NOT CHANGE,

When we talk about Elohim
(GOD), we need to know **which**
Elohim we are talking about. For
Paul stated in 1Corinthians 8:5
**“...indeed there are many
“gods” and many “lords”!**
English Standard Version (ESV)



We need to **clarify**,
because Muslims call on
God, Buddhists call on
God, every pagan religion
calls on God and
Christianity and Judaism
call on God.



This may be confusing, so I will clarify. When I talk about God (Elohim) in this presentation, I am talking about the Elohim of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, whose name are the 4 English letters YHWH – or in Hebrew  pronounced as Yahuah. This is HIS name according to Scripture (Isaiah 42:8).



Here is what He
himself stated
in Isaiah 42:8

“I am יהוה
(YHVH) that is My
Name, and My
esteem (glory) I
do not give to
another, nor My
praise to idols.”

I also use **Yahusha** instead of Jesus, which is not a translation but a transliteration from a Greek mistransliteration. The name Jesus is **man-made** and has no meaning, in Hebrew nor in English! YHVH (Yahuah) and Yahusha are the actual original Hebrew names that speak of our Savior's true nature and character.

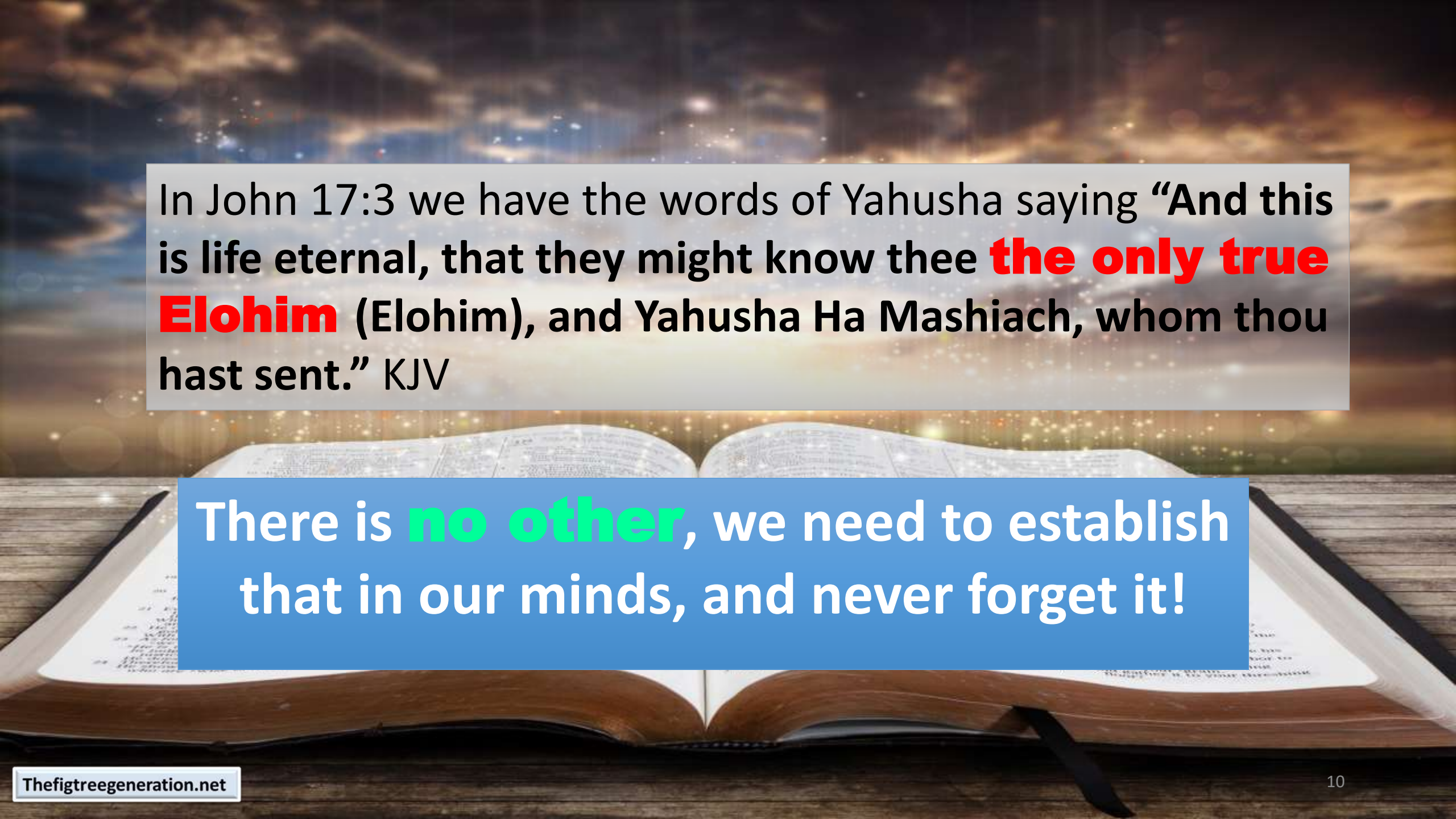


Scripture is very clear that there is **ONLY ONE** Elohim, the Creator and life-giver. Moses told the Children of Israel in Deuteronomy 4:35, 39 — “Unto thee it was shown, that thou mightest know that YHVH He is Elohim; there is none else beside him. 39 know therefore this day, and consider it in thine heart, that YHVH He is Elohim in heaven above, and upon the earth beneath: **there is none else.**” KJV

Let's repeat it:
THERE IS NONE ELSE!

