It is a personal, individual choice which course each one of us will pursue in order to please the Creator and Savior.


The bottom line is <u>"who"</u> do we <u>obey</u> and <u>"who"</u> do we worship?




Through my studies a few years ago I learned that God, LORD and Jesus are fake names put into our Bibles to replace the Real Names of our Heavenly Father and His Beloved Son. The True Names have been removed over 7000 times from Scripture and replaced by God, LORD or Jesus which are not Names but titles like Mr. or Miss. Isn't it amazing if you ask a Muslim who he worships he will say Allah which is the name of his god and if you ask a Buddhist the name of his god he will say Buddha which is his name, yet we as professed believers in our Creator do not even know the name of who we worship

Therefore, I use the four Hebrew letters yod, hey, vav, hey in English YHVH (and I pronounce it as Yahuah) instead of LORD, which is a title - not a name. I also use Yahusha (I pronounce it as Yahusha) instead of Jesus, which is not a translation but a transliteration from a Greek mistransliteration. The name Jesus has no meaning, in Hebrew nor in English! YHVH and Yahusha are the actual original Hebrew names that speak of our Savior's true nature and character. Since the Father has a Hebrew name, the Son cannot have a Greek name, because the Son came in the name of His Father (John 5:43)!






...Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in thy field? From whence then hath it tares?

This parable speaks about the wheat and the tares growing up together in the church. Besides true Christians there are many false brethren that Satan has brought in.









The Torah converts the soul!




How does the Torah do that?

Therefore the Father gave us Malachi 4.4 where it states, "Remember ye the Torah of Moses ... with the statutes and judgments!"




"The Catholic Church abolished not only the Sabbath, but all the other Jewish festivals."




















In Germany, the evergreen tree was used in worship and celebration of the Yule god, also in observance of the resurrected sun god. The evergreen represented life and also was regarded as a phallic symbol in fertility worship. It was believed that the red holly was a symbol of the menstrual blood of the queen of heaven, Diana.

• The white berries of mistletoe were the droplets of the semen of the sun god. Branches of holy and mistletoe were hung in doorways of temples and homes and it was believed that kissing beneath them will make the spirits of the god and goddess to enter one's body and make them fertile.

So Easter is found in the Bible – but as part of the pagan religion YHVH condemns!





How does The Catholic Encyclopedia define Easter?

"Easter: The English term, according to the [eighth-century monk] Bede, relates to Eostre, ...a Teutonic goddess of the rising light of day and spring, which deity, however, is otherwise unknown . . ."
(1909, Vol. 5, p. 224).

Eostre is the ancient European name for the same goddess worshipped by the Babylonians as Astarte or Ishtar, goddess of fertility, whose major celebration was in the spring of the year.







"Easter Rabbit" - "the rabbit is a pagan symbol and has always been an emblem of fertility". Many credible sources substantiate the fact that Easter became a substitute festival for the Passover and Feast of Unleavened Bread.



The Encyclopedia Britannica says: "There is no indication of the observance of the Easter festival in the New Testament, or in the writings of the apostolic Fathers...The first Christians continued to observe the Jewish festivals."






Centuries before MESSIAH, the pagan Romans celebrated February 15 and the evening of February 14 as an idolatrous and sensuous festival in honor of Lupercus, the "hunter of wolves"! (Encyclopedia Americana)

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Nimrod - Baal or sun god of the ancient pagans - was said to have been born on January 6 (the winter solstice) and his birthday was celebrated on December 25.

Semiramis, the mother of Nimrod presented herself for purification on the fortieth day after January 6, which takes us to February 15, the celebration of which began on the evening of February 14 - the Lupercalia or St. Valentine's Day.



