What if we saw the presence of the holy in all that has been, is, and always will be-right here-reflected in and through everything and everyone around us?

Grace and peace to you, friends and family of Salmon Creek United Methodist Church!

As I write to you today, I am looking out of my office window enjoying the beautiful yellow & red leaves of the small tree in front of this building dedicated to Sue Wiltsey for her many years of loving service to Salmon Creek UMC! It is a reminder to me of the many people in my life for whom I am thankful! After recent rains many of the colorful leaves in our area have fallen into puddles of color on the ground, so I'm sure this tree will soon do the same. Still, this is one of my favorite times of the year as cooler weather sets in, and plans for Thanksgiving celebrations begin to overlap with preparation for Advent.

Last month I shared a look ahead to our upcoming Advent series, *Reflecting the Sacred*. Through scriptures, reflection, and music of the Advent season we will be reminded of the sacred that shows up in our lives in unexpected ways every day. This series is inspired by Richard Rohr's *The Universal Christ* and a companion devotional book called *Every Thing Is Sacred*, co-authored by Patrick Boland. I know of one small group, our Sunday Night Learners, planning to do an extended study of Rohr's *The Universal Christ* that will take them into the season of Lent. If you are interested in learning more about this class, I encourage you to talk with their leader, Dave Nieda.

Before we look too far down the road, I want to thank all of you who have turned in 2026 giving pledge cards during our *Invest in God's Nest* stewardship focus. It has been a gift to me during the month of November to remember that we truly have so much for which to be grateful. Please know I am grateful to God for the gift each of you are in my life and to the life of this congregation.

Moving into December, there are several special things about which I want to be sure you know!

Sunday, December 14<sup>th</sup> will be a very special morning of worship, as our music ministry groups share the gift of Lessons and Carols for our 10 AM service! This would be a great time to invite friends and neighbors to join us for worship!

This Sunday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> our Mission Giving Tree is scheduled to go up in the entry, and may already be up by the time you read this! We will again be providing gifts for families who have graduated from the Family Promise program. Unwrapped gifts will need to be at church by December 7<sup>th</sup> so that they can be delivered the following week. Instructions will be available at the Giving Tree in the lobby.

Monday, December 15<sup>th</sup> we will offer a Night of Hope service at 6 pm in Pioneer Chapel. This service is designed for anyone who has experienced loss or is struggling with feelings of less than joy. It will focus on the hope and light we find in the season of Christmas. Those who attended this service last year found it meaningful.

Saturday, December 20<sup>th</sup> will be another great opportunity to enjoy the gift of music as *Bells of the Cascades* will be here at Salmon Creek UMC to share their holiday concert.

Wednesday, December 24<sup>th</sup> we will celebrate Christmas Eve with three services: 5, 8, and 11 pm. All three services will be similar, and will end with candlelight. The 5 pm service will be more family oriented, while the 8 pm service will include our chancel choir and hand bells. Make plans now to attend one of our services with your family.

#### October, 2025 Financial Update

Our pledge income stayed strong in October, with pledges at 122 % of Budget, and still 108 % for the year. In a repeat comment, your commitment to our Church and our Community remains steadfast and we appreciate everyone's generosity. Your commitment was demonstrated once again at this year's Mission Dinner with over 100 in attendance. Expenses were very close to our original budget, (before the 40,000 in facilities costs added to our budget). October expenses were 9,000 favorable to plan this month, but ~ (14,000) unfavorable variance for the year. This YTD unfavorable variance should reverse itself by year end.

As a result of the strong pledge income and favorable investment results, we showed a profit of 5,306 in October and whittled our YTD loss down to  $\sim$  (10,000) loss. The financial results have been significantly supported by a gain in some of our investments in the Mutual Funds Market, with a YTD profit in investment income of  $\sim$  42,000. Praise be to God! Without this, our YTD losses would be in the  $\sim$  (50,000) Loss territory. We continue to keep a watchful eye on our income and expenses every month.

With respect to our Preschool program, we still continue to operate at a loss as we strive to add more students. YTD Losses approximated (12,000) through October. We are vigorously pursuing additional enrollment and are vigilantly watching enrollment figures and daily expenses. We are grateful for the Women's Ministry decision to support the program through a 5,000 commitment through the end of December, 2025.

2026 BUDGET NOTE -- Unfortunately, our preliminary 2026 budgeting process is currently indicating a ~ 50,000 Loss for the year. This type of "structural deficit" is obviously not sustainable so we are asking everyone to prayerfully consider their pledges for next year, and we are encouraging everyone to get their pledge cards in for 2026. Our programs and community involvement are great, and we want to continue those commitments by increasing our pledge figures for next year.

Thank you to everyone for your contributions of time, talent and financial resources as we continue to worship together as disciples of Jesus Christ, united in missions, fellowship and service.

# Pay It Forward Campaign

#### PAY-IT-FORWARD 2025-27 – The new campaign November Update

#### Dear Congregation:

We have received, as of November 14<sup>th</sup>, \$33,000 including \$1,350 for donations by others for this year. The pledged goal was \$48,000 for 2025. Please renew your efforts for this year. This is an update for the PIF 2025 campaign. See the summary on the next page.

We have pledges of \$132,550 for the 3-year campaign. Thanks for the pledges! We will replace as necessary and as funds become available. Some of the funds may be for projects that become needed later.

Projects completed this year were; replacing the Narthex HVAC, and re-piping plumbing in the FMC. Those projects used the remaining \$20,000 from the previous Pay-It-Forward campaign and general funds that covered most of the rest.

We also needed to replace the roof duct work as it was going bad and that was another ~\$15,800, including roof vents – All in an effort to seal the roof over the Narthex. Those funds came from the new campaign funds.

That said, we are finished for this year. Next year, the Trustees will evaluate priorities. The PIF campaign funds need to address:

4 HVAC Units including 2 for sanctuary - 30 years old

**Flat Roof Repairs** 

Main Building Fire alarm panel - dates from the 1990's, is obsolete and only has 4 smoke detectors for the main building, preschool with kitchen. Parking lot repaying of areas not repayed in 2016 and re-sealing.

Carpets in offices, St Paul room, hallways and FMC.

We promise to be good stewards. I'm very proud to be part of this congregation. Thank you very much for your generosity.