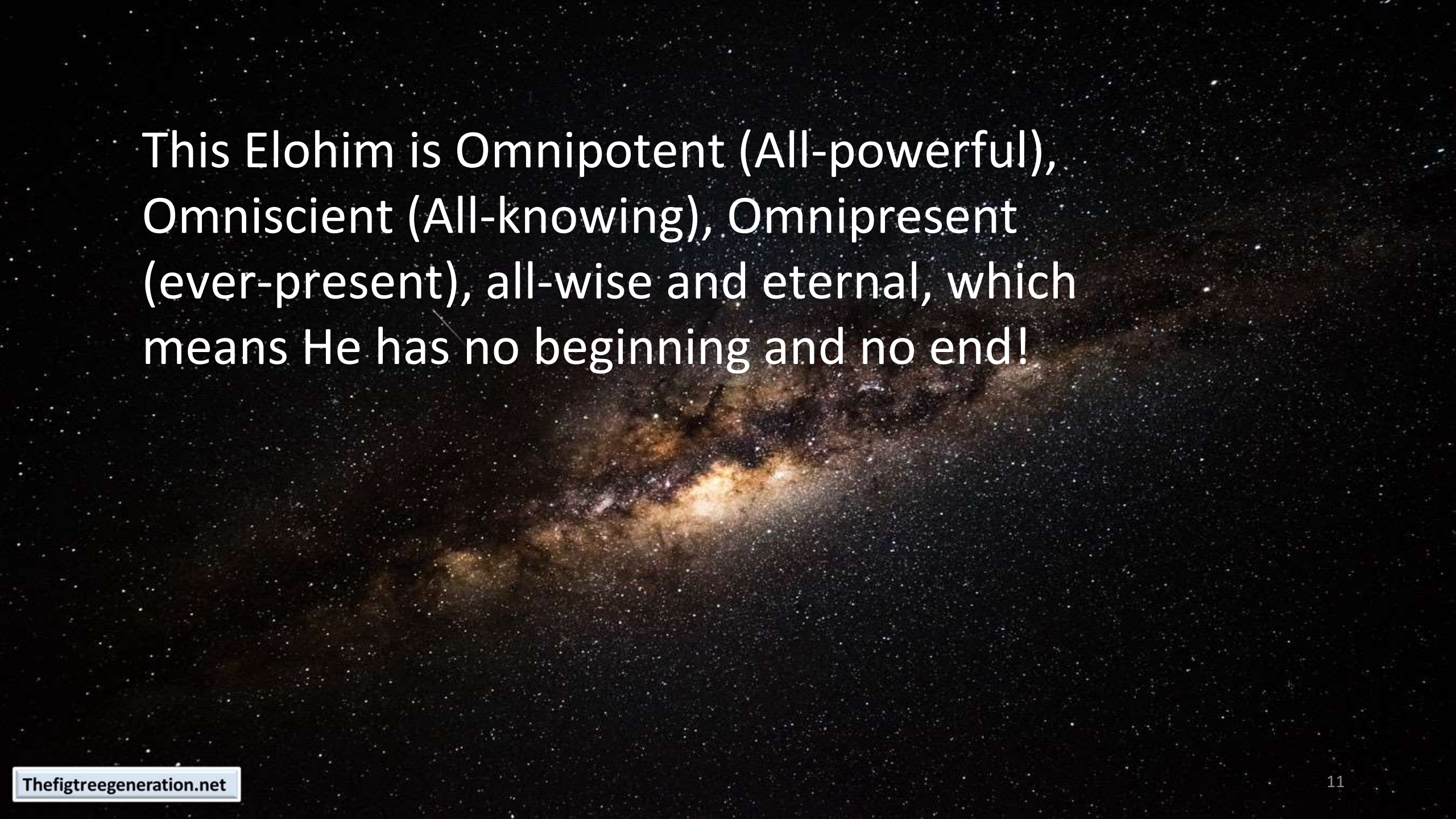
**“For great is יהוה (YHWH) and greatly to be

There is **no other**, we need to establish that in our minds, and never forget it!



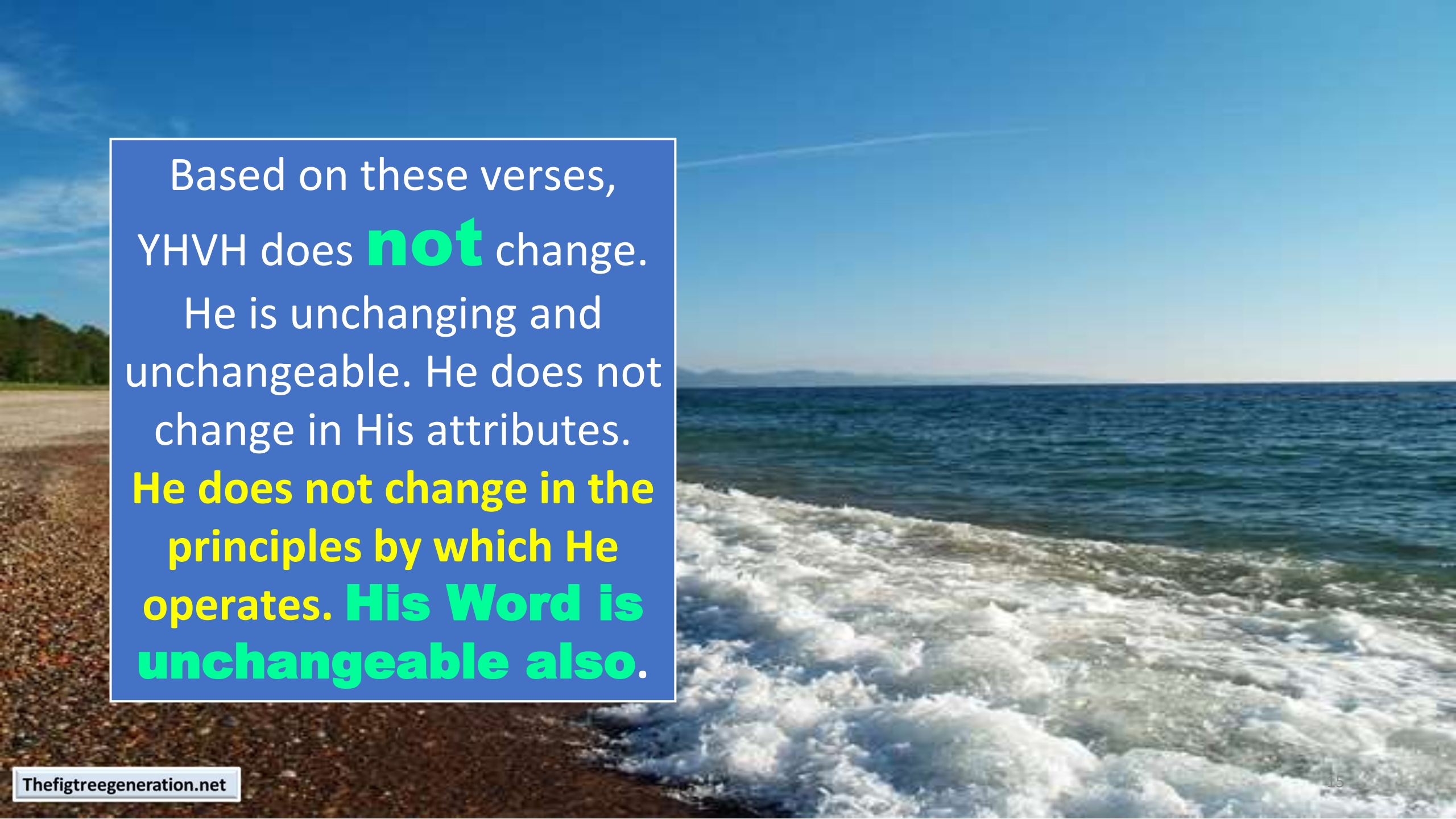
This Elohim is Omnipotent (All-powerful),
Omniscient (All-knowing), Omnipresent
(ever-present), all-wise and eternal, which
means He has no beginning and no end!

