The First Engine Due is offered in a two-day program. Topics covered in The First Engine

- 1.75 loads and deployments
- 2.5 loads and deployments (Long and Short)
- Hose bundle use
- Nozzle and attack package selection
- Force Multipliers for the short-staffed Engine
- Hose line advancement and fire attack
- Tactical Deck gun

This Class is two days and the cost is \$4500 Flat and covers up to 30 students

Rural Water Supply

The ability to perform for any amount of time on a fire is strongly dependent on the amount of water you have, in the rural setting it is sometimes only what you bring until you build your own water supply. In this class we explore options based on your District to maximize your abilities.

- Supplying the Attack Engine
- Source site supply
- On scene Draft operations
- Water Supply Group supervision
- Long Hose Lays
- Turbo Draft and alternative Static supply methods

The Class cost for this topic is \$6000 and includes up to 50 Students

Forcible Entry

Rapid Development Leadership

This lecture is covered by Howard Rinewalt and is so important for the members who promote through rank at younger ages and a nice reminder to the seasoned members who may just want to reignite their passion to service based leadership. We do so well prepping recruits to be firefighters and then we drop the ball on preparation to promote. We must do more than here is your badge good luck, in rapid development leadership we will cover management methods, leadership styles, documentation, and we will participate in group scenarios that could occur and discuss how best to handle the challenges.

Aggressive Command

This is a class instructed by District Chief Mo Davis from the Houston Fire Department. With decades of experience in the busiest houses in Houston, he will discuss the lessons learned and the successes experienced. This class will cover commanding companies to the highest level of confidence in each decision and how to reach that level.

The Initial Attack Line

Captain of a very busy Engine in Mobile, Anthony Rowett will cover the initial attack line and its functions. More so than just off of an Engine, Anthony gets in to vertical stretching, standpipes, estimating stretches, weapon selection, and knowing your equipment. This class is rich in information for the guys wanting to learn the most they can about water delivery.

Tactical Mindset

This class is instructed by 43-year veteran Dennis Reilly. He will cover the mindset needed in the most difficult situations. He goes over lessons from the military, incident phases, lessons from high risk environments, coopers scale of mental awareness, and popular trends in the fire service.
