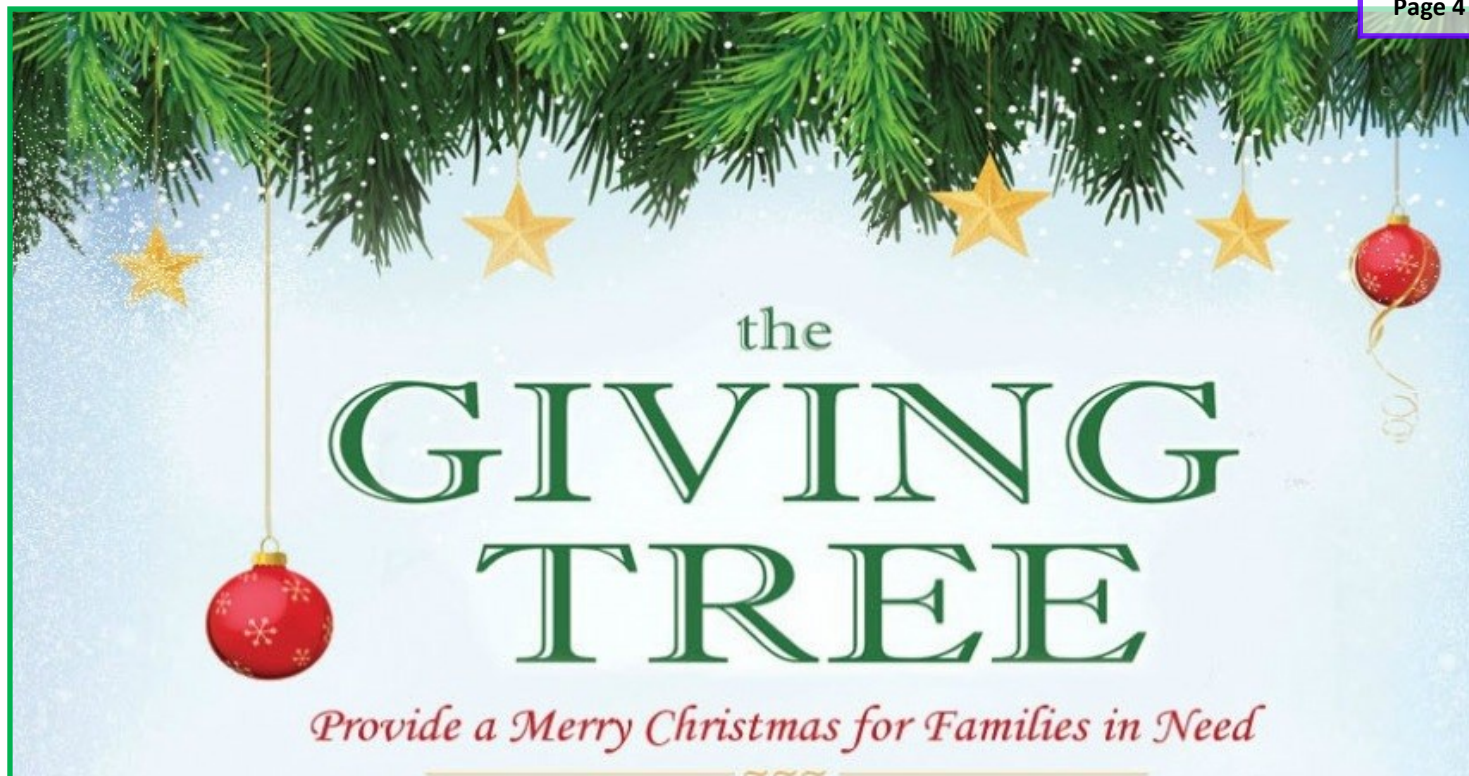
a note from Pastor John

In the two million years of human archeological history, the vast majority of our ancestors lived in a community. Some were perhaps quite small – a family or two – but many were multi-family groups. While it is certainly true that, in a utilitarian way of thinking, communities contributed to the survival of their constituents, it is also true that communities have always been built on relationship. In short, humans have always needed other humans for more than utilitarian purposes. One of those purposes has been the communal waking to the presence of God. While a solitary individual may feel the presence of God, that experience must be validated and supported by the experience of others. Very, very few true hermits existed then or now and, truth be told, they are usually supported by some kind of community.