The Hebrew Elohim YHVH, who created the worlds through
Yahusha stated in Malachi 3:6
“For I am YHVH, I shall not change...”

Similarly, James 1:17 tells us, “Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, **who does not change** like shifting shadows.” NIV

And Numbers 23:19 is clear: “Elohim is not a man, that He should lie, nor a son of man, **that He should change His mind.** Does He speak and then not act? Does He promise and not fulfill?” Berean Study Bible



Based on these verses,
YHWH does **not** change.

He is unchanging and
unchangeable. He does not
change in His attributes.

**He does not change in the
principles by which He
operates. His Word is
unchangeable also.**

In Matthew 24:35 Yahusha said, “Heaven and earth shall pass away, but **my words shall not pass away.**”

His Word stands forever!

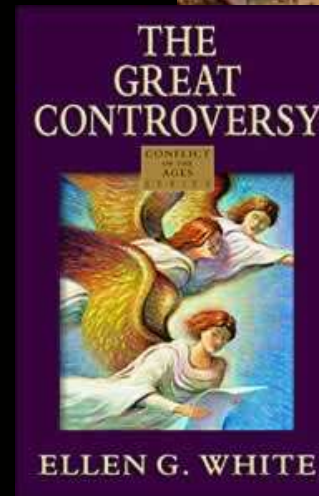
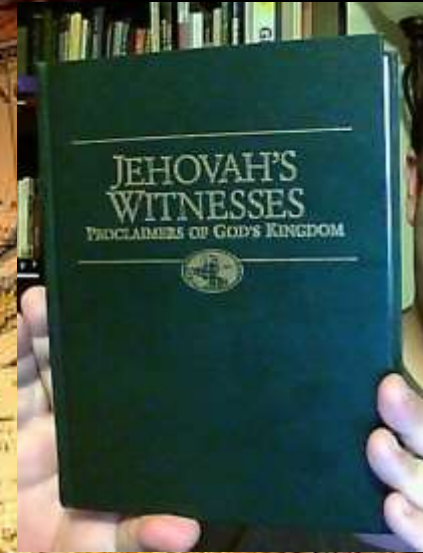
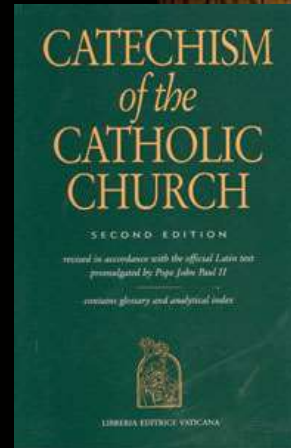
This is being re-affirmed in Psalm 119:89: **"Forever, O YHVH, thy word is settled in heaven."** KJV

Deut. 4:2 “Do not add to the Word which I command you, and do not take away from it, so as to guard the commands of יהוה (YHVH) your Elohim which I am commanding you.”

This is also confirmed in Deuteronomy 12:32 - **“All the words I am commanding you, guard to do it – do not add to it nor take away from it.”** The Scriptures

I wonder, what part of this instruction people don't understand?

Proverbs 30:5-6 “Every word of Elohim is pure: he is a shield unto them that put their trust in him. 6 **Add thou not unto his words**, lest he reprove thee, and thou be found a liar.” KJV

THIS IS A COMMAND!

At this point of the study, I should mention that there are times when the Creator does change His mind. It is because of His mercy.

Exodus 32:14 proclaims, “**And YHVH repented of the evil which he thought to do unto his people.**” KJV



That means He changed His mind. **Why?**
This was the golden calf apostasy, when Moses interceded for the people.

There are other cases, when Yahuah changed His mind. For instance in the story of Jonah. Through His prophet, YHVV had told Nineveh He would destroy the city in forty days (Jonah 3:4).

However, Nineveh repented of their sin (verses 5–9). In response to the Assyrians' repentance, YHVV repented:



“He had compassion and did not bring upon them the destruction He had threatened” (verse 10).

The bottom line is that Yahuah is entirely consistent. He was going to judge Nineveh. However, Nineveh repented and changed its ways. As a result, Yahuah, in His holiness, had mercy on the people of Nineveh and spared them.

This “change of mind” is entirely consistent with His character. We should be thankful for His mercy towards man.



Look at Micha 7:18 “Who is a Elohim like unto thee that pardoneth iniquity, and passeth by the transgression of the remnant of his heritage? he retaineth not his anger for ever, **because he delighteth in mercy.**” KJV

The fact that Yahuah Elohim changes His treatment of us in response to our choices has nothing to do with His character. In fact, because YHVH does not change, He must treat the righteous differently from the unrighteous. If someone repents, He consistently forgives; if someone refuses to repent, He will bring the promised judgment.





Coming back to His Word
we understand that it
will stand, and He will
not change what comes
out of His mouth.

