## **A remarkable message - Uzzah and the Ark of the Covenant**

### **The message from Uzzah – for you and me!**

This is the message from Uzzah that Yedidah received from YHVH on the first day of Ha Matzot (Unleavened Bread), April 21, 2014.

Independently of this, my son Derek also received this message during the same week, and he will post

what YHVH showed him. The message from Uzzah has become of utmost importance for every person on planet Earth. If we do not understand this lesson correctly, we will fail all our tests. YHVH, the Elohim of Israel, killed Uzzah and had the account recorded in Scripture so that this message would be proclaimed among His people and among all the people of this world at this time, before the Messiah Yahusha (the Messiah of Israel) returns to establish His Kingdom on Earth. We are in the time of "Jacob's trouble"—the time that precedes the outbreak of the great tribulation for the whole world and the time before the "great and terrible day of YHVH." (**Jeremiah 30:7**) The story of Uzzah begins in **2 Samuel 6:1-7**. His story

never ended—it is even more relevant to us than to anyone else in the history of planet Earth! Please read the Bible references as you read. (Unless otherwise noted, the scriptures are taken from the New Evangelical Translation.)

YHVH gave very specific instructions on how the Ark of the Covenant should be made and carried (**Exodus 25:10-22**). It was to have two poles inserted through four rings at the corners so that the ark could be lifted and carried on the shoulders of specially appointed Levites who were descendants of Aaron. But the Levites, like all of Jacob's family, rebelled against doing things Yahuah's way.

Excerpts from **Deuteronomy 31:24-29**: "When Moses had finished writing down all the words of the law, he commanded the Levites who carried the ark of the covenant with Yahuah: 'Place this book of the law beside the ark of the covenant that Yahuah has made with us.

so it may be a witness against you Israelites. For I know your disobedience and stubbornness very well... For I know that after my death you will fall into ruin and stray from the path, I have laid out for you. At the end of days, misfortune will befall you because you will do evil before Yahuah and anger Him with your deeds."

We are "at the end of days." And all His people provoke Him daily with their rebellion—by choosing to do things their own way instead of obeying Him!

Excerpts from **Exodus 40**: "Moses did everything just as Yahuah had commanded him. ...Then he placed the tablets with the covenant book in the ark. He inserted the carrying poles into the rings and placed the cover plate on top. Then he brought the ark into the dwelling place, hung up the veil, and thus concealed the ark of the covenant...as Yahuah had commanded him. ...Thus Moses completed all the work. Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of Yahuah filled the entire dwelling. Because the cloud had settled on the tent and the glory of Yahudah filled everything, Moses could not enter it..."

The "tablets with the covenant book" were the two tablets with the Ten Commandments, written with "the finger of Elohim." The Ten

Commandments are the summary of the covenant that YHVH made with His people to set them apart from all other peoples of the earth. It is also a marriage covenant between Yahusha and His bride—this is how He wants His bride to be. [See also: "The Ancient Hebrew Wedding Ceremony" for details on why these "Ten Commandments" of His Torah (instructions and teachings) are so important for us today. They are witnesses between Father YHVH and His children, and exclusively between Yahusha and His bride.

**Isaiah 8:20:** "Return to the instruction of Yahuah and to His warnings! Whoever does not think this way will have no dawn." - They have no "*boker*" - the light of the sun that breaks forth anew at every dawn.

After King David's death, the Ark of the Covenant was brought up from the City of David to the temple that Solomon had built and placed in the Holy of Holies.

**From 1 Kings 8:3-11:** "...When the priests came out of the sanctuary, the cloud filled the entire house of Yahuah. The priests could not continue their service because the glory of Yahuah filled the house of Yahuah."

**Psalms 99:1-2:** "Yahuah is king—the nations tremble; he is enthroned above the cherubim—the earth shakes. Yahuah is great in Zion—exalted above all the nations."

The Ark of the Covenant itself was His earthly throne. He dwelt between the two golden cherubim that overshadowed the Ark on the lid. His earthly presence was connected to His throne in heaven. That is why it is most holy. The lid of the ark, called the "mercy seat" or "propitiatory," is symbolic of the redemption of Yahusha, the "Lamb of Elohim."

YHVH chose a family from the Levites of the house of Aaron to carry it with the carrying poles. The poles were not to be removed from the rings of the ark. Some researchers have speculated that the Ark of the Covenant was an electrical device and that anyone who touched it was killed by an electric shock. But His sovereignty was and is certainly connected with it.