- On this day in February it was said that Semiramis appeared for the first time in public with her son as the original "mother and child."
- Another name for the child Nimrod was "Cupid" meaning "desire" (Encyclopedia Britannica, article "Cupid"). It is said that when Nimrod's mother (Semiramis) ... saw him, she lusted after him she desired him. Nimrod became her Cupid her desired one and later her Valentine! So evil was Nimrod's mother that it is said she married her own son!
- Inscribed on the monuments of ancient Egypt are inscriptions that Nimrod (the Egyptians called him Osiris) was "the husband of his mother."

How did Halloween start?




- As with Christmas and Easter, we can trace the roots of Halloween far back into the pagan past.

 Halloween is a celebration of darkness.
- By medieval times Nov. 1 had been established as All Saints' Day. The evening before, Oct. 31, became Allhallows Eve, or Halloween, as it is known today. (The Encyclopedia of Religion)

On this holiday "huge bonfires were set on hilltops to frighten away evil spirits . . . The souls of the dead were supposed to revisit their homes on this day, and the autumnal festival acquired sinister significance, ...with ghosts, witches, hobgoblins, black cats, fairies, and demons of all kinds said to be roaming about. It was the time to placate the supernatural powers controlling the processes of nature.



Bobbing for apples was originally a form of divination (fortune telling) to learn of future marriages. The first person to bite an apple was predicted to be the first to marry in the coming year. Peeling apples was considered a way to determine one's life span. The longer the peel, the longer one would live.





The jack-o-lantern, now a hollowed-out pumpkin with a demonic face carved in it and containing a lighted candle, represented a watchman on Halloween night or a man caught between earth and the supernatural world.







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One of the earliest historical records of a society celebrating a Mother deity can be found among the ancient Egyptians, who held an annual festival to honor the goddess Isis, who was commonly regarded as the Mother of the pharaohs. The Roman root of Mother's Day is perhaps more precisely found in the celebration of the Phrygian goddess Cybele, or Magna Mater (Great Mother).











In Rome and Asia Minor, Cybele was the major Mother deity most similar to Rhea, the Greek mother of the gods. Other societies worshipped similar deities including Gaia the Earth goddess and Meter oreie the Mountain Mother. In many aspects, this Mother goddess was represented and celebrated similarly across cultures.











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A later incarnation of a holiday to honor Motherhood came from Europe. It fell on the fourth Sunday Lent (the 40 days of fasting preceding Easter Sunday). Early Christians initially used the day to honor the church in which they were baptized, which they knew as their "Mother Church." This place of worship would be decorated with jewels, flowers and other offerings.











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In the 1600's a clerical decree in England broadened the celebration to include real Mothers, earning the name Mothering Day. Mothers were presented with cakes and flowers, as well as a visit from their beloved and distant children.

In 1908 a U.S. Senator from Nebraska, Elmer Burkett, proposed making Mother's Day a national holiday at the request of the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA). The proposal was defeated, but by 1909 forty-six states were holding Mother's Day services as well as parts of Canada and Mexico.





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
- Since there is *no* instruction to observe Lent in the Bible, where did it come from?

Landseer, Sabaean Researches, pp. 111, 112). Alexander Hislops

"The forty days abstinence of Lent was directly borrowed from the worshippers of the Babylonian goddess. Such a Lent of forty days, in the spring of the year, is still observed by the Yezidis or Pagan Devil-worshippers of Koordistan, who have inherited it from their early masters, the Babylonians. 
WHERE DID LENT COME FROM?

What about birthday celebrations?



Where did the universal custom of celebrating the day of one's birth originate? What about birthday parties, cakes, and candles? What does the Bible say about celebrating the day of one's birth?

If birthdays should be observed, then why is the Bible silent on the date of the birth of every single servant of YAH, including Abraham, Noah, Moses, Samuel, David, the apostles, and most important of all, Yahushua Ha Mashiach Himself?



In Elohim's sight, the actual time and day of a person's birth are completely unimportant. In fact, in God's sight, as Solomon wrote in


Ecclesiastes,

"A good name is better than precious ointment; and the day of death than the day of one's birth" (Ecclesiastes 7:1).