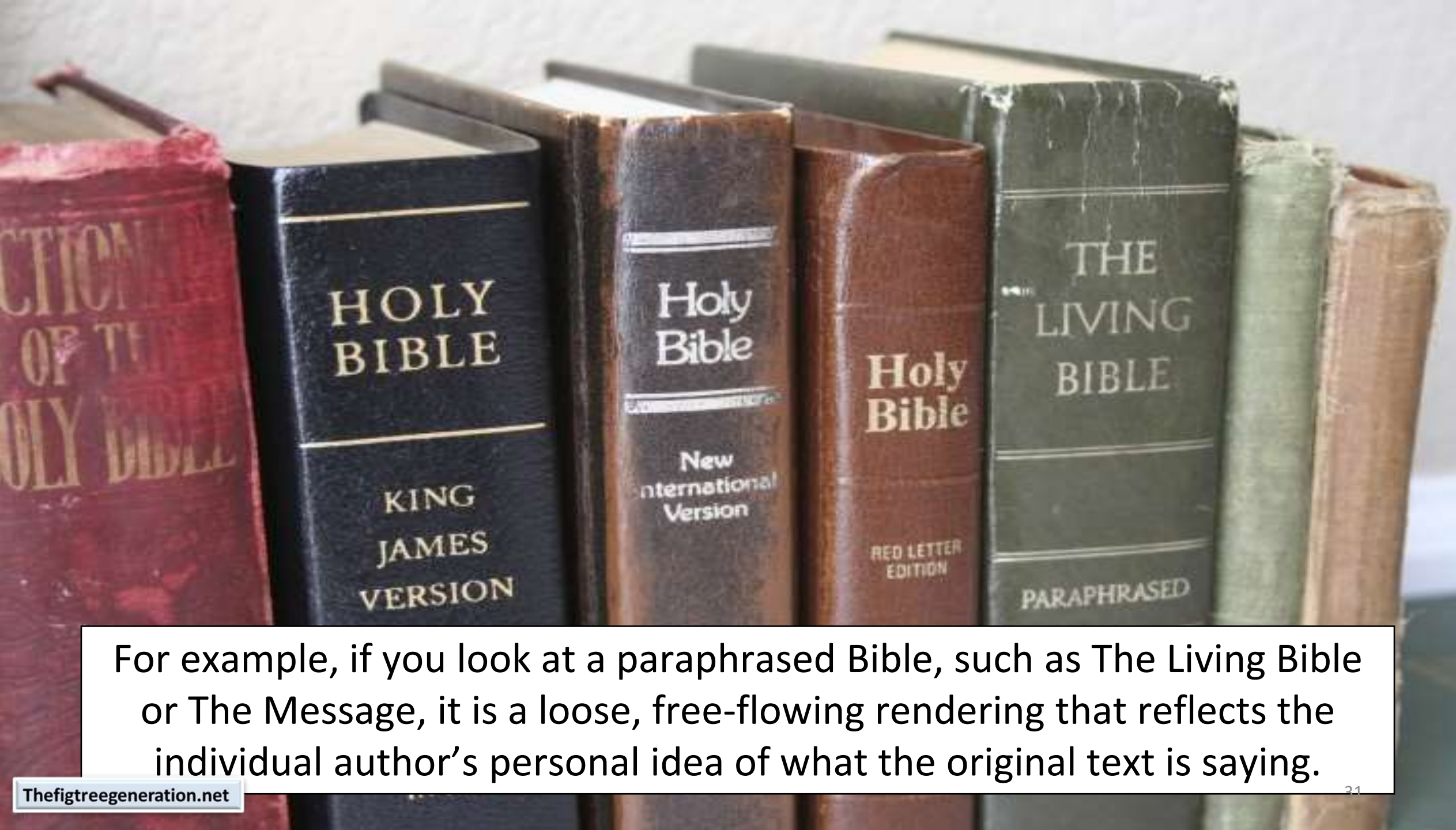
However, people inspired by Satan through the ages have made changes to His Word and they are doing it today trying to improve on His Word.

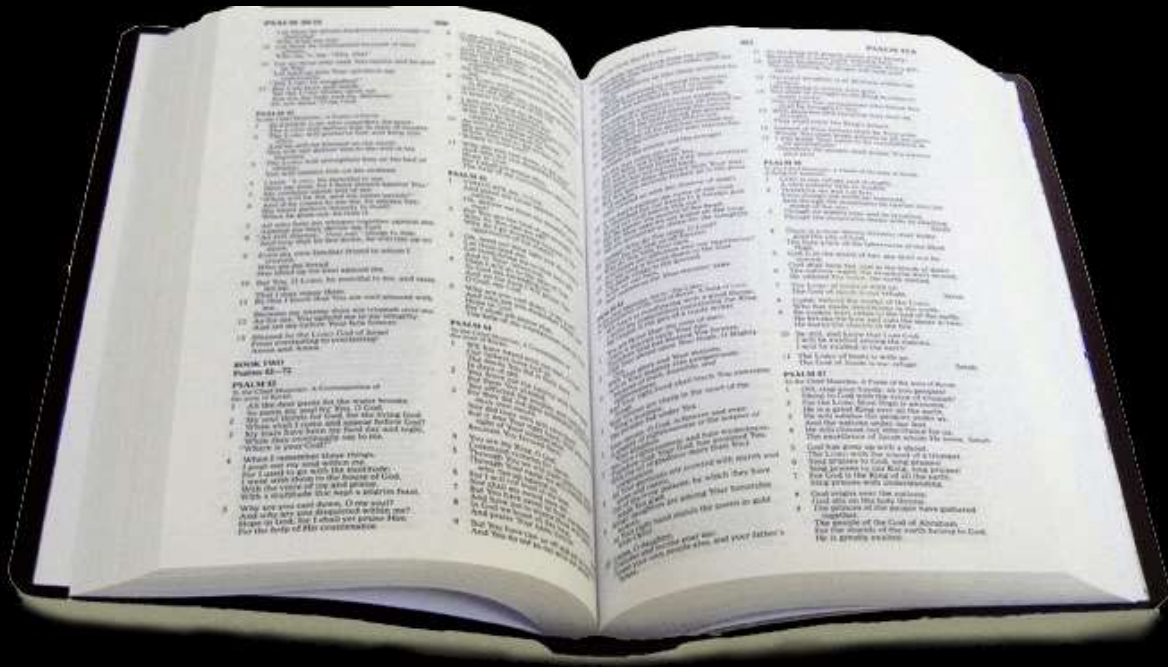


For example, if you look at a paraphrased Bible, such as The Living Bible or The Message, it is a loose, free-flowing rendering that reflects the individual author's personal idea of what the original text is saying.



