents (we're in bear country). The Scouts will be cooking as patrols, and they will plan their menu during the Troop meeting on April 14. One or several Scouts from each patrol are assigned as "grubmasters" for each campout and they will do the grocery shopping for their patrol (completing First Class requirement 4a and 4b, handbook page 436).

Travel: The park is a ~3h drive from Cranford, plus traffic. Late arrivals / early departures on Troop campouts are disruptive with carpool logistics, but are possible with advanced notice. Please clearly write on the attached permission slip if any special schedule is required.

Late changes: Please contact Bob Meier (908-276-4239) ASAP if there is any unavoidable change in plans after the permission slip has been returned, particularly if it affects driving logistics.
