A time for gratitude, thankfulness, and pride for a job well done!

This spring, after much discussion, research and soul searching, it was decided that our daycare program will come to a close at the end of June. This decision was extremely difficult for all concerned, but in the end, the complexities, regulations, and liabilities surrounding the operation of a full-time daycare have grown past the capacity of our church.

Salmon Creek Christian Preschool and Daycare has provided care for children and families in our community for over 30 years. We are grateful to our staff, past and present, who have given their love and energy to the betterment of the children in their care. We are grateful to the many directors we have had over the years, and to Gayle Horwitz specifically for her current leadership.

We are also grateful for the hundreds of children and their families that have trusted our church with their most precious children over these many years.

You may still see some of our children and teachers here in July and August, as the church will be providing a Summer Gap Camp for one class of students to help our rising kindergarteners prepare for a successful move into kindergarten. This program will not be a continuation of our daycare program but rather, will be offered by the church as a separate program.

While this chapter of providing full-time daycare comes to a close, our church wishes to continue serving our community's children. Therefore, we are making plans to begin a program of part-time preschool to be offered from 8:30 -12:30, Monday – Thursday only. We believe this smaller program will be a better fit for our church at this time. More information will be shared as it becomes available.

In the meantime, please find some time to stop by and thank our teachers and staff for their faithful service to our church and to the children under their care. We plan on having a full week of appreciation treats for our staff the week of June 17-21. Also, please join us for the Salmon Creek Christian Preschool and Daycare Graduation on June 28<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm.










In an effort to make sure that we are all prepared, we plan to publish 2-3 pages from our SCUMC Emergency Action Plan booklet each month in the Circuit Rider.



### 2. BUILDING EVACUATION EMERGENCY

All staff and leaders should know the emergency evacuation routes and procedures for the building, and their designated assembly area outside the building. Memorize the exit route closest to your work or meeting area.

The designated assembly areas are: Children in dayschool – gazebo or fire pit area All others – South parking lot

Should either of these areas be deemed unsafe, a new assembly area will be selected at the time of each situation, dependent of safety and accessibility.

If a Building Evacuation is initiated, follow these Do's and Don'ts -

- Remain CALM
- Follow the instructions of the in-charge person or emergency response team
- If you occupy an enclosed office, close the door as you leave
- Do not return for coats, purses, or any other personal belongings
- Do not smoke
- Do not re-enter the building until allowed by the emergency response team



#### 3. EXPLOSION

Remain Calm - Evaluate the Situation - Take Action

Take the following actions if an explosion occurs:

- Assess the situation and inform the staff and all present as quickly and calmly as possible
- If there is any apparent danger, account for all people and evacuate in an orderly manner to the assembly area
- Call 9-1-1

### 4. EARTHQUAKE

Remain Calm- Evaluate the Situation - Take Action

If you are inside a building:

Implement DROP, COVER, AND HOLD. All people should immediately turn away from glass areas and place themselves under tables or desks. Move away from large panes of glass and out from under heavy suspended light fixtures. When the earthquake is over, evacuate the building if necessary to the assembly area. Advise people to NOT touch electrical wires and avoid using matches and lighters until the area is declared safe.



#### FIRE


Remain Calm - Evaluate the Situation - Take Action

- Activate the fire alarm and evacuate. Move people in an orderly manner to the closest exits and meet in the assembly area
- Call 9-1-1
- · Clear rooms, close doors and windows.
- Teachers should account for all children; staff/leaders account for all people In the buildings
- An All Clear signal will be given indicating when it is safe to return

### CIVIL UNREST

Civil unrest may result when people are moving about, challenging authority, committing acts of vandalism, gang activity, racial threats, etc. to the point where the safety of the staff and any other people gathered on campus is jeopardized. The goal is protecting all people from injury or harassment until proper help can be summoned, and keeping property losses and damages to a minimum.

- Call 9-1-1
- Get everyone inside, including anyone seeking shelter
- Lock the doors, close the curtains, remain together until an "All Clear" is given



## **SAVE THE DATE:**


















When we host Family Promise, it is a community effort. Three churches come together: Felida Bible, Vancouver Apostolic Lutheran and Salmon Creek United Methodist Church. During our recent host week, there were 37 volunteers (ages 10-85) in the church helping, for a total of 308 hours.

We helped two families; three adults and six kids, ages 1.5 to 16 years old. During our week, a hard working single mother was getting up at 4am. She loaded her three children (1.5 - 7), drove them to Portland for child care and then arrived at work in a warehouse by 6am. On Friday, she got the keys to her apartment, and Saturday Morning she moved into the apartment. Now, her child care will stay at the apartment. She and the kids can sleep later in the morning. With the help of Salmon Creek UMC supporting Family Promise, she was able to get the support and connections to get back on her feet!

During the week, Salmon Creek gym was full of joy, laughter and love from us to them and them to us. Homemade meals were shared, basketball was played by young and old. I learned that Deb Troyer and Sue Lenski were dusting off their basketball skills. Thank you all for helping make Family Promise possible!

August 4 – 11th October 27 – November 3rd Day school Director Gayle Horwitz was able to apply for grant money that funded the purchase of a new playground structure. She then coordinated with our local Boy Scout troop 14, which the church supports, for installation. Carson Ferrante (tall scout standing in center in the group photo) took this task on as his Eagle Scout project. He secured the necessary additional installation material of concrete and forms for the setting of the structures, posts and tools for assembly, also recruiting fellow scouts to help with construction.

On Saturday April 27th, Carson oversaw this project from start to finish, a job well done! This structure is designed for young children aged from 3 to 5 years old, and replaced a former structure that was no longer usable.