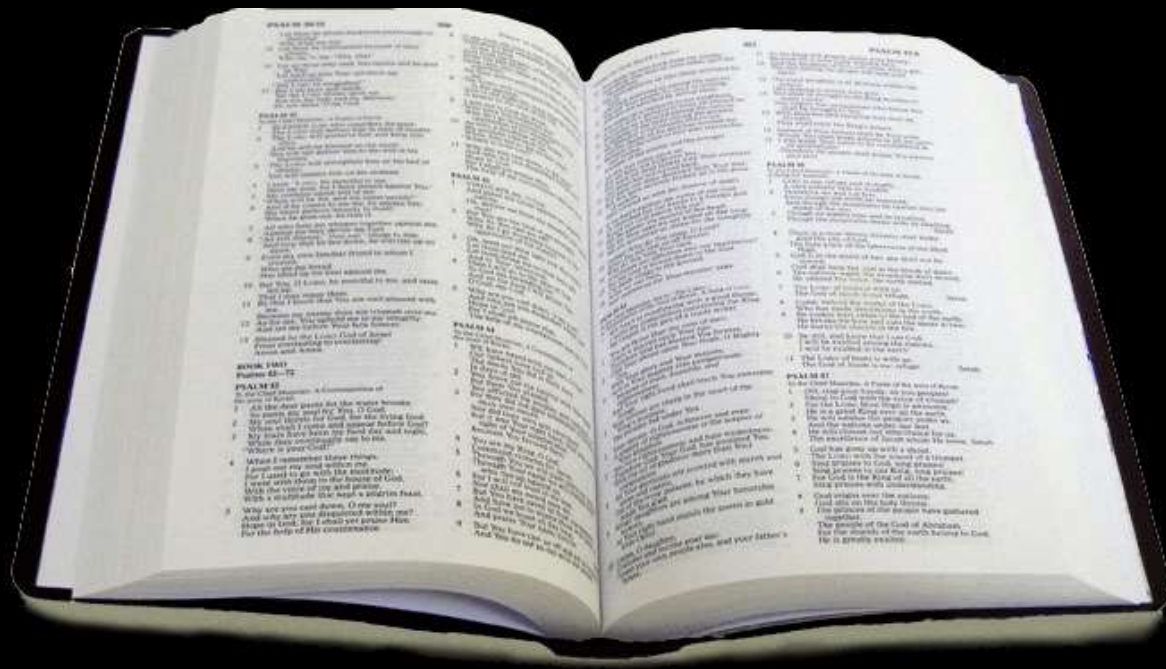
This functions somewhat like an extended running commentary. This type of Bible is questionable as it will change the true meaning, will bring confusion and can lead people to damnation.

We must understand the holy Scripture is under attack. Satan, who succeeded in deceiving Eve in the Garden of Eden, has surely been busy in this 21st Century along the same lines. Beware!



The Scripture, starting in Genesis and ending in Revelation, is not just another book, it is not something that I can take or leave whenever I feel like it. It is the most wonderful and precious book.

It is the only book on Earth that gives mankind explanations for beginnings, past, present and the future of our world. It gives the answers to perplexing questions which have plagued mankind for most of his existence.



It provides the reasons for the existence of governments and nations; for setting up and deposing of kings and empires; righteousness; evil; wisdom.

Paul states in 2 Tim. 3: 16-17, “**All Scripture** is breathed out by Elohim and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of Elohim may be competent, equipped for every good work.” KJV

By the way, there is a page in the Bible that was not written by Moses, the Prophets, the Messiah, the Apostles, or Yahuah Himself. However, many quote from that page more than the all other writings combined.



Do you know what page
it is talking about?

It's the title page for the New Testament. The only words on that page are **"The New Testament."** The title page for the New Testament was not written by any apostle or prophet. It was not pinned by the Messiah, nor was it written in any of the original manuscripts, yet Christianity is holding on to this page with all their strength.



This page didn't come into being until the printing press began mass printing of the Bible of today.

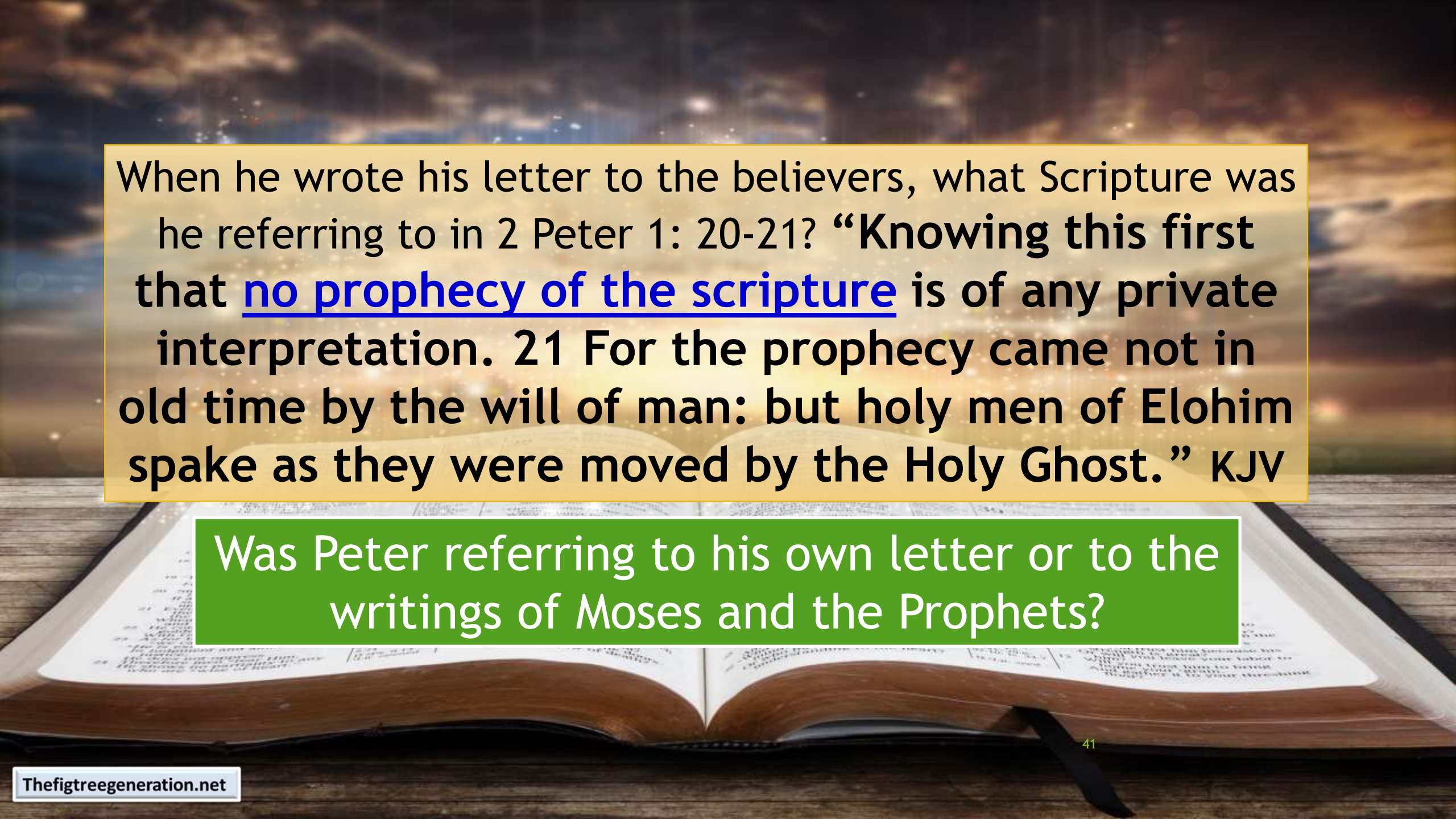
Paul told the young preacher in 2 Timothy 4:13
“Bring the cloak that I left with Karpus at
Troas when you come, and the books,
especially the parchments.” The Scriptures