He defends what and whom He has set apart (sanctified) for Himself. "Touch not mine anointed, do no evil to my prophets" (**Psalm 105:15**) [see also: "A Racial View of Set-Apartness"].

Most people who have grown up in Western culture have little to no understanding of His requirements for holiness (being set apart) and uncorrupted purity of those He calls His own.

Woe to those who presumptuously or violently touch what He has set apart/sanctified for Himself!

In **Ezekiel 8-11**, we see how Israel's sin became so terrible, reflected in the pagan habits of the priesthood, that while they worshipped the rising sun, He left the Ark of the Covenant and stood opposite them on the Mount of Olives, and then disappeared. They did not know that He had disappeared. They were even so presumptuous as to try to include Him in their sun god worship. While they looked through palm branches to shield their eyes from the rising sun at the spring equinox, they held "the branch in front of His nose." Today, this is reflected in Christianity, Judaism, and the Messianic mix: the attempt to include Him in what humans have created. Thinking that He approves of all the different dogmas, teachings, and theologies that man devises and uses to control His people, and to take away His people's privilege of knowing Him and being taught by Him!

Maintaining His presence among His people was the most important thing on earth—for Him and for us. He entrusted this responsibility to His Levitical priesthood. But people did not appreciate His presence, and so He had to leave.

Now He is withdrawing from the earth again to allow man to obey Satan's one law: "Do what you want."

As in the days of Ezekiel, before Nebuchadnezzar destroyed the temple, His people, His "royal priesthood," still treat His presence so casually and cheaply/worthlessly that He must hand His people over to those who serve Lucifer/Satan. This includes almost all so-called "believers," especially those in the wealthy free world. Those who are under terrible persecution for their faith cherish His presence! And also a few in the Western world.

His presence will remain in the born-again spirit of these "few." (**Matthew 7:13-14**)

As in the days before the judgment came through the king of Babylon, when He could no longer remain with those who had no reverence for Him, for His glory and love, we too have a choice today in the time of the final judgment—to worship Him with the utmost fear and respect, or to live our lives as the world lives, not appreciating His presence. Just know this—He cannot and will not dwell with those who reject His authority to rule, who go their own way in rebellious self-will.

The ark was called the "Ark of the Covenant" because it contained the fundamental Torah written by Moses, which is the covenant between His people and Himself.

The high priest Eli in Shiloh had two sons who were rebellious and disobedient to Yahuah. He did not punish them. One day, they took the Ark of the Covenant with them before the army of Israel into battle against the Philistines—as an amulet, a "good luck charm." The Philistines killed Eli's sons and the Israelites were defeated. The Philistines took the Ark of the Covenant with them. They placed it in the temple of their god Dagon.

Dagon was the fish god – half fish and half man (Hebrew *dag* = fish). Look at the large, wide hat worn by the Pope and his cardinals. With its large open mouth, it represents the fish god Dagon. When I was a child attending public school in California, we ate fish every Friday because all Roman Catholics had to eat fish on Fridays. Friday is the day the Philistines worshiped Dagon. In the early days of pagan Christianity, "Iesous" (aka Jesus) was referred to as "our fish" by the Church Fathers. The letters of the Greek "Ichtus," the "fish symbol" of the Greek Gnostic Christianity, stand for "Iesous Christ God's Son Savior." Today, the fish symbol is

supposed to represent Christianity, but this is a throwback to Dagon, as is the Pope's fish ring. YHVH's presence did all kinds of things to Dagon, e.g., He knocked over his statue and smashed it. YHVH also struck the Philistines with terrible diseases that caused tumors, and on top of that, He

filled the land with rats. The Philistines were not stupid—they knew that YHVH did this. They were afraid of YHVH and the Ark of the Covenant, so they built a new cart and lifted the Ark onto it by its carrying poles. Then they thought about how they could get rid of it without offending YHVH (**1 Samuel 5 and 6**).

The Ark of the Covenant had been with them for seven months. On the one hand, it's quite a funny story – they made figures of pure gold of the rats and boils that had afflicted the people. They put these figures in a small box and placed them next to the Ark of the Covenant on the cart they had built. The cart was to be pulled by two suckling cows that had never been yoked together before. They took the ark to Beth Shemesh, where another serious incident occurred involving an eager Benjaminite.

Finally, the Ark of the Covenant was taken to a man named Abinadab, where it remained for 23 years until King David went to fetch it. It is possible that the Ark of the Covenant remained on the new cart the entire time, and the poles remained in their golden rings.

