# a note from Pastor John

## A Meditation on November

On the church calendar, the month of November begins with All Saints Sunday and ends with Christ the King Sunday, with Thanksgiving just before that. It is a period of transition. Just as the trees shed their leaves and go quiet, so do we spiritually slow our souls in anticipation of the holiness of Advent, and the renewal of light and life that comes with Christmas. We remember the past by honoring those saints who have left us. We give grateful thanks to God for the bounty of the earth and the blessings of the harvest, and we bow our knees to the King of Kings. November is not a month of wild parties and shouting: it is a month of praying and thanksgiving.

During November, I will be preaching on several biblical texts regarding how various people, like Jonah, Moses, and Jephthah, kept their commitments to God in spite of difficult obstacles and the unbelief of their followers. These three sermons may leave you feeling a little unsatisfied, as if they weren't quite complete. In the November quiet we will be left to ponder this incompleteness, only to discover that none of their efforts were truly completed until the advent of Jesus Christ, which we will celebrate on Christ the King Sunday, November 20th.

Times of transition, change and quiet reflection; of slowing the spiritual self, can bring about an awakening of the spirit. Just as Elijah only heard the voice of God in the stillness and quiet, so can we, sloughing off the craziness and clamor of the outside world, find that same peace. And, like Elijah, within that peace we can renew our commitment to God. We might find ourselves with a better understanding of our place in God's world, feel strengthened and encouraged in our faith, and prepared to wait with bated breath the arrival of the Prince of Peace on Christmas.

The lengthening nights become not a time for fear, but an opportunity for contemplation and prayer. Instead of fearing the darkness, we can enjoy the stars. Instead of bemoaning the rain, we can give thanks for the life-giving waters.

*Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' (1 Kings 19)*

## Annual Charge Conference



**Jesus – Others – You**  
**Inspiring children to follow Christ**

*Guess who?\**



Children's worship through J.O.Y. Academy has been filled with adventure, fun, and faith! New children joined us this fall as we journeyed with Moses and the children of Israel on their escape from Egypt. We marveled at God's power on display through the plagues that He sent to Egypt. The children made their toy frogs hop, ran from the (toy) flies, and pelted one another with small foil balls to re-enact the hailstorm sent by God!



They learned that God's purpose was not to simply liberate the children of Israel, but to liberate them for a rich, abiding purpose – to worship God as the first and foundational step of becoming God's Chosen People who would make possible God's salvation through Jesus Christ.

The children re-enacted the Passover meal, eating saltine crackers to experience the unleavened bread God commanded the people to make. Then they, with the help of their Sunday Shepherd (Craig) made a cross on the door of the room and wrote their names on it – just as the children of Israel marked the doors of their houses so they would be saved.

Our Sunday Shepherds are important to the success of J.O.Y. Academy. They share their own faith by talking about how Jesus helped them in a real life situation. When Craig helped them put their own names on the cross, and when Greg shared how Jesus helped him be brave enough to jump out of an airplane during paratrooper training, the children were wide-eyed and silent – *this* is how they will catch the faith!

The children made their own bread for World Communion Sunday, then solemnly celebrated it with Pastor Vivian (also an ordained Methodist elder), who explained the meaning of the bread and juice and the words we use for this important Sacrament. They learned about the power of Christ's grace flowing to them through the bread they themselves made – wow!

They experienced getting all wet by accident as they heard the story of how Jesus calmed the storm. And they wrote or drew words of love and encouragement to Jesus when they once again explored the meaning of His crucifixion. They placed their colorful post it notes on the poster of the story – why don't you check it out for yourself in Room 203 of the Family Ministry Center? See for yourself how our children are filled with love for Christ.

The new Children and Family Ministry team met after worship on October 2<sup>nd</sup>. Tiffiney Nordby, our new Nursery Attendant, provided child care for the children while the team met. Team members (Phyllis Browning, Bob & E-Lois Gebhart, Aaron & Anna-Lisa Miller, Kim Winters, Vivian and Pastor John) will provide feedback to Vivian and Tiffiney, help think through how to improve our ministry to children, and help build support for the ministry within the congregation.