What were the books and parchments that Paul wanted Timothy to bring with him? These were without question the five books of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms.



WHAT ABOUT PETER?



When he wrote his letter to the believers, what Scripture was he referring to in 2 Peter 1: 20-21? “Knowing this first that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation. 21 For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of Elohim spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.” KJV

Was Peter referring to his own letter or to the writings of Moses and the Prophets?

He referred the Gentiles to the teaching of Moses for instruction in the "essentials" of the faith after the first council in Jerusalem with Peter and Paul in Acts 15:21. "For Moses from ancient generations has in every city those who preach him, since he is read in the synagogues every Sabbath." KJV

HOW ABOUT JAMES?

Did James expect Gentile believers to go and receive the instruction of Moses from synagogues on the Sabbath day? Why would James summarize his instruction and then refer **to the teaching of Moses?** Maybe his teaching was completely consistent and agreed with Moses. Maybe the true teaching of the so-called New Testament is completely consistent and based upon Moses and the Prophets.



We need the instruction of Moses to understand the words of Yahusha just as He said, according to His own words.

“For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me; for he wrote of Me. But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe My words?” (John 5:46-47 KJV)

and confusion.

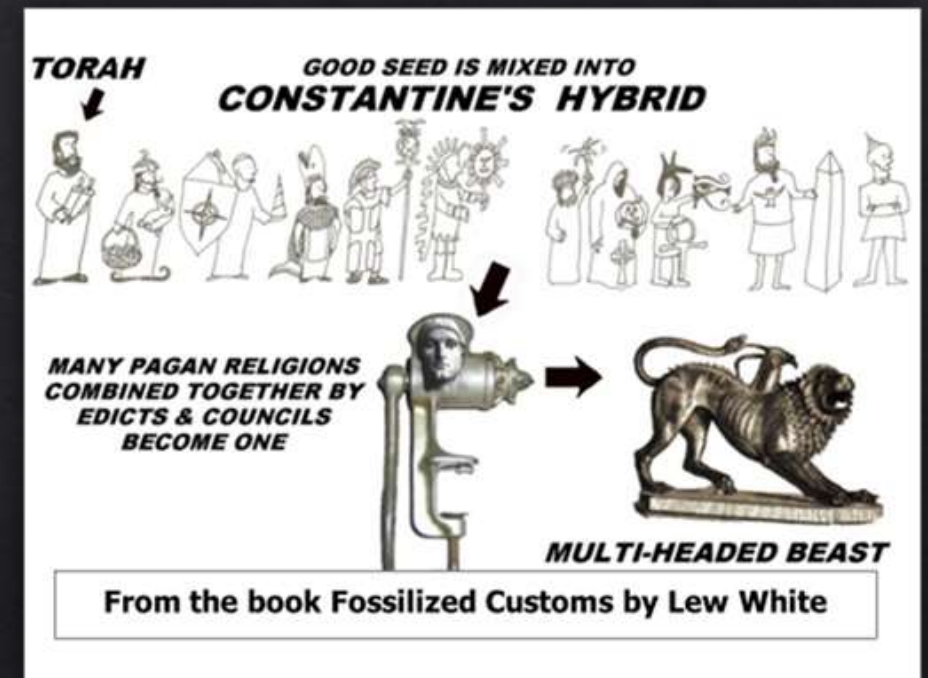


That is what happened to Christianity, they left Torah and became a religion of sun worship and paganism.

Christianity is split up into over 41,000 different groups, churches and denominations with everyone claiming to be right.



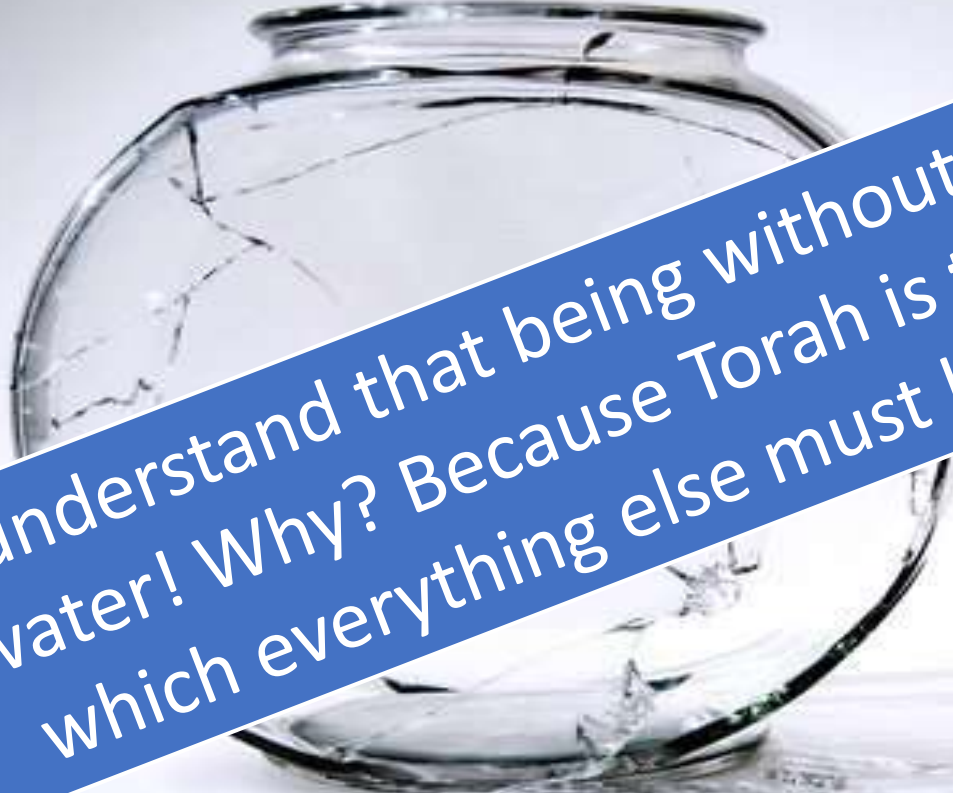
Christianity have their own messiah, created by Constantine, to begin with. It is a hybrid religion, a mixture of some of the teachings of the Hebrew Messiah Yahusha that died for us, but not the same religion that He nor the apostles taught!