As in millions of other churches, mosques, synagogues and temples around the planet, we at Salmon Creek Church also seek God in community. As with ancient humans, we too need validation and support that our journey has meaning because it has meaning for others; that we can count on the support of our community because, when it's our turn, we will support others in the community. During times of stress or discord we all must be able to look to that which lies at the center of our community – Jesus Christ – to guide us back to harmony. When the community becomes unstable, it is Christ who calls us to set aside or resolve differences (Matthew 18), embrace humility (Matthew 7:1-5) and practice our faithfulness to God's Word in our faithfulness to our community.

The world continues to change at a dizzying pace – in our families, in our communities and in our churches. But there is no better time of year than Advent for us to remember, individually and as a community, that we still stand on the solid rock of Jesus Christ. And keep in mind that the verses that mention shifting sands (Matthew 7:24-27) refer to a community: the wise man does not stand alone; he builds a house. God deliberately chooses to be incarnated as Jesus into the most basic of communities, a family, and begins his ministry by forming a community of disciples. This year as we light the Advent candles of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, we wish these things not only for ourselves, but also for those around us. The fire from the candles does not merely represent the utilitarian necessity for warmth. It represents the deeper fire of the Spirit, born in Christ and lived out in families and communities everywhere.

FOOD PANTRY

Please continue to bring in your donations for our Food Pantry "blessing bags". We are serving those who come to our door for help. For the most part, they are houseless and unable to cook a meal, therefore having items that are **pop top and ready to open** and eat are best. Below is a list of items to help guide your shopping. Donations can be left in the "Outreach Food" cart in the narthex of the church at the back doors near the family ministries center. With your help, we can help others by providing them nourishment. Thank you!

- Water bottles
- Crackers (the kind that come in sleeves is best)
- Peanut butter (16 oz size or less)
- Canned meat (tuna, chicken, salmon, pork, ham)
- Soup
- Fruit (canned or fruit cups)
- Jell-o cups
- Protein bars
- Snack bars
- Individual packages of nuts, raisins, dried fruit
- Travel sized toiletries
- Tooth brush/tooth paste
- Small tissue packs
- Hand warmers

2022 Annual Missions Dinner and Auction

Things were rolling again for the auction. We had more than 3 dozen baskets donated for the event. Attendance was around 90 folks and we raised over \$14,000! The Dessert Dash was a hit again, raising \$2,600. Live auction items featured a wood carved US Flag and a handmade quilt for the 10 items in that portion of the evening. Greg Berry served as host, and of course Roger Brindle was the auctioneer, with Gavin Huckins and Juan Maldonado as our “Vanna Whites”, displaying the auction items.

Funds raised will be sent to the 5 charities:

Share Inc. – Non-profit organization that provides food and shelter to the homeless and low income in Clark county, including school food, backpacks and summer lunches for low income kids.

Vancouver Seafarers Center – Welcomes and provides services for international mariners while docked at the Port of Vancouver and Portland.

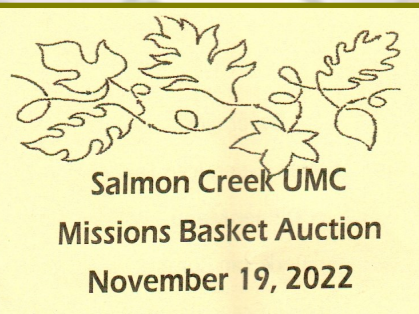
Safe Choice – Women’s shelter and services, for those who are victims of domestic violence.

