

#### November, 2024 Financial Update

Following is the financial report for the Church as of November 30, 2024.

November giving was below budget again for the month at 71% of plan. Fortunately, investment income of ~ \$ 9,000 brought total income close to plan. Expenses were ~ (\$ 16,000) unfavorable to budget, due to the last payment made on the furnace replacement project for the Family Ministries Center, which amounted to ~ \$ 18,000. This resulted in a loss of ~ (\$ 16,000) for the month of November. The Administrative Board voted to use funds from our General Fund for the furnace replacement project, rather than use our "Pay it Forward" B Account, which has basically run its course. Even though November's results were negative, we are still very strong on a Year-to-Date basis, with Pledge Income at 124 % of Plan, and YTD Expenses favorable to Plan (after adjusting for the ~ \$ 42,000 furnace replacement payments made this year).

On a YTD Basis, we have realized a net profit of \$ 52,000, which is \$ 97,000 Favorable to Plan. Praise be to God!

#### 2025 Budget Update

We still have many outstanding pledges for 2025, and without them, we will have a difficult time balancing our budget for 2025. We do appreciate the pledges that have been made, and we thank you very much for your contributions of time, talents, and stewardship. If you have not turned in your 2025 pledge, there is still time! Thank you.

## Coffee Maker

Recently our coffee maker in the Fellowship Hall kitchen was updated. It is a little different than our previous one. While it seems fairly straight forward, we have had two "coffee floods" in the first week.

First, you will notice there is no 'green brew light'.

- 1. To make the coffee, turn the machine on.
- 2. Put coffee and filter in the basket.
- 3. Push the brew button ONLY ONCE! Wait patiently. There will be a soft, single beep. If the freezer or fridge is running, or people are talking, you might not hear the beep. Because there is no green button to tell you it is ready, there could be a long pause (a few minutes) while the water is heating.

When the pot is finished brewing, there will be three soft beeps. Again, if there is noise you might not hear the beeps.

If you push the brew button twice, it is signaling the machine to double the amount of water. That results in an overflow of coffee!

The repair man told me he has seen notes on the coffee maker that say, "Push brew once for coffee, twice for a flood!"





Many of you do not know that this year, we hosted the Children's Sharing Project of Clark County. They used our gym for 5 days from December 5th through 11th. This was quite a spectacular undertaking and we are so delighted to have been able to provide the space for

this group! Event Coordinator, Cindy Gosch sent us this report:

This year we were able to fill 747 wish cards - each child is able to give two wishes and we try to fill both, if we can.

We were able to hand out 409 wish cards before our big shop; these cards are shopped for by local businesses in the community but mostly lots and lots of Clark County employees. These gifts were brought to the church between 12/8 and 12/10 for sorting and distributing.

The remaining 338 cards we shopped for at Fred Meyer on 12/7. We brought all of those gifts to the gym and our volunteers spent the next three days sorting, grouping, and getting them ready for agency pickup. These are the agencies we are connected with:

Clark County Public Health
Lifeline Connections
Neighbors Helping Neighbors
Parent Child Assistance Program
Peace Northwest
Recovery Cafe Clark County
Solutions Northwest
Vancouver Housing Authority
Veterans Assistance

Each family that receives assistance is registered with one of these agencies. I've attached a sample of what the cards look like... We buy for children from newborn to 18, and we have one agency that provides for special needs beyond childhood. 66-year-old Kathleen asked for and received a Heated Lap Blanket and an Acrylic Paint set. :)

We do not actually wrap any of the gifts and that is to give the agency the opportunity to verify and cross-reference the gifts against their lists. The agencies do, though, provide wrapping paper for the families and that allows the family to feel like they are participating in the process.

#### Children's Sharing Project

At the request of a former Clark County Administrator, Clark County Children's Sharing Project (CSP) began its work as the Children's Sharing Tree Project in 1985. That year, 36 children living at the Royal Arms Emergency Shelter near the courthouse and other low-income children in our community opened new holiday gifts!

Clark County employees, local businesses, other non-profit organizations, and volunteers make

CSP's almost 40-year mission of ensuring families in need have holiday gifts for their children a reality.

Its annual campaign brightens more than 1,200 children's and their families' holidays by providing each child two new gifts. Each gift is specifically requested by each child. CSP also supports Clark County's community with special needs requests that its Board of Directors receives throughout the year.

In 2007, Fred Meyer established an on-going partnership with CSP. Fred Meyer donates thousands of dollars annually, as well as price reductions when volunteers shop for gifts in early December. Many other local businesses, organizations and people provide cash and in-kind donations annually.

#### This is how CSP provides holiday gifts to more than 1,200 low-income children each year

- Local agencies collect children's names and gift wishes from low-income families they assist. The Salvation Army runs the information through a clearinghouse to ensure each child's information is provided to only one gift-giving charity. CSP then "adopts" hundreds of these children.
- "Wish cards" are made for each child and distributed to Clark County employees who serve as volunteer coordinators. The coordinators distribute cards to county employees and others, who then purchase and donate the requested gifts.
- Volunteer shoppers fill the requests for children whose cards are not selected at an early December shopping event at Grand Central Fred Meyer. CSP uses cash donations and funds raised at its fundraisers to buy the gifts.

CSP's primary fundraiser is an annual silent auction. Auction items are donated by local businesses, fellow nonprofits, Clark County employees and generous others. 
