Grace and peace to you, friends and family of Salmon Creek United Methodist Church!

As I write to you today, we are fully immersed in purple, and nearing the end of our sermon series, "Do Unto Others". It is my prayer that the lessons we have shared will continue to guide our life together and with those in our community well past November 5th as we strive to treat one another with kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love.

During the month of November, we will be asking all of our church family to consider prayerfully how God might be calling you to support our congregation in the coming year of 2025. When individuals join the church as members they respond, "I will" to the question, "Will you faithfully participate in the ministries of Salmon Creek United Methodist Church by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness." We believe that faithfully participating with our gifts includes giving back to God a portion of the financial gifts we have been given and recognize financial stewardship to be an important spiritual practice.

If you have been faithfully participating in the ministries of Salmon Creek UMC with your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness, I want to thank you! We are the Body of Christ together and are best able to share the love of Christ with one another and with our community when all of us are participating fully in the work Christ calls us to do! If you have been giving financially to support the ministries of Salmon Creek UMC, I want to thank you for your support and gifts that have made it possible for us to share the love of Christ in so many ways! We could not do the ministry God calls us to every day without your financial gifts!

As we mature in our faith, our practices should grow as well, including our practice of financial giving. If you are not yet in the practice of giving weekly or monthly, it is important to prayerfully begin somewhere. Make it a disciplined practice that you commit to and grow in that practice yearly. If you already give regularly, the goal, as in all of our

faith practices, is to grow each year as we are able. As Christians, our goal to strive for is at least the biblical tithe of 10% of our income returning to support the work of God.

Our Stewardship Campaign for 2025 is What Gift Can We Bring, inspired by Hymn 87 in our UM Hymnal.

- What gift can we bring, what present, what token? What words can convey it, the joy of this day?
- When grateful we come, remembering, rejoicing, what song can we offer in honor and praise?
- Give thanks for the past, for those who had vision, who planted and watered so dreams could come true.
- Give thanks for the now, for study, for worship, for mission that bids us turn prayer into deed.
- Give thanks for tomorrow, full of surprises, for knowing whatever tomorrow may bring,
- the Word is our promise always, forever, we rest in God's keeping and live in God's love.
- This gift we now bring, this present, this token, these words can convey it, the joy of this day!
- When grateful we come, remembering, rejoicing, this song we now offer in honor and praise!

We will "give thanks for the past" Sunday, November 3, as we celebrate All Saints Sunday, giving thanks to God for the lives of our members who have died in the past year, and for the legacy of all the saints who have invested in our lives and in Salmon Creek UMC to bring us to where we are today.

November 10 we will "give thanks for the now" as we celebrate the study, worship, and mission that we are engaged in today as a congregation. Also, as a way to celebrate Veterans Day, we will recognize and give thanks for those connected to our congregation who are currently serving in the military, as well as those who have previously served.

As we wrap-up our campaign on November 17, we will "give thanks for tomorrow" by looking ahead to the future and considering how we can plant and water now to empower a fruitful harvest for those who will follow us. We will have an opportunity during worship for those present to offer their pledge cards to God.

If you are unable to be with us for worship on November 17, pledge cards can also be mailed to the church, dropped off in the office, or placed in the offering on another Sunday in worship. I thank you for your faithfulness and pray you will be able to join us!

Fall is also Charge Conference season! So, we have begun working on our reports to share with our district superintendent about the ministry we have done over the past year and our plans for 2025. An important piece of work to prepare for Charge Conference is the assembling of our 2025 Lay Leadership Roster. This is a great time to prayerfully consider if God may be calling you to serve in one of our administrative or ministry areas. September, 2024 Financial Update

Following is the financial report for the Church as of September 30, 2024.

September's results were strong, with pledges at 112 % of Budget. YTD pledge income was 137 % of Budget, and with expenses running very close to Plan, our profit for the month was 7,000 and YTD profits approximated 87,000 through September 30, 2024.

As mentioned previously, we have had several non-recurring items that impacted our results this year, and a quick recap is shown below:

YTD Profit per above	86,263
Income from a member's estate	(50,000)
Investment income	(28,796)
Furnace replacement program	24,000
YTD Profit after "one time financial events"	31,467

So on a YTD basis, our results still remain very strong even after taking into effect these unusual non-recurring items.

We continue to want to thank the congregation for your continued gifts of time, talent and monies that are necessary to support the mission of our Church, which is "We are a welcoming United Methodist Church congregation that worships together as disciples of Jesus Christ, uniting in fellowship, missions and service."

ANNUAL MISSIONS BASKET AUCTION – Saturday, November 16

What is a basket?

Baskets are collections of items combined together with a theme...baking, pampering, movie night, etc. Items may be homemade, purchased, donations by businesses – or a combination of all three!

We encourage individuals, families and groups in the church to put together baskets to be auctioned off at our basket auction! There will be a silent auction and an oral auction of baskets by auctioneer Roger Brindle.

Where do auction funds go?

- Share Inc. Non-profit organization that provides food and shelter to the homeless and low income in Clark county.
 School food backpacks and summer lunches are provided by Share.
- Seafarers Center Welcomes and provides services for international mariners while docked at the Port of Vancouver and Portland.
- Safe Choice Shelter and services for women who are victims of domestic violence.
- Friends of the Carpenter A ministry that serves the homeless and less fortunate in Vancouver. Projects of 'wood'
 allows those participating to become friends around a table with Christ at the center.
- Open House Ministries A ministry that serves families who are in transition. A way for them to 'get back on their feet'. Providing them housing, counseling, goal setting and hope.
- Battle Ground HealthCare Salmon Creek is looking to provide support for this non-profit, faith-based clinic that
 provides health care to low income adults in Clark County.

How do I donate a basket?

You may also submit the information prior to bringing in your basket – be sure you also identify the basket at the time it is brought to the church. 



Now water will run freely under the shed.

The Scouts replaced the sagging doors with new ones, scrubbed the roof of moss and debris, scrubbed the siding, painted everything, and built a new ramp/

entrance to the shed. The shed is more versatile than the previous one with the ramp replacing steps into the shed. We thank Jonathan, Troop 14 Bob Scouts and Chris Wood for giving us a great new shed and Richard and Larry for making sure water will flow under the shed rather than up against it.
