



am until 11:30 am. Please join us!!





Members are doing a great job of getting the rhubarb from God's Garden. However, it is better to pull rhubarb than to cut it off the base. To pull off rhubarb, grab the base with one hand and pull as low on the stalk as you can with the other hand. If it pulls out nicely another stalk will form very quickly, allowing for second and third pickings each year.

Looking at my gardens, the only damage I can see from the extreme heat we had for four days is that some tomato blooms got fried. If that happens, just clip off that part of the tomato plant. By the Sunday after Labor Day I begin clipping off tomato blooms anyway because any resulting tomatoes will not mature and ripen quickly enough before cold weather sets in, better to let the plant use that energy to produce bigger tomatoes which ripen before the first frost, usually late October.

In the October issue of the Circuit Rider, I will cover when and how to prepare beds for winter.


