An Inspiring Presence

Have you ever tried to plan a surprise for someone, but you needed to involve about 30 people, in two different groups, who spent time weekly or daily with that someone? Well, that is what the Exultation Ringers of Salmon Creek and Bells of the Cascades did for our beloved director, Matthew Compton, at the Bells of the Cascades concert on June 3rd.

In July 2021, Josh approached Alex Guebert, a dear friend and fellow composer of Matthew's, to compose a piece for Matthew's 5+ years of directing Bells of the Cascades and the music program at Salmon Creek.

Matthew and Alex have known each other since 2018, after meeting at the National Handbell Seminar in Grand Rapids, MI. Alex is the music director at St. John's Lutheran in Orange, CA, which includes the Cathedral Bells, the advanced group at the church. He also directs the Concert Handbells at Concordia University in Irvine.

In November 2022, Josh received the piece from Alex and went to work on the bell assignments for each group and the bass bell assignments (with the help of Arthur Pascual). Josh worked with members of both groups to coordinate how and when we could surprise Matthew with the piece. Trust us, this was no easy feat!

In January, Exultation Ringers began their "secret rehearsals" under the guise of "Living in Harmony" Bible Study, while Matthew was at Bells of the Cascades rehearsals in Tualatin. They had to be sure to return things to how they found them so as not to raise suspicion. Not every ringer could attend all of these secret rehearsals, so they would be missing some parts, but with the help of an audio recording and Jerry Davis keeping time, rehearsals went well. Faye Wells was awesome at communication, both with the group and with Josh, on updates of challenges and progress of the piece. On April 29th, members of both Exultation Ringers and Bells of the Cascades were able to get together to rehearse the piece while Matthew was conducting a festival in Pennsylvania. There was never a time (until the moment in the concert) that both groups were able to fully play the piece.

This surprise did not go without its obstacles, especially the week of the concert: what tables would be used and how to get foam from the Bells of the Cascades trailer, as they would be playing on tables and foam that Salmon Creek would normally use. Not to mention, a last-minute bell handle snap, which required the use of yet another bell. Josh was able to navigate all of the challenges that were thrown at him so as not to blow our cover!

The day of the concert arrived, the extra tables were set-up out of sight until they were needed. Everything was ready for the big surprise and Matthew still had no idea of what was going to happen.

Bells of the Cascades finished their second to last piece and Matthew began to introduce the final piece but was kindly interrupted by Josh as the extra tables started to come out. It was at this point, Matthew said, that he finally knew something was going on. Josh began to introduce the surprise piece, *Inspiring Presence*. Josh talked about how the piece came about and also read many of the ringers' written responses to how Matthew has been an inspiring presence to them.

The dedication reads:

For Matthew Compton

From Exultation Ringers and Bells of the Cascades

Given in love and appreciation of Matthew's inspiring presence

Matthew was rendered speechless, a feat in itself, as it very rarely happens! He could not hold back his tears as the piece finished and the audience was on their feet. It was a successful surprise, many months in the making.

Matthew is truly an incredible, inspiring leader and is well loved by many. He has helped both Exultation Ringers and Bells of the Cascades to grow in their musical capabilities, often pushing and challenging them with great success. He is always motivating and working with us individually to have us each exceed our grasp, with understanding, kindness and no guilt or shame.

What an appropriate title for the surprise special music. We are so abundantly blessed to have him be a part of our church, touching everyone through music. In the words of Hans Christian Anderson, "Where words fail, music speaks."

Matthew inspires all members of the Exultation Ringers bell choir to reach beyond their personal expectations. Whether youth or 'older', we are privileged to call Matthew, "Friend".


A special thanks goes out to Alex Guebert for the piece, not only as a gift to Matthew, but to both ensembles as well.





"What's In a Bell?!"

If you've walked into the St. Paul room in the last week or so, you've probably noticed what looks like a factory line of handbells pulled apart into many pieces! This is part of a larger refurbishing project. The old handles on these Bells of the Cascades handbells were so difficult to read that sometimes a wrong note was played, simply because the ringer couldn't even tell which bell they were grabbing! We have also been replacing the clappers - the part of the bell that strikes the casting to actually make the sound. The set hasn't been refurbished, except maybe once in its near-35-year history, so this has been long overdue to make the instrument sound and play the best it can! Each bell has 15-18 parts, depending on the size

and range, so it takes quite a long time to work through the set to make it all sound great!




FAMILY PROMISE NEWS