Birthday celebrations are only mentioned twice in Scripture -- both times in reference to customs being observed by unconverted people -- a pagan Egyptian Pharaoh in the O.T., and the wicked King Herod in the N.T.!

In Genesis 40, 20-22 we read about Pharaoh's **Birthday** when the chief baker was hanged as Joseph had interpreted his dream.




In Matthew 14:6-12 we read of the wicked, apostate king Herod, one of the worst butchers who ever lived. He celebrated his own birthday, and we know what happened! Again someone lost his life, this time a tremendous servant of the true Elohim, John the Baptist.

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The astrology makes a great deal out of the positions of the sun, moon and stars now or day of one's birth. **Astrology teaches that the** position of the sun, moon and stars now of one's birth determines their future destiny, their character, their personality, talents, health, and so forth.




 However, Astrology, as the Word of God (Elohim) plainly shows, is a pagan, false religious deception -- a fraud and a mythological pseudoscience, and God (Elohim) is against this according to Isaiah 47, 13-14.



The World Book -- Childcraft International says regarding "Holidays and Birthdays," "For thousands of years people all over the world have thought of a birthday as a very special day. Long ago, people believed that ... on a birthday a person could be helped by good spirits or hurt by evil spirits. So, when a person had a birthday, friends and relatives gathered to protect him or her. And that's how birthday parties began."

"The idea of putting candles on birthday cakes goes back to ancient Greece. The **Greeks worshipped many** gods and goddesses. Among them was one called Artemis."






"More and more, people the world over attach a certain magic to their actual date of birth ... We may wear a ring with our birthstone in it for good luck. And when we blow out the candles on our birthday

cake, we are careful to keep what we wished a secret. If we tell, of course, our wish won't come true."

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Why do people say, "happy birthday?" This authority says the following, "For the good wishes of our friends and relatives are supposed to protect us from evil spirits. "Party snappers, horns, bursting balloons, firecrackers, and other noisemakers are just one more way of trying to scare off any bad-luck spirits that may be hovering about."



Origen of Alexandria, in 245 A.D., wrote in a dissertation on Leviticus: "None of the saints can be found who ever held a feast or a banquet upon his birthday, or rejoiced on the day when his son or daughter was born. But sinners rejoice and make merry on such days. But the saints not only neglect to mark the day of their birth with festivity, but also, filled with the Holy Spirit, they curse this day, after the example of Job and Jeremiah and David."

YHVH Elohim inspired the prophet Jeremiah to write, "Hear ye the word which the Lord speaketh unto you, O house of Israel: Thus saith the LORD, learn not the way of the heathen, ... and be not dismayed at the signs of the heaven (astrology!); for the heathen are dismayed at them. For the custom of the people are vain." (Jeremiah 10:1-3).



YHVH is even more explicit. Celebrating birthdays was a particularly Egyptian custom. He plainly commands His people, "After the doings of the land of Egypt, wherein ye dwelt, shall ye not do: and after the doings of the land of Canaan, whither I bring you, shall ye not do: neither shall ye walk in their ordinances" (Leviticus 18:3).



Something to think about!

Should a believer in Yahusha have anything to do with ceremonies that trace back to pagan times, and pagan rituals? Should a believer indulge himself or his or her children in pagan birthday parties, just because they seem so attractive, fun, and "innocent"?



What fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? And what communion hath light with darkness? Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith YHVH, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, And I will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith YHVH the Almighty." 2 Cor 6:14, 17-18

However, YHVH does say, "Ye shall therefore keep MY statutes and MY judgments" -- which did not include any man-made holidays and there are many listed on our calendar that are in honor of man's accomplishments! -- (Leviticus 18:24-28).

Isn't it high time to let go of the Roman and Babylonian customs - this idolatry - and get back to the faith of Christ delivered once to the saints?



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Let's educate the people to stop keeping the pagan holidays with all of their customs and teach people instead what Scriptures!
