

SC Christian Preschool and Daycare/Fellowship Hall Flooring Project

Dear Congregation:

This article is intended to let you know about the Capital replacement project underway in December. Hopefully, most of the work will be done by the time this article is released.

The Trustees, with concurrence with the Administration Board, undertook to replace the flooring in Day care rooms, hallways, offices, bathrooms, and the Fellowship hall. The new flooring is LVP – Vinyl flooring planks, easier to maintain.

This was quite an undertaking over the last 2-3 weeks of December. Trustees and volunteers had to move all the furniture, bookcases, file cabinets and boxes of Dayschool materials, first to the Fellowship hall 12/15-16, and then back to the classrooms 12/23-24, so the flooring could be replaced in the Fellowship Hall and offices 12/26-29. We also had to move all of the furniture, bookcases, file cabinets and boxed materials out of the offices and clear the Fellowship Hall on 12/23-24 as well, and then had to put them back 12/29-30. A lot of work was involved and many stepped up to volunteer in helping.

The Dayschool teachers and staff are also to be complimented. They cleaned out old files and other items no longer needed and then had to box up all the items in each classroom before the moving days. Afterwards, on January 2nd, they will unbox and make each classroom ready for the children. One final shout out for the Trustees, in addition to moving, we will be reinstalling toilets, putting trim in each room and the hallways, including the Fellowship hall, and painting the office. So, if you saw strange goings on around Christmas, it wasn't Santa Claus!

This brings me to the New Year. We have weathered many storms over the last 5 years. The Pay It Forward Campaign has had to limit replacement work and augment it with volunteer help. This project is a big hit on our PIF funds, the remaining funds will be around \$50,000, barely enough for 2-3 more HVAC units. Of the 12 originally slated to be replaced, we only have replaced 4. We

have had several leaks in the flat roof and there are no funds set aside to replace the flat roof in 2026 (10 years after the last roof sealing project). We'll make do, but please consider contributing what you can to the PIF Fund.

Our format is to spend the first part of our meeting in discussing our current assignment for the week and to follow that with a time of sharing praises and prayer needs. We keep our sharing confidential within the group. To help us with our prayer time during the week and to keep those who may have been absent up to date, we send an email to the group that captures the sharing time.

For the last two summers, we have taken a summer break and end the summer with a picnic to catch up and talk about plans for the coming year.

As a group, we look for opportunities to support church and community ministries. As a part of discovering our individual calling, many of our members have found places to serve in our church and/or community.

Service includes providing a meal each month to the homeless at St. Paul's shelter in downtown Vancouver. We also serve as one of the hosting groups for memorial services at church. In the past, we have taken on some of the setup for VBS. We have held prayer walks around our church. For the past couple of years during the Mission Dinner and Auction, we donated baskets for auction. This year we were excited to donate 5 baskets. Sending cards to encourage those who are on the Friends in Faith list is something we try to do several times a year. Basically we look for God's leading in showing us ways we can support our church or community.