It was on the way from Abinadab's house to David's city, the true Mount Zion south of the Temple Mount, that the story with Uzzah took place. The name "Uzzah" means "strong." It also means "goat," as in a strong goat.

From researching the Scriptures about Abinadab and from Bible commentaries, it appears that Abinadab was a brother of King David, which makes Uzzah his nephew! Therefore, it is understandable that David was so horrified and angry when Uzzah was killed while trying to support the falling ark. Uzzah was probably a young man who sincerely wanted to do the right thing. So why did YHVH kill him?

### **This is where the message for us today begins!**

Apparently, they were transporting the Ark of the Covenant on a cart, even though YHVH had expressly said that the Levites should carry it with poles. Man thinks in his own way, contrary to what YHVH says—that is the basis and core of all religion!

Man, who seized the law and Torah of YHVH to rule His creation, was the basis for sin in the Garden of Eden (Torah = instructions and teachings for right rule in His kingdom). Man, who exalts himself above YHVH as god unto himself. The religions of Christianity, Judaism, and the Messianic mix are all guilty of this sin. They use part of Scripture to support their thinking, but reject His Word as a whole, as He gave it to us. The modern nation of Israel would not be in the mess it is in now if it had simply obeyed

**Deuteronomy 7** back then. But human thinking kept them from obeying YHVH! There is always some kind of destruction and death involved in disobedience, rebellion, revolt, and indifference to His Word!

All religions are a challenge to YHVH! All religions are ruled by humans and is an open portal for Lucifer/Satan on this earth to work through the minds of humans for his own benefit. I do not make this statement lightly. I say it as "thus saith YHVH!"

Not only does He have nothing to do with any religion, He says He will destroy them all—because they are a violation of the first commandment—to have gods before Him/His face!

Human intellect, self-will, hidden plans, and secret ambitions, which he uses to manipulate people into doing what he wants, are gods in the sight of YHVH!

[See also: "Religion,"/September 28, 2009] The attitude is: It doesn't matter what YHVH says—what matters is what we think is right and what we want to think and do. It doesn't matter what YHVH says, we listen to our pastor, priest, or rabbi and do what they say. That is the nature of a goat!

In **Deuteronomy 4:1-2**, Moses says: "Now listen, Israel! I will teach you the rules and laws you must follow. Obey them, and you will live and take possession of the land that Yahuah, the God of your ancestors, is giving you! **You shall not add to the word that I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of Yahuah your God which I command you.**" Other references say the same thing: **Deuteronomy 12:32; Joshua 1:7; Proverbs 30:6; Matthew 15:8-9; and Revelation 22:18.**

What does the incident with Uzzah say about Yahuah's seriousness about His Word? What does it say about Him as a person?

We must praise Him for being who He is! If He does not stand up for His own Word and defend it, then we cannot trust His promises to us, can we? If He has no boundaries, no "red lines" that, if crossed, result in punishment, then what boundaries do we have? If He is not credible in standing up for Himself, how can we expect Him to do so for us? He sets boundaries to protect us.

Western culture designed a god that suited its carnal thinking—a god similar in nature to many Greek and Roman gods in the pantheon, who set no limits but left it up to each individual to decide what they wanted to do or not do. The gods of Western religions tolerate sin in the name of "grace" and rely on the doctrine of unconditional love, which is nowhere to be found in Scripture—a God who allows us to mix with what the world calls good without any responsibility to do what the Spirit-author of the Hebrew Scriptures requires of us. The Scriptures stand for a covenant. Either we are part of the covenant or we are not. A covenant is only as good as the trustworthiness of both parties to keep their part of the covenant. Western culture has almost no concept of the responsibility of a covenant of any kind. That is why America's divorce rate today is 60%. Marriage is the most binding covenant on earth—a blood covenant. Yahusha's death and resurrection are all about a marriage covenant. Christianity rejects His covenant—the Torah—and calls it "obsolete" and, with derogatory mockery, "the laws of the Jews," describing it as a bondage that no one can bear. Does this reflect YHVH, the Elohim of Israel? NO! Does this thinking reflect the true Jewish Messiah Yahusha of Israel? NO! The Torah is an eternal covenant between Elohim and His people.

**Psalms 2:1-5:** "Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against His Anointed, saying, 'Let us burst their bonds

apart and cast away their cords from us." But He who sits in the heavens laughs; the Lord scoffs at them. Then He rebukes them in His wrath and terrifies them with His fierce anger: ..."