## 2023 Stewardship Campaign

### MESSAGE TO YOU FROM PASTOR JOHN

Sometimes, it seems like things just don't line up right. We are beginning our stewardship campaign for 2023 in the midst of what may be the worst economic downturn since 2008. With fixed incomes seeming like they're shrinking and home budgets tightening, it seems important that we be very clear on why we are asking you to continue and increase your generous giving to Salmon Creek Church. But instead of making the economic argument of rising costs and operational expenses, which you can find elsewhere in this brochure, I want to talk about the importance of the mission of this church in your family, our congregation and in the community.

Pew Research has speculated that Christianity may not be the majority religion in the United States by 2050. That could mean that your grandchildren or great-grandchildren, through the deadening forces of secular culture, may not have access to the Word of God. They may know nothing about the grace of Jesus Christ. The little town church, which has always served as a doorway into the joyful, meaningful world of God and Spirit, may simply no longer exist. I can not think of anything more dire than a world without Jesus.

Today, Salmon Creek Church stands, with other churches, as a bulwark against such a future. In this post-Covid world, we are growing in all of our ministries. We have enough reserves to invest in continued growth – continued witness in our community for Jesus Christ – for a little while, but eventually the financial realities of operating a 21<sup>st</sup> century church will assert themselves. Simply put, the church relies on the voluntary donations of congregation members for nearly all of our operational costs. Your increased pledge for 2023 isn't only for our immediate needs – it will help us continue to be a meaningful voice for Jesus Christ in years to come, help reverse the dire predictions about the future, and ensure a place of praise, prayer and worship for your grandchildren. Thank you for your generous pledge.

## FINANCE

A brief look at Salmon Creek United Methodist Church's (SCUMC) financial position shows several interesting bits of information both encouraging and concerning.

SCUMC has a good store of resources to meet our community outreach as well as to rekindle our membership. We have been blessed with several one-time sources of funds. [Bequests and Federal governmental assistance (PPPL: Payroll Protection Plan Loan) to support employee retention during the pandemic]. Also, SCUMC is fortunate to have a very desirable physical facility.

There is, however, another side to our position: we have lost a substantial portion of our operating income (**pledges**) which have **decreased 25%**. Operating expenses, other than personnel cost, have **decreased 23%**, while **personnel cost** has **increased 9%**. We are using our stored resources to subsidize our daily operation. This, for a brief time, may be acceptable; however, it cannot be sustained over a longer period.

Taking our current year trends produces another deficit of \$84 thousand for 2023. We must look to balancing operating income and operating expenses, which can be accomplished by increasing our pledge income, or by developing fund raising activities. We hope you will do your share by stepping up to the plate and increasing your pledge, or by making that new pledge.

## HOW CAN I HELP AND DONATE?

During our annual pledge drive, it is useful to review the various ways we can deliver our donations to the church. So, how do we perform this important work?

We all know the activity of "passing the plate" during our Sunday worship Offertory. When the plate comes to us, we can put in cash or a check. These are the least complex ways to donate. Checks can also be mailed to the church (For an additional 58 cents in postage!).

Another way, online giving, is popular and becoming more so. The church's online giving platform is VANCO and can be reached online directly or through the church website, Salmon-creek.church. Click on "More" and select giving. There is a link to take you to the VANCO site.

Electronic giving via VANCO is convenient and provides much-needed donation consistency for our congregation. There are several ways to utilize the VANCO site to donate to the church:

1. **Debit your bank account:** Direct debit giving is used to automatically transfer funds from your checking or savings account to the church's bank account on a one-time basis or a pre-determined schedule. You will need the routing and the account number of the account from which you want the funds transferred. This option generally has no fees associated with the contribution.

2. **Credit or Debit Card:** Credit and debit card giving also allows you to make offerings one-time or automatically on a pre-determined schedule using the card you choose. This option commonly has a 3% fee that you can choose to offset using an electronic button on the site.

One final consideration: Should you give by cash donation and do not put it in a donation envelope (found in the pews) with your name on the envelope, you will not be credited by the church. All other types of donations (online or by check) are annotated by the counters and credited to the giver and will show on giving statements.

Please consider the best and most comfortable way for you to donate. If you have questions or would like to discuss your giving method, please feel free to consult with one of the Counters, myself, Pam Roberts, Elaine Gilbert, or Jim Roberts...we're in the directory!



