


Lila DeBolt and Pastor Kim attended annual conference and Elaine Gilbert attended virtually! The conference was held from June 26th through June 28th.

We have finished the first six months of the year, as we head into the "dog days of summer". Pledge income was unfavorable to plan in June at 92 % of Plan, but on a YTD basis, we are still at 115 % of Plan. You will shortly be receiving a report on your pledged giving through the first half of the year. Your commitment to our Church and our Community remains steadfast. Expenses in total remain very close to Plan; 1,373 favorable for June and 1,222 favorable on a YTD basis.

From a profitability perspective, we realized a profit of ~ 7,500 in June and on a YTD Basis, we have realized a net profit of ~ \$ 30,000, which is ~ \$ 44,000 Favorable to Plan. The profitability has been significantly supported by a gain in some of our investments in the Mutual Funds Market, with a YTD profit in investment income of ~ 20,000. Praise be to God!

With respect to our Preschool program, we still continue to operate at a loss as we strive to add more students. YTD Losses approximated (10,100) through June. Ad Board voted to extend our Preschool program through next June, but we will continue to evaluate the economic feasibility of the program in balance with our commitment to the surrounding community.

Thank you to everyone for your contributions of time, talent and financial resources as we continue to worship together as disciples of Jesus Christ, united in missions, fellowship and service.

In August we will be collecting school supplies for Gaiser Middle School. Gaiser is a diverse middle school located just south of us on 99th St. Over the years, the boundaries for Gaiser have changed and now many of Gaiser's students live in apartment complexes near the mall. Over 60% of Gaiser's students qualify for free and reduced lunch, over 50% of the students speak a language other than English at

home. About 30% of students at Gaiser speak Spanish, there are also large groups of students who speak Russian and/or Ukrainian, Arabic & Persian speakers and a number of students from South Pacific Islands.

The primary supplies needed to support the students at Gaiser are:

Composition books (college rule is preferred)
Pencils – lots of pencils
Tape and/or glue sticks
Highlighters (5 color pack)
Markers/colored pencils
Metal or Plastic #5PP nonBPA water bottles
Individually wrapped snacks
Adult size backpacks



All supplies will be gathered and prayed over on August 24, then taken to Gaiser for the first day of school – August 27th.

On August 24th, we will also be having a benefit breakfast for the Foundation for Vancouver Public Schools, a non profit organization that supports students and schools in Vancouver.



About the Project

This is a new construction project of 32 unattached, single-family cottage homes built on 1.82 acres. All homes are 2BR 1.5BA homes with two stories. Two different layouts will be built, one of which is 1063 sq ft and the other 1167 sq ft.


Each home will be sold to income-qualified homebuyers who fall under 80% of the Area Median Income through affordable mortgages by 3rd party partner lenders.

All 32 cottage units will be permanently affordable and utilize a land-trust model with shared equity, allowing homeowners to gain equity while ensuring this property remains a permanently affordable homeownership community asset.


Total Cost of Project: \$11,209,485



Project Current Timeline*