Today, there is a worldwide effort among the rulers of this world to cast Him out, to make His name illegal, to portray His Word as a lie, and to physically destroy His people. We are in the time when YHVH allows Satan and his fallen angels to do what they want before He sends the Messiah Yahusha to do what He wants!

Just as with the modern thinking patterns of our time, Uzzah crossed YHVH's "red line" with good intentions, and YHVH let King David know that if he wanted to bring the Ark of the Covenant and set it up for worship behind his house, he had better understand who He was and what He had demanded!

Today we hear a lot about "red lines" involving Iran, Israel, and the Palestinians. But YHVH's "red line" goes back to the Garden of Eden! They disobeyed Him and were banished from the garden. All who cross His red lines will be destroyed!

Just because trillions of Americans today are not killed when they touch His presence with their defiled minds and hands does not mean that He has forgotten.

He had allowed them to place the Ark of the Covenant on the Philistines' cart. He thundered at David He did not blame him for not bringing the Levites to carry the ark with the poles! He was calm until someone actually touched His area, then He reacted. Some scholars believe that the ark was electrically charged and that Uzzah died from an electric shock.

Nevertheless, it would not have happened if YHVH had not wanted it to. The Western world has no understanding of being set apart for YHVH Elohim, who dwells in absolute total light. **Hebrews 12:14b** tells us: "...and holiness, without which no one will see Elohim!" We are now more than ever called to be set apart/holy. (**Leviticus 11:44-45, 19:1, 20:78, 26; 1 Peter 1:16; Revelation 22:11**)

There are only two kingdoms—choose your kingdom. Which one do you feel more comfortable in?

Many say they belong to the kingdom of light, but they love the darkness of this world.

According to its nature, light will not allow darkness to be in its presence. Go to one side or the other, or Yahusha will spew you out of His mouth into the kingdom of darkness. (**Revelation 3:1516**)

His Torah clearly shows the boundaries of His red line, and knowing His nature, His ways, and His thinking helps us not to cross that red line! Without knowing Him as a person and His word, which we must obey, we live in danger of His vengeance and retribution, no matter how nice or spiritual we think we are, or how good our intentions are!

A few years ago, I had a dream that clearly illustrates what I have said above. I saw a landscape with a long two-lane road running through fields and meadows. I saw a man walking on the road. He came to a fenced-in area. It was not a high fence, just high enough to keep horses in the paddock.

He saw a horse grazing inside the fence. But outside the fence, he also saw a royally set table. A tall man in a black tuxedo and white shirt, wearing a large black hat, waved him over to come and sit down. The man wanted to go inside the fence, because that was where his spirit was calling him, but he chose to sit at the table because his flesh was hungry. The man made sure that he sat with his back very close to the fence. The man with the large black hat served him a delicious meal in style. The man leaned back with a glass of wine in his hand and smiled. He thought that later he would go inside the fence and look around. Then I woke up.

The fenced-in area represents the boundaries of YHVH. The tall man who served the delicious meal that satisfied the man's carnal appetite was Satan himself. I have had two previous encounters with this tall "man" in a tuxedo. The horse had no saddle or bridle. It was peacefully grazing on the green grass. But the horse is a symbol of judgment. In the dream, around

2006, YHVH had not yet saddled the horse of judgment. But as described in **Revelation 19**, the Messiah is now saddling His horse of judgment to ride off!

The time when He allowed Himself to be placed on a new chariot, the chariot of His enemies — the worshipers of other gods — is now over! His people in the West and other "free" cultures revel in idolatry—they elevate everything and everyone above Him, find excuses not to obey His will, and their greatest god is the satisfaction of the "self," setting their will against His. America's spell of material prosperity has taken hold of the world. The man in the dream wanted to stay as close to the fence as possible, but he did not go inside. This is the thinking of Western Christians—to stay close to God in case you need Him, but to enjoy the lusts of the flesh, the pride of life, the good things of this world, and the things that the eyes see. Those who love the world are enemies of Elohim!

**(Ya'cob (James) 4:4; 1 John 2:15-17)**

So-called believers usually replace what *is* right with what *looks* right! Carrying the Ark of the Covenant on the Philistines' cart all those years seemed reasonable to them—the Levites didn't need to come and carry it, it was easier to transport it the Philistine way. Perhaps they did not have access to the Torah scrolls, so they did not know how the ark should be carried. But there were the poles, staring them in the face. Samuel knew, and he had not died so long ago. The sacrifices in Shiloh were still being carried out, and the oral tradition was still alive. Therefore, I do not believe that they did not know.

