### **DO YOU KNOW?**



#### SALMON CREEK UNITED METHODIST CHURCH POLICY OF SAFETY DURING CHILDREN'S CHURCH FAMILY MINISTRY CENTER (FMC)

Salmon Creek United Methodist Church places the highest value on maintaining the safety of children and leaders during the time of Children's Church usually located in the Family Ministry Center. We strictly abide by all Safe Sanctuary guidelines as printed in the Church's Safe Sanctuary Handbook. This includes background checks and safe sanctuary training for all leaders and shepherds that work with children. Salmon Creek UMC will implement the following procedures in regards to the operation and use of the FMC during Children's Church time (Sunday morning). The intent of these procedures is to ensure that children are never left alone or vulnerable to an unauthorized person.

- The Coordinator of Family Ministries will be available in the FMC from 9:00 am to 11:30 am Sunday mornings for set-up, preparation and consultation, as needed.
- During this time, limited persons shall be present in the approved by the Coordinator of Family Ministries.
- During the time when children are present, no unauthorized persons shall be present in the FMC, unless specifically approved by the Coordinator of Family Ministries.
- 4. During those special times of communal use of the building (special breakfast or other celebration in the gym), the Coordinator of Family Ministries will be notified of the occurrence so that additional safety measures are in place. Only in these circumstances will others be allowed access to the FMC.
- During Children's Church, only SCUMC members with a background check and safe sanctuary training will be permitted to act as leaders or Shepherds.
- 6. Parents or guardians will personally present their child(ren) to the check-in table in the FMC starting at 9:45 thru 10:00 am. Parents/guardians will sign-in the child(ren) personally. The Coordinator / Shepherd will ascertain that contact information and any special instructions are on file with the Children's Church.
- 7. At 10:00 am the outside doors will be locked to prohibit any unnecessary visitors.
- At the conclusion of the church service or earlier to accommodate any special circumstances, parents/guardians will again personally present to the FMC to pick-up their child(ren). They will sign-out the child(ren) and the Coordinator / Shepherd will acknowledge the departure of the child(ren).
- If, for any special reason, a child needs to transit between the main building and the FMC during Children's Church, this child will be accompanied by a parent or guardian, or an adult member of the Family Ministries Leadership team.
- When the FMC gym is being used for another event, children will be confined to the Children's Church rooms (201, 202 or 203), except for bathroom breaks.
- 11. According to SCUMC's policy on Gender and Identity, children will be accompanied to the bathroom corresponding to their biological sex, or a unisex bathroom. The accompanying adult may only enter the bathroom along with the child if it corresponds with their biological sex, or if they are a parent or guardian.

 The Coordinator of Family Ministries and Shepherds will stay current on all safety and training procedures.

A note to all regarding the locked church doors:

I have been hearing that we've received a number of complaints about the doors of the church being locked. While I understand it is a bit inconvenient, I'm asking for your understanding. I am here at the church alone, most of the time. Yes, the day school teachers are here, but they are nowhere near me. Yes, often Matthew is here with me, but he is playing music in the sanctuary, so he can't hear what's going on in the front office, and he is not that close in range to me either. If an ill-intentioned intruder were to come in, I have no defense. I know it's sad, but it's TRUE, that this is an unsafe world now; all you have to do is read the news every day. Just because "nothing has ever happened" here at Salmon Creek in the past, that is no guarantee that something might not happen in the future. Armed gunmen have entered churches in the past and killed people, and I don't even want to bring up what can happen to a woman alone. I do not feel safe if the doors are unlocked. We get a high amount of traffic from homeless people, some of whom look pretty scary; often they are mentally unstable and/or on drugs; they are often very aggressive and will not leave when asked. I don't want to be put in that position, to feel so vulnerable, so I'm asking for your mercy in understanding that the doors need to be locked. Please consider that if you were here alone most of the time, would you feel safe? Thank you for caring about my safety.