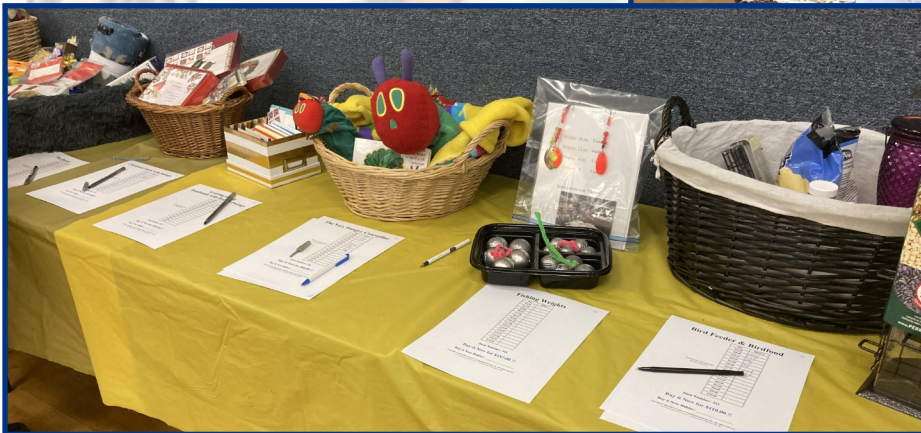
Friends of the Carpenter – A wood shop ministry for homeless and less fortunate in Vancouver which provides the opportunity to become friends around a table with Christ at the center.

Open House Ministries – A ministry that serves families who are in transition - providing housing, counseling, goal setting and hope.

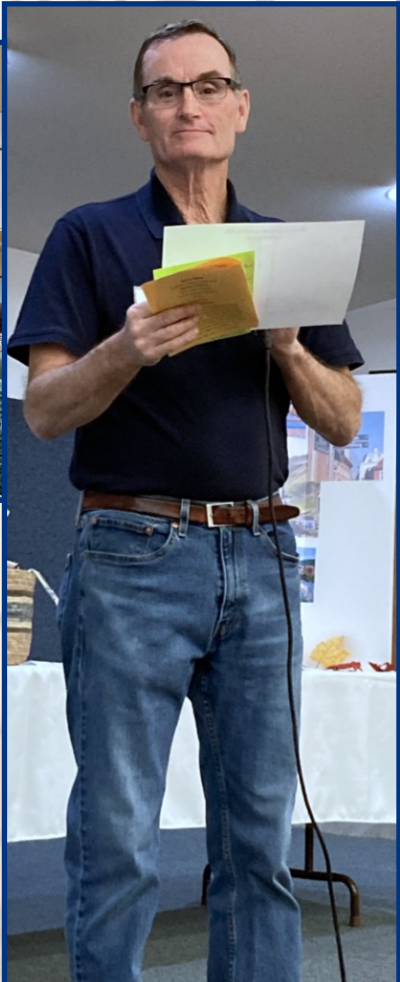
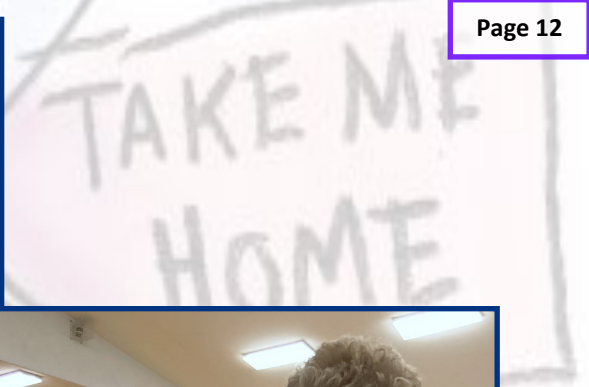
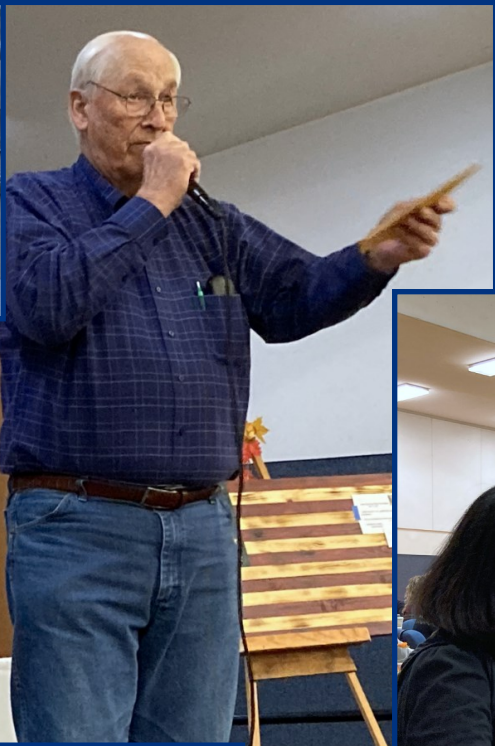