YHVH's ways are hard for the flesh! Escaping the responsibility of obeying Him as Lord is as widespread as the water in the ocean. Few are convinced that we must completely submit our lives as servants to our Master! This conviction comes from the Spirit to a born-again spirit. So how many "believers" are truly born again?

The self-righteous proclaim: Jesus died to free us from the law of the God of the Old Testament. This is the separation of Father and Son, which is the spirit of the Antichrist.

Since the Torah is simply the governing laws that allow us to live peacefully with each other and with the King as citizens of the heavenly kingdom, rejecting it is as absurd as saying that Yahusha (aka Jesus) died to free us from having to stop at stop signs on the highway. Uzzah represents the period of time we are in today! Everyone does what is right in their own eyes, or follows a chosen teacher to do what is right in their eyes. The word "disciple" means "one who is taught." The Messiah said, "Unless you give up everything you have, you cannot be my disciple." (Read **Luke 14:25-33** and **Luke 18:18-30**).

Western culture is Satan's illusion—the promise of a good life, but the enslavement of people to the lusts of their flesh to satisfy them. Who told you that you need all the crap you've accumulated to live a "good life"? The understanding that humans are the highest and only creation to have an eternal spirit is completely rejected by the intellectual world order. Humans are degraded to "higher animal." But most "believers" completely ignore the portal of the reborn spirit in YHVH's sphere/kingdom. They reject His teaching, His guidance, His right to rule them, His authority over them, His commandments and orders. There is no fear of YHVH! Uzzah presumed! From what I have learned and suffered, presumptions are probably the most devastating and deadly ways of thinking a person can have. People presume that they can do whatever they want and get away with it. Presumption is a curse! When presumption is directed at Elohim, it becomes deadly! Assumption acts according to what we believe to be right based on our own thoughts. It is a hidden form of thinking that we are gods. Most people are shocked when their assumptions are questioned and even become angry about it. Assumption does not take into account the feelings, thoughts, or will of any other person. It acts on its own will, completely independent of anyone else—including Elohim. It is connected

to all sin—by elevating our will above His. Adam and Eve assumed that the beautiful serpent was telling them the truth when it told them they did not have to obey YHVH. Uzzah assumed that he had the right to touch the ark because it was in danger of falling off the cart, so he would secure it to prevent it from falling. Wouldn't that be reasonable Western thinking—the end justifies the means? But YHVH's boundaries must not be crossed under any circumstances!

What happened to Uzzah is similar to what happened to two of Aaron's sons in **Leviticus 10**. Aaron and his four sons were anointed as priests before Yahuah, establishing the "Aaronic priesthood." On that day, Yahuah's fire fell and consumed the sacrifices that had been prepared in His honor. But two of Aaron's sons assumed that they had the right to offer a fire sacrifice themselves with their censers. YHVH burned them immediately—He completely incinerated them. Their ashes had to be carried out in their clothes.

What was Aaron's reaction? Moses prevented him from showing any reaction of grief because YHVH had acted justly when He burned them. Aaron was standing in a holy place at that moment.

**Leviticus 10:3**, Moses said to Aaron, **"This is what Yahuah meant when He said, 'I will show myself holy to those who are close to me. And before all the people I will glorified before all the people!'"**

Just like Uzzah, Aaron's sons disobeyed YHVH's command by doing what they did, and they degraded Him in the eyes of the people. They degraded YHVH! They were not afraid to disobey His word! [...]

He demands absolute obedience from His servants. If you are not His servant, you are not one of His own. In ancient Hebrew culture, fathers placed their sons in positions of service in order to discipline and train them so that they could later work alongside them. The craft was passed down from father to son. Therefore, as born-again believers, we are first and foremost servants in training for government work. If we are rebellious, "do-whatever-you-want" servants, we will be punished. **Read Luke 12:42-48...**

Did YHVH strike Uzzah because he was the only sinner in the group... because he was a bad person? NO! Uzzah was a normal person. Out of a protective instinct, he reached out his hand to hold the ark so that it would not fall to the ground. He honored the Ark of the Covenant. He did not want it to fall into the dirt or be scratched by stones or break open. He did not want the massive golden cherubim to break off the mercy seat. And he didn't want the lid to open and the two tablets of the law to break. He did what he thought was right. He felt responsible for caring for the ark, since it had been in his father's house for 23 years. He grew up with the Ark of the Covenant in his house.

