

Grab a tag or tags from the tree in the Narthex and return the unwrapped gift to the tree by December 3rd.




Mark your calendars for Friday evening,

12/26 – 12/29 Cascade work on Offices, rest of hallways and Fellowship hall.


12/29 – 12/30 Move office furniture and boxes back, Fellowship hall items.


We will firm up schedule closer to move days, but if you are available, let us know.






