Grace and peace to you, friends and family of Salmon Creek United Methodist Church!

As I write to you today, I am looking out of my office window Fall colors are beginning to put on a beautiful show! This is one of my favorite times of the year as cooler weather sets in, and plans for Thanksgiving celebrations begin to overlap with preparation for Advent.

During the month of December, we will share an Advent series *Reflecting the Sacred*. Through the scriptures, reflection, and music of the Advent season we will be reminded that the sacred shows up in our lives in unexpected ways every day. This series is inspired by Richard Rohr's *The Universal Christ* and a companion devotional book called *Every Thing Is Sacred*, co-authored by Patrick Boland. If you or your small group would like to deepen your engagement with this study, I encourage you to consider one or both of these books this Advent.

Before we look too far down the road, we have some important things to share in the month of November!

On Sunday November 2nd we will observe All Saints Sunday, giving thanks to God for the lives of those from our congregation who have died over the past year. We will also have an opportunity to turn in our 2026 stewardship pledge cards as we offer to God what we will *Invest in God's Nest* in the year ahead. Our worship on November 9th and 16th will focus on gratitude and giving thanks. November 23rd we will celebrate Christ the King Sunday with hanging of the greens immediately after worship because Advent begins November 30th.



Thinking about gratitude, I want you all to know how overwhelmed I was to receive so much love and appreciation from you on Pastor Appreciation Sunday! I am so blessed to be your pastor! Please know that I am grateful to God for the gift each of you are in my life and to the life of this congregation.



The 12 church Trustees attending the Zoom meeting on October 6th, with Kathleen Weber, ranged from active support to struggling to get volunteers and funding issues. One church has had no water for months as their well needed to be rebuilt. Finally getting enough funds including local grant to finish and restore water supply. Most churches have lost many of their congregation with some leaving and others aging out. Some have been chair of Trustees for 7 - 10 years, one was 15 years. One church, Aberdeen, is closing end of this year having exhausted all savings. He said they have a very nice building, 150 years old. One said they are repainting one side of the church at a time, as volunteers are getting too old to take on more than that each year.

All in all, our church is in better shape than most. Most attending were from the coast and smaller cities north of us. I do think we need to have more projects announced for maintenance and cleanup, seeking help from the congregation and church users. Others said they had neighborhood dinners to ask for funds for the church and contacts for help.

I appreciate the financial support we do have and all of the volunteer help we have had in the past from painting the church, to painting rooms and replacing lighting.

September, 2025 Financial Update

Following is the financial report for the Church as of September 30, 2025.

Heading into the Fall Months, Pledge income picked up in September to 105 % of plan for the month, and 106 % for the year, and 14,000 favorable to our YTD Budgeted pledges. Your commitment to our Church and our Community remains steadfast and we appreciate everyone's generosity. Expenses returned to normal levels with the originally 2025 unbudgeted Facilities projects being wrapped up. As a result, our expenses were 13,000 favorable to plan this month, but ~ (24,000) unfavorable variance for the year. This unfavorable variance should "reverse" itself over the next few months, since the Facilities projects are complete now but were budgeted at 10,000 per month for the months of September through December. As a result, we should see favorable expense variances through the balance of the year.

As a result of the strong pledge income and favorable investment results, we showed a profit of 8,754 in September and whittled our YTD loss down to ~ (15,000) loss. The financial results have been significantly supported by a gain in some of our investments in the Mutual Funds Market, with a YTD profit in investment income of ~ 38,000. Praise be to God! Without this, obviously we would be in an even higher Operating Loss position for the year, so we are keeping a watchful eye on our income and expenses every month.

With respect to our Preschool program, we still continue to operate at a loss as we strive to add more students. YTD Losses approximated (12,000) through September. We are vigorously pursuing additional enrollment and are vigilantly watching enrollment figures and daily expenses. We are grateful for the Women's Ministry decision to support the program through a 5,000 commitment through the end of December, 2025.

Thank you to everyone for your contributions of time, talent and financial resources as we continue to worship together as disciples of Jesus Christ, united in missions, fellowship and service.

Donations were \$1,192.00. I want to thank all of you for your help and know you are appreciated.




