Dear friends and family of Salmon Creek United Methodist Church, grace and peace to you all.

As I write this note today, January is quickly coming to a close!

I'm down to the deadline for getting this note to Nancy, and I have a confession to make. I have found myself increasingly distracted by the escalating violence and disregard for civil rights across Minnesota that is now spreading to other states and cities across our country. If you were with us in worship on January 19th, you heard me share about my concerns over the nature of the ICE operations that began in Minnesota and are now growing across the country.

I understand that not everyone feels the same way about the deployment of ICE and the work they are doing. But I encourage all of us to resist the urge to look away and the temptation to think that we would never be affected personally. Sunday, I mentioned that we had been following the events in Minneapolis and St. Paul closely because we have family there.


Yet, the more I have followed & thought about what is happening, I realized that all of the people there are all of our children. As I have watched people of Minneapolis respond, I've been encouraged by the large number of people showing up to speak out against the abuses of power they are witnessing, and working to protect their neighbors. One group in particular, Singing Resistance has caught my ear and heart, <https://www.instagram.com/singingresistancetc/> will take you to their Instagram page. They have managed to gather hundreds to walk the streets together, in single digit temperatures, while singing songs of love and encouragement to their neighbors.

One in particular really spoke to my heart, reminding me how we are all part of God's family, carrying within us God's holy breath.

It goes, "*We belong to them, they belong to us. Every one, O every one, O every one of these people are ours, as we are theirs.*" Another speaks to those remaining in their homes, fearful of being targeted because of the color of their skin, "*Hold on, hold on, my dear ones here comes the dawn.*"



I understand agents are now going door-to-door in Minneapolis, Seattle area cities, and cities in other states. While for now they have been active in quieter ways in Clark County, I believe it is important for us to be aware and stay informed. Clergy have shared with me that patrols have been very active in Ridgefield, and Woodland because of the many construction sites in their communities.

All of this calls us, as people of faith, to prayerfully ask, what would God have us do in this moment?

I hope you will join me in praying for this painful situation across our country, for all involved. And, for those of you able to do more than pray, I encourage you to pray and search your heart for ways you can care for our neighbors.

This Saturday, January 24, our area United Methodist Bishop, Cedrick Bridgeforth, will be speaking at an ecumenical gathering at St. Andrew Lutheran Church, here in Vancouver, entitled *United in Faith: A Call to Action*. I am hopeful to learn ways that we can work with other people of faith in our area to be witnesses for God's justice, love, and care for the vulnerable among us.

Well, I need to wrap this up and get it to Nancy, so I had better say a few things about what is ahead for us here at Salmon Creek UMC in February!

All of February: I am excited to share that our shared youth director, Lacey Kelley, and CCMYC (Clark County Methodist Youth Connection) will be with us at Salmon Creek for the month of February!

Lacey will join us and share in our worship on Sunday mornings, and the area youth will be meeting here on Sunday afternoons from 4-6pm. We are also hopeful that some of the area youth will be able to join us for the Fat Tuesday celebration on February 17th.

Sunday, February 8th – Souper Bowl of Caring: Join the fun and do some good! Wear your favorite team colors or shirts and bring donations of canned soup that will be donated to Clark County Food Bank.

Saturday, February 14th – Join us at 10am for some sweet fun as we gather for multi-generational Valentine cookie decorating! The women of our Joy Bible Study will be baking sugar cookies for us to decorate for Valentine's Day. Some cookies will go home with participants while others will be shared at Coffee Fellowship the next day!

Tuesday, February 17th – Do not miss this fun event that supports our youth! Join us in the gym between 5:30 – 7 pm for the annual Fat Tuesday Pancake Dinner to enjoy some delicious pancakes, fun music, and great fellowship! This will be an opportunity for some Mardi Gras fun before we enter the season of Lent. Donations are welcome but not required.

February 18th – Make a plan to attend one of our Ash Wednesday Services as we prepare our hearts for the season of Lent: 12 noon in Pioneer Chapel and 6 pm in the sanctuary.

As we go through the days ahead, I encourage you to ground yourselves in the blessings of each day, the beauty of the sunshine, the life-giving gift of rain, the people in your life who bring you joy and love, the gift of God's love and grace so generously given to us! Best of all, God is with us!

December, 2025 Year End Financial Update

Following is the financial report for the Church as of December 31, 2025.

We have finished our year end accounting and there is "good news and bad news".

The "bad news" included the following:

- We finished the year with a loss of **(18,701)**
- Our building rent income was unfavorable to Budget by ~ **(4,000)**

The "good news" included the following:

- Pledge Income came in at 104 % of Plan
- The YTD Loss was favorable to Budget by ~ 60,000
- We still have adequate cash reserves to cover ~ 9 months of operating expenses

In a continuing and repeat comment, your commitment to our Church and our Community remains steadfast and we appreciate everyone's generosity.

With respect to our Preschool program, we still continue to operate at a loss as we strive to add more students. YTD Losses approximated **(13,000)** through December. The Day School will remain open through May, 2026, but continuing operations beyond that date is doubtful at this point.

Thank you to everyone for your contributions of time, talent and financial resources as we continue to worship together as disciples of Jesus Christ, united in missions, fellowship and service.

Notes, Comments, Etc.

1. (*) The 2025 actuals have been adjusted to eliminate 2025 Investment income of ~ 45,000, and eliminate ~ 40,000 in Facilities Expenses that were "one time" in nature.
2. The increase in Salaries Expenses is primarily due to the addition of the new Youth Director position which is being funded by a consortium of United Methodist Churches.
3. The decrease in Other Expenses is based on utilizing some of the Church's B Accounts which were established to address certain, specific expenses; e.g. Cemetery, Landscaping, etc.
4. The basis premise of the 2026 Budget was to retain current Church staff and to retain / grow the Church's programs and ministries, and utilize our Unrestricted Cash to fund this deficit.







Reverend Dorothy Northcutt Herbert

Dorothy Flowers married Ray Northcutt at Salmon Creek Church in 1952 and was impactful at Salmon Creek United Methodist Church and the Vancouver District until she died in 2009.

In 1952 to 1956, Dorothy Northcutt was active in Women's Society of Christian Service, where she learned in 1956 that the General Conferences of Methodist Churches had granted full rights to women ministers. She said, "I can do that."

In 1961, Reverend Dorothy Northcutt started her 10 year ministry as pastor at Fern Prairie Methodist Church. After that, she substituted in all but one of the 42 churches in the Vancouver district.

She presided at funerals, baptisms and weddings, was treasurer of the Vancouver district, mentored other women pastors and mentored women at Salmon Creek United Methodist Church. At Salmon Creek UMC, Dorothy taught Bible study classes, chaired Evangelism, sang in the choir, trained acolytes, participated in handbells and helped organize and implement Women's Ministry in 1996.

Dorothy and Ray were largely responsible for moving and restoring our Pioneer Chapel to its current location in 1981 as a memorial to Ray's parents who came to Salmon Creek UMC in 1910.

Creek UMC philanthropy by bequeathing, in a trust, a portion of the value of her estate, to our Salmon Creek UMC Women's Ministry, because she believed in our goal of doing God-inspired ministry for SCUMC women.

The Women's Ministry/Dorothy N. Herbert Trust committee (listed below) is committed to responsibly use interest accrued from Dorothy's endowment for Women's Ministry financial support.

We invite Salmon Creek UMC women to help us further God's work by sharing ministry ideas and joining us.

68 breakfasts were ordered, 24 before service and 44 after service:




