August, 2025 Financial Update

Following is the financial report for the Church as of August 31, 2025.

Pledge income again declined this month as expected during the summer, with only 81 % of Budget achieved, and ~ (5,000) Unfavorable to Plan. YTD Pledge income is still strong, and we are at 106 % of Plan. Your commitment to our Church and our Community remains steadfast and we appreciate everyone's generosity. Expenses hit a major bump in August with the FMC Facilities project hitting our budget for ~ 27,000 this month, the remainder of the 40,000 budget adjustment made by the Administrative Board earlier this year. This caused our expenses to be ~ (27,000) unfavorable for the month and drove our YTD unfavorable variance to ~ (36,000).

The aforementioned Facilities costs resulted in a negative result for August, with a loss of ~ (36,000). This threw our YTD results into a loss of ~ (24,000). The financial results have been significantly supported by a gain in some of our investments in the Mutual Funds Market, with a YTD profit in investment income of ~ 29,000. Praise be to God! Without this, obviously we would be in an even higher Operating Loss position for the year, so we are keeping a watchful eye on our income and expenses every month.

With respect to our Preschool program, we still continue to operate at a loss as we strive to add more students. YTD Losses approximated (12,000) through August. We are vigorously pursuing additional enrollment and are vigilantly watching enrollment figures and daily expenses.

Thank you to everyone for your contributions of time, talent and financial resources as we continue to worship together as disciples of Jesus Christ, united in missions, fellowship and service.

Trustees Update – Autumn

Narthex HVAC Thermostat: The new Narthex Heat pump is operational. It should be set to 'heat' now as we transition to fall and winter. Heat pumps should run several times per day to keep fresh air in the rooms. It would be better to use our heat pump to maintain the temperature in the narthex and sanctuary during the week. That said, the sanctuary thermostats should be set 1-2 degrees less during the week. Some continue to change the programmed settings on many of the thermostats – so you are responsible for following the concept so we can maximize the use of the new higher efficiency heat pump.

Thermostats in general: I will be changing the TStats in many rooms to 'heat' soon. The warm weather in September was warmer than usual, but after that, we should be done with the AC. Please note the changes to 'Heat' coming soon. As has been the case for years, changing the temperature setting should only be done using the arrows. Changing the <u>programmed</u> settings should only be done by the Trustees. Using <u>permanent hold</u> is not allowed without contacting the Trustees.

Fire Marshal Annual Inspection: They will be here in November with a check list of items of concern – updated extinguisher tags, exit sign testing, etc. Most importantly, there will be a change in wall decorations – hanging paper and cloth on walls will be strictly limited. Paper must be pinned tight to the walls / bulletin boards. Cloth decorations must be as well and must be treated, including window curtains. Next year all cloth decorations, banners may need to be made from factory treated cloth. We are going to ask for some clarification, especially on the banners we use in the Sanctuary.

Anyone 18 years or older is welcomed to attend.

The registration fee is \$26.57 and includes all training materials, lunch and snacks. The registration deadline is Monday, October 13th. There are several pre-requisites to complete before the class so please register ASAP.

They rely on private funding so that they can offer services and faith-based support for as long as needed to leave homelessness. Their focus is to provide the tools necessary for resolving the underlying issues that lead to poverty and homelessness. Their services include providing case management to help the residents gain life skills to lead a healthy independent life.

They have 2 stores where they offer vocational training for residents in their care. The thrift store, Secondhand Solutions, helps the residents gain job skills and self-confidence. The Wheel Deals Bicycles is a full-service bicycle sales and service shop run by Open House Ministries. This shop also provides residential job training and skill building programs under the careful supervision of experienced bike supervisors.

Habitat also announced their new store, opening at 3200 NE 52nd Street. This will be


another resource for selling donated furniture, home goods, and building materials at discounted prices.


August 24, 2025 Benefit Breakfast Foundation for Vancouver Public Schools