Therefore, all of man's teachings, be it Judaism or Christianity must be closely compared with the written Torah.

Yahuah has not changed; man is continually changing the gospel, adding and subtracting.





Man must understand that being without Torah is like a fish without water! Why? Because Torah is **the foundation** by which everything else must be tested.

Torah is a lot more accurate than the Christian Bible. For example, it is said that the Torah has nine spelling variants — with absolutely no effect on the meaning of the words. The Christian Bible on the other hand has over 200,000 variants and in 400 instances the variants change the meaning of the text. **This comparison demonstrates the remarkable accuracy of the Jewish translation of Torah.**



The message of salvation in the New Testament is the same as in the Old Testament, namely by grace, through faith alone, in Messiah Yahusha. The people of the Old Testament were looking forward to the sacrifice of Yahusha and the people of the New Testament are looking back to His death at Calvary.



In Romans 4 the apostle Paul makes that very clear. To prove this, Paul points us to Abraham, who was saved by faith: “Abraham **believed** Elohim, and it was credited to him as righteousness” (Romans 4:3 KJV). Again, Paul quotes the Old Testament to prove his point.

Paul also declares in Colossians 1:16 that Yahusha is the Creator. He said, **“by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities — all things were created through him and for him”**. KJV

Some people claim that the Elohim of the Old Testament is cruel and ruthless by seemingly killing innocent men, women, and children and required strict obedience from His children. But the Elohim of the New Testament is loving, merciful, forgiving and gracious as is being represented by the Messiah who they also claim did away with the Torah.



When you read Exodus 34:5-7 you will discover this is not correct. The Elohim of the Old Testament **“was merciful, gracious, longsuffering and abundant in goodness and truth. ... He was keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin...”** KJV

When you study Scripture, you will discover that Yahusha, the Messiah of the New Testament, was the Yahuah of the Old Testament. He claimed that He predated Abraham (John 8:57-58). He referred to Himself as the **“I AM.”** When He had appeared to Moses from the burning bush, He had identified Himself as **“I AM WHO I AM”** and **“I AM”** (Exodus 3:14).



In Revelation 1:8 He said of Himself “**I am** the ‘Aleph’ and the ‘Taw’, beginning and End,” says **יהוה** (YHVH) “who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.” TS2009



If we translate that into our modern language, He would be saying: “**I AM the I.T., meaning I am IT**”! There is none other beside me.

Paul clearly tells us that Yahusha was the one that spoke with Moses and led the nation of Israel out of Egypt (1 Corinthians 10:4 and Deuteronomy 32:18) It was Messiah Himself, the Word of Yahuah, who wrote the Ten Commandments with His own finger, and gave all the commandments including the statutes and judgments to Moses! It is critical to realize the Yahuah Elohim of the Old Testament was the one who was made flesh and became Yahusha Ha Mashiach, the Son of YHVH (John 1:1).



Obedience AND GRACE

There was grace in the O.T. there is grace in the N.T.
There was mercy in the O.T., there is mercy in the N.T.
The people in the O.T. were saved by the blood of the lamb, the people of the N.T. are saved by the blood of the lamb.

Obedience in the O.T. was the only proof of Love to YHVH and obedience is the only proof of love to YHVH in the N.T.

GRACE AND **Obedience**

For many Believers, one difficult problem in the Bible is the apparent contradiction between Paul and James. **Is justification by faith, as Paul claims, or justification by works, as James seems to say?**



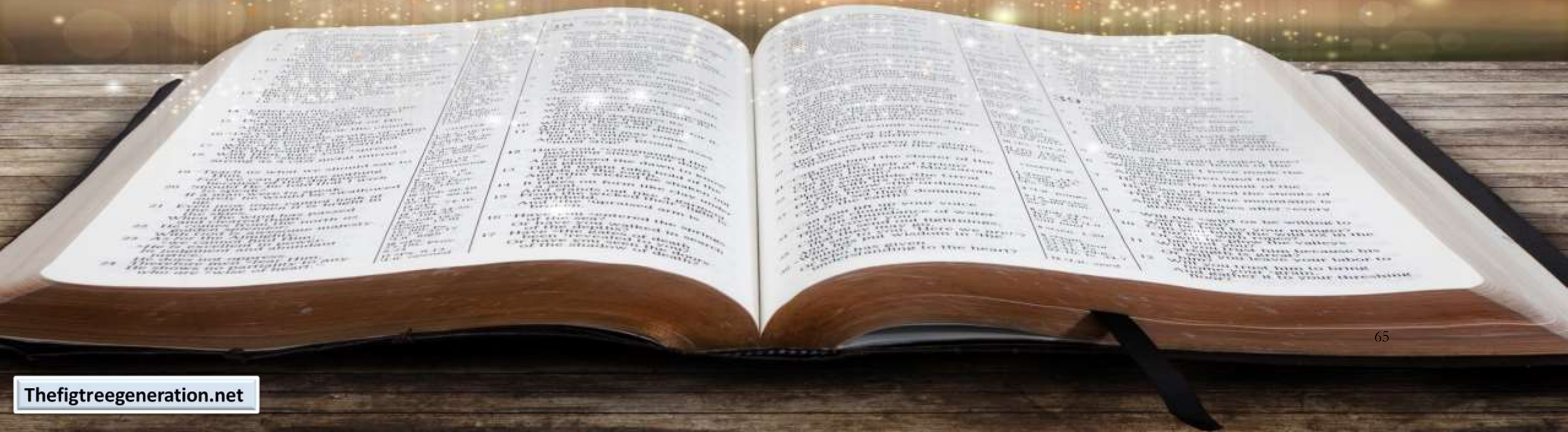
In Romans, 5:1-2, Paul writes, "Therefore having been justified by faith, we have peace with Elohim through our Master Yahusha Ha Mashiach, through whom also we have obtained our introduction by faith into this grace in which we stand; and we exult in hope of the glory of Elohim." KJV

