Salmon Creek Church Faith Formation for Everybody

I am excited about a new approach to scripture, Bible Study and family faith formation that will debut on September 12th. Some of it will be online, some in-person, but no matter what the delivery method, everyone at church will have the opportunity to engage with the same topics across generations. The hope is to not only energize our faith formation practices individually, but to generate some interesting dinner table or living room conversations about our faith.

Here's how it will work: I have set out "themes," including scriptures and discussion questions, for every Sunday this fall. These themes and scriptures will be sent to our Children's ministry, our Youth ministry, and leaders of small groups to incorporate in an age appropriate way into their lessons. In other words, everyone across generations will have the opportunity to engage on the same topics.

These "themes" will also be posted to a new website: www.salmoncreekchurch.online, along with links to more resources, that day's sermon recording, and a forum for community discussions about that topic. Finally, on Sunday evenings at 6:30pm, I will host a Zoom meeting called "Afterwords," where we can discuss the readings and the sermon, and their applicability to daily life.

Small groups, Children's ministry and Youth Ministry can continue with their own plans for this fall, while still having an opportunity to engage in a church-wide discussion about the Bible, God and Jesus.

The "Online Faith Formation" website and the first Zoom call will premiere on Sunday, September 12, and the children's and youth programs the following Sunday, September 19. Look for notices in your email inbox in early September for more details on how to participate with Faith Formation for Everybody. We keep saying we need to be on the same sheet of music, so here's our chance!

CHILDREN'S CHURCH – As we make a new beginning with our Children's Ministry we are going in a new / old direction – a worship service just for children in elementary school. All the essential elements of adult worship will be there – Scripture, prayer, ritual, offering, and sermon – but done in a way that's engaging and meaningful for children. All these activities – plus our Nursery Care - will take place in rooms 201, 202, and 203 in the Family Ministry Center (FMC). Room 202 will once again become our Nursery for children age 0-4 (see article about Nursery below).

Beginning September 19th, when families come to church the parents will check their children into Children's Church at a kiosk we will set up in the Welcome Booth located in the main entryway. Pastor Vivian and volunteer Shepherds will escort the children to room 201 in the FMC which is being transformed into a Children's Sanctuary (those serving as acolytes for the adult worship will join us once they have completed lighting the candles in the Main Sanctuary).

The children will begin worship just as adults do – with music as they bring the Light of Christ to the altar. But their music will be more like what we enjoy during Vacation Bible School – music designed to inspire and uplift children.

Their worship will include Scripture and prayer, with one Scripture highlighted each month. On September 19th the Salmon Creek Church Mission Committee will tell the children about some of the mission projects supported by our church. The children themselves will choose which mission their offerings will support through the end of 2021. (And don't worry – if a child forgot their offering we will have a bucket of coins from which they can take their offering – no child will ever be left out).

After music, Scripture, offering, and prayer the children will go to Room 203 where they will do the "sermon" part of worship, exploring more deeply what the Holy Spirit is saying about the theme for the week. Sometimes they'll act out a Bible story, sometimes they'll find God through science; sometimes they'll explore through arts and crafts or games – who knows? They might even find God through cooking! The experience will vary so our children, who all have different interests and abilities, will all have a chance to be inspired and to help inspire others.

When our time for exploring is done we'll return to our worship space to bring all the experiences of the morning and learn how to lay them before God as we pray for one another. Then we'll close our time together by blessing and thanking each and every child and giving them a cookie (or other treat).

Beginning in September everyone in our church will be exploring the same themes and Scriptures. Pastor John will have a theme for each month – the theme for September is Creation. Pastor John will offer a family devotional/study guide for each theme so families can explore the theme at home. Even adults with no children at home can use the study guide and be available to our children as mentors and encouragers.

You will still see children in church - every time there are 5 Sundays in a month, our children and youth will lead worship in the Main Sanctuary. And the first time that happens will be on October 31^{st} – which is both Halloween and Reformation Sunday! I can hardly wait to see what they come up with as our worship theme!

The children will focus on just one or two Scripture passages so they become meaningful and memorized. After all, how often has the 23rd Psalm come to your mind throughout the years when you needed to feel reassured of God's loving presence? This is how our children will soak in the goodness of God – one passage at a time.

We recognize that this is a big change for our church. The adults will miss having a Children's Moment in worship, something we all enjoy. But we know this new approach will work because it's the same approach we did when Kathy Hardy led our Sunday School. This approach was meaningful to the families who experienced it then so we trust it will be meaningful to families now.

Nursery changes – Beginning Sunday, September 12th, our nursery care will once again take place in Room 202 in the Family Ministry Center. Pastor Vivian will lead the children and Zach Scott will continue as our Nursery Care Aide. With all children's activities located in the FMC, one additional adult will satisfy our Safe Sanctuary protocol that ensures our children are managed appropriately. We need one volunteer Shepherd each week to make this happen – PLEASE SIGN UP TO BE A SHEPHERD on the list at the Welcome Center, or email Pastor Vivian at vivian.hiestand@salmoncreek.church.



3 on 3 B-Ball Tournament

3 on 3 Basketball Tourney at Salmon Creek Church August 1st & 2nd

Brandon Richardson, head of the Flames Basketball Organization, asked to hold a 3 on 3 tournament at our church. Brandon and his coaches hold year around training for kids 7-8 to 18 years old. They have been using our gym for several years, especially the last year after activities were allowed indoors again following Covid. They attract kids from all over Clark county and are part of an AAU style organization within the NW. Before Covid, the Flames used several facilities around Vancouver for their training program and participated in tourneys and events around the greater Clark county area and beyond.

This tournament had 50 teams signed up and with coaches, referees, and families - over 1000 attended the two-day event. Coaches and paid referees provided control over the event. No incidences were reported to me. The parking lot was filled and so was the field next to it. The weather was great. They had 4 courts set-up in the back parking lot and the gym provided 2 more courts. Each team was allowed 5 players playing in double elimination games. It was good to see how well some of the younger kids played, and how competitive all were.

Winners bracket was on Sunday, with several age groups competing for trophies. Several kids from our church participated and it was good to see them and their parents. The Bell Choir did pizza and drinks and made \$1000. Kona Shaved Ice van was there and donated over \$350. As Brandon said, this was one of the first large events since Covid and the community needed this. Please enjoy the photos of the event!

There was no better example of this than HoopFever, our 3on3 event in August. We served over 2000 people that weekend. We were the first 3on3 in Southwest WA, in Clark County, since the pandemic and we brought a feeling of normalcy to a dark time.

With God, anything is possible, and I truly believe that message has shined through this last year. As I mentioned to you prior to the event, we were running a raffle to benefit fallen Clark County Sheriff's Sergeant Jeremy Brown. He was a personal friend and was gunned down in a way that truly impacted our community. His death made national news. During the event, we raised monies that have been deposited into his family's account for their personal use as they navigate his loss. Each event we run, we help a family or a cause.

Several members of District 6 of Clark County Fire Department stopped by to wish Alvera the best on her 100th!!


Alvera's husband, Glen, was a retired Clark County Fire Chief.


