August, 2024 Financial Update

Following is the financial report for the Church as of August 31, 2024.

While the overall results YTD are still strong, the "dog days of summer" definitely took a "bite" out of our favorable results. In addition to pledges being only 49 % of Plan in August, the operating results were impacted by an Administrative Board decision to utilize Church funds (24,000) to assist our Paying It Forward monies to fund the replacement of our failing furnaces in the Family Ministry Center. This was a down payment of approximately 50 % so there will be another significant expenditure later this year.

A summary of some of the significant Favorable / (Unfavorable) variances from Budget for the month were as follows:

Klineline Pond Master Plan Update





In 2023, Clark County Parks was awarded a grant from the Washington State legislature to improve the Klineline Pond section of Salmon Creek Regional Park. The Department of Commerce recognized Klineline Pond as a significant community resource due for major improvements.

Staff and consultants have identified and addressed areas of concern and have developed a master plan. Improvements include addressing bridge and parking lot accessibility, along with playground and splash pad replacement.