But the whole procedure was against the will of YHVH from the beginning. No one was allowed to touch the ark, not even the high priest. Therefore, it had to be carried on the shoulders of Aaron's descendants, who had been set apart for this purpose, using the carrying poles. Uzzah was not authorized to touch the ark—no human being was. His power and His presence were above the ark—and to touch it was to touch His power and His presence!

**“The fear of Yahuah is the beginning of wisdom.” (Psalm 111:10)**

Almost no one has this fear of Yahuah anymore! The Messiah warns us not to fear those who can kill our bodies, but Him who has the power and authority to kill both—the body and the soul in hell. (**Matthew 10:28**)

The Hebrew word for "fear" refers to terrifying, paralyzing fear. If Uzzah had had this kind of fear, he would not have touched the ark. But for most of today's "believers" today, the good intentions of his fleshly thinking were all he knew. None of them understood the seriousness/gravity/significance of YHVH's earthly throne, not Uzzah, not King David. They all lacked understanding. No, I don't believe that Uzzah is in the Hell. His death was meant to show everyone that He must be revered and feared above all other things and people! This had a profound influence on David later on, when he worshipped YHVH at the Ark of the Covenant behind his house

for 40 years on the true Zion, the City of David, and when he wrote his psalms in that place.

Why did YHVH take Moses away? Moses was angry because of the constant complaining of the people. After almost 40 years, he finally lost his temper in public. So much for "staying power"! But because of the people's whining, Moses struck the rock to get water instead of speaking to it as he had been commanded. In the eyes of His people, he publicly dishonored YHVH. Aaron's two sons did the same, and Uzzah did it too. They disregarded the word of YHVH in order to do their own will. But you cannot dishonor YHVH and get away with it! They publicly brought shame upon the name of YHVH! YHVH had to "take" Moses through death and bury him. He had to kill Uzzah. He had to incinerate Aaron's sons to let His people know that He is Elohim, Elyon, Shaddai—and man is merely a created being. If He had not responded to their rebellion against His will, people would think it was okay to rebel against Him.

In **Ezekiel 38:18-23**, we read that in the days to come, when enemy armies attack His people, He will rise up against them in His wrath, and the world will know that He is YHVH. They will not like it, but they will know it, and His people will finally understand that their Elohim reigns supreme! The Messiah Yahusha is coming with the wrath of YHVH against all who have humiliated Him. Do you realize that every time you sin—that is, do what is against His will—through thoughts, words, or deeds, you exalt yourself above YHVH? And just because you are not killed immediately, do you think He does not notice? There will be a lot of horrified "believers" before the judgment seat of Yahusha—**Matthew 7:21-23 and 25:12** are two examples. The Messiah died to take away your sin against the Torah so that you can live in obedience to His Father. But if you willfully continue to rebel against Him, do you think you will escape His wrath?

I will show you hundreds of examples: He will only protect and honor those who fear Him and obey His commandments! Nowhere in the Word is there

unconditional love—there are conditions for all His blessings. The two highest are 1) the fear of Elohim and 2) obedience to Elohim—both YHVH and Yahusha. (**Psalm 103:11-12, 17-18; Malachi 3:16-4:4**)

The message of Uzzah: **You cannot touch YHVH according to human thinking and escape His wrath!**

He allows Satan's agents to take over the earth, and these terrors will kill almost everyone on earth. But what must be feared is "the day of YHVH." On that day, when the Messiah comes down, His wrath will be poured out. Through faith, you can overcome the wrath of man and the wrath of Satan, even through death. But you cannot withstand the wrath of YHVH and expect anything other than eternal death.

**Zephaniah 1:14-15, 18:** "The great day of the Lord is near, very near. It is coming quickly. That day is a day of wrath, a day of trouble and distress, a day of destruction and desolation, a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness, a day of trumpet blast... The fire of his jealousy consumes the whole land. For he brings a terrible end upon the inhabitants of the land." (**Isaiah 24 and Matt 24:27-31**)

Those who fear Him and keep His commandments are the only ones who will escape His wrath. Therefore, look carefully at the story of Uzzah. Apply it to yourself and become "sober-minded," for His wrath is at boiling point. Mount Carmel is repeated (**1 Kings 18**). Either you are fully on His side in submission and fear, or not at all. This is the message that YHVH has given me to pass on to everyone.