### YOUTH MINISTRY

Youth Group is a space where our youth can be themselves and grow their relationship with God. During youth group, we get to do a little bit of everything, prayer, games, studies and food. We meet every Sunday after service from 11am-1pm and Wednesdays from 7pm-8:30pm. We keep things uplifting, engaging and safe. All are welcome, regardless of your faith background.

### MUSIC MINISTRY

At Salmon Creek Church, we boast a thriving and fulfilling music ministry in which about 50 musicians (both from the congregation and the community!) are involved in some capacity! Gathering together in ministry for choir, praise team, or our handbell ensembles, you can hear music thread together a community of Christians to enhance the worship services. There are few things that connect people together like music does!

I know from personal experience that the community which a music ensemble provides is some of the most rewarding you can feel! We come together each week for moments of music making, fellowship, and a focus on what the music means and how it relates to scripture and our faith!

We've also done a handful of outreach events and concerts, both locally, and in northern WA! We're partnered with Family Promise, the Flames Basketball teams, and other groups to create a cohesive network of people in our community sharing our love of music with many others!

### CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Just over a year ago church leaders took a bold step by launching a new approach to children's ministry. The church was moving out of the restrictions of COVID. Leaders worked with Pastor John to identify the key ministries and traditions that form our identity and find ways to renew them in strength and purpose. Towards that end they hired Vivian (an ordained Elder) to lead Children and Family Ministries because she had a different approach that seemed promising.

When Vivian began in July, 2021, only one or two children attended on a regular basis. Our people responded as she put together a team to provide ideas and feedback as well as volunteers to be present on Sunday mornings to provide a safe environment. Together they offered a one-day Vacation Bible School in August. Six children attended, had a blast, and the ministry was launched!

The "J.O.Y. Academy" offers worship and Bible instruction every Sunday. The year saw children participate in a Christmas program, 85 people attended the Family Christmas Eve service, and a new curriculum was purchased. As more children began to attend, Vivian provided a pre-Easter day of Bible fun. By May at least five new families were attending regularly, and plans moved forward for a full week Vacation Bible School in August.

That Vacation Bible School stretched us to the max! We had 27 children attend and sure enough, more families are now a regular part of our community as a result. We now average about 6 children in J.O.Y. Academy every week. God has shown us the harvest is ripe! We at Children and Family Ministries trust that the people of the church will continue to be generous with their time and money so that we can continue to "be fruitful and multiply!"

### FAMILY PROMISE

Family Promise provides members of our church an opportunity to be the hands and feet of God right in Vancouver. About every three months, Salmon Creek UMC hosts 3-4 houseless families in the Family Ministry Center. We provide a safe place to sleep, a warm meal with GREAT hospitality, and the gym is an amazing place for a houseless child to safely run and play.

Volunteers set up the rooms for sleeping, cook the meals, do the dishes, provide hospitality, restore the rooms from sleeping areas to be ready for Children's Church on Sunday morning. There are the invisible angels who wash the sheets, pray, bring snacks for the families or donate money so we can buy milk, fruit or breakfast items.

Families love the private space they get with our rooms, while also enjoying the warm interaction they receive with volunteers.

## ARE YOU AN ACCURATE COUNTER?



### Money Counter

The church is currently recruiting a Counter to join the existing group. If you are not aware, the Counters are those wonderful people who work behind the scenes to count church donations and ensure they are credited properly to the donor and put in the correct church fund. The group currently has openings for up to three people, having suffered some recent resignations.

Counters generally work on Mondays and, as the schedule works currently, work a two-on/two-off schedule. Normally, the counting function takes about 90 minutes on any Monday morning. There is some computer work involved but it is not overly complex; lots of folks have mastered it over the years. Two people work together weekly as required by the Methodist Discipline. We do offer a comprehensive orientation.








# Blessing of the Animals

Are you looking for a way to be missional? If you are somewhat new to Salmon Creek, you might be hearing about Family Promise but aren't sure what we are talking about.

**Family Promise** is a national, nonprofit that has local affiliates. Family Promise of Clark County started around Easter of 2018. Family Promise works with families who are homeless. They coordinate with local churches for a place to sleep and get hot meals, while their staff works with the families to address the issues which led to their homelessness. Salmon Creek UMC hosts the families about four times a year. We need volunteers to cook and host meals, volunteers to spend the night (you get to sleep) and volunteers to help set up and breakdown.

Volunteers also help with laundry.

Our affiliate has an 85% success rate of assisting families in returning to homes.