James seems to say just the opposite, "You see that a man is justified by works, and not by faith alone." KJV

All one must read are the next verses in James and you have the answer. **“Faith is being made perfect by actions that follow.”** James 2:26 states: **“For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also.”** KJV

**That means Faith is
an ACTION word**

Paul agrees in Romans 2:13, when he says, **“For not the hearers of the Torah are righteous in the sight of Elohim, but the doers of the Torah shall be declared right.”** (TS2009)



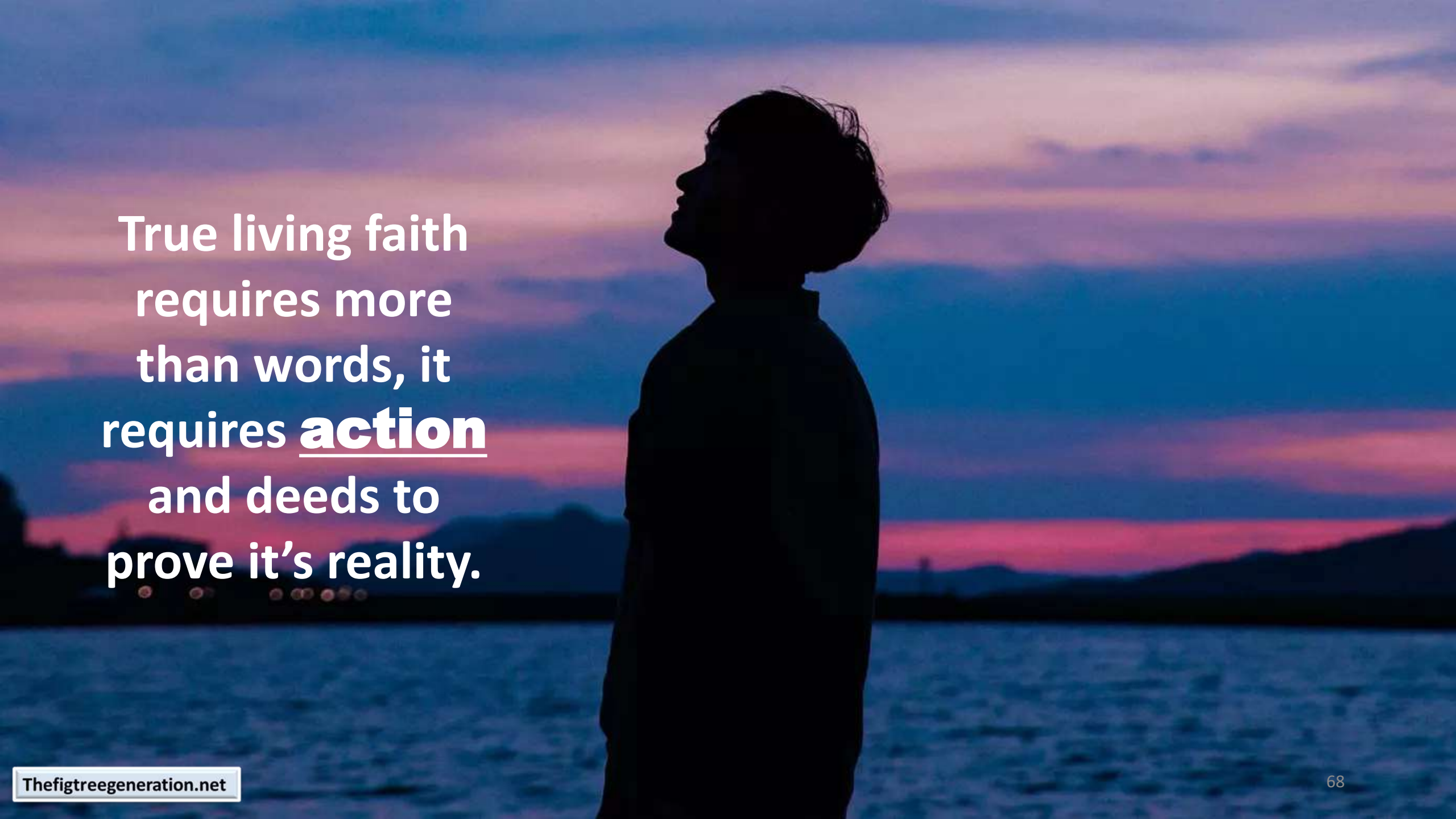
To believe in the Elohim of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, believing that He exists, is only the starting point of faith. But such a belief does not necessarily involve conviction or commitment to Him as the Father and His Son Yahusha, the Messiah! Such a belief in Elohim is profitable, but incomplete and will not help us.



As the apostle James noted: **“You believe that Elohim is one. You do well. The demons (fallen angels) also believe – and shudder!”** (James 2:19 – The Scriptures). **We must go beyond the level of belief exhibited by demons.**

True, genuine faith is not mere wishful thinking—a pie-in-the-sky feeling that everything will be all right and we are saved, meaning we have eternal life. Real true faith is defined as belief with strong conviction; firm belief in something for which there may be no tangible proof; complete trust, confidence, reliance or devotion and still acting on it.

James asks this rhetorical question, **“What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds?”** Mere words are useless, when someone needs food and clothing as an example (James 2:15-17).



Biblical faith without corresponding works or deeds, without the conditions Heaven has laid down is also called presumption, Satan's counterfeit of faith. **So, when it comes to eternal life, presumption is fatal – eternally fatal.**



Faith and obedience are two sides of the same coin and are always found together in the Scriptures. Saving faith is impossible without willing obedience. Genuine faith generates obedience to the one in whom our faith rests.



The only difference between the Old and the New Testament is that the priesthood was changed (see Hebrews 8). Since the ultimate sacrifice of the Messiah Yahusha Ha Mashiach 2,000 years ago, the Aaronic priesthood was abolished and we entered the Melchizedek priesthood, Yahusha being the High Priest officiating in Heaven in the true tabernacle. Also, the physical temple was

destroyed at about 70 AD, the animal sacrifices seized forever and now the believers, being living stones, constitute the spiritual temple (Ephesians 2:19-22) **where Yahusha is the corner stone.**

The Difference

Let it be taught that the promise of Abraham is to all his descendants by faith in the Elohim of Abraham. Let it be said that Torah is **still** profitable for instruction in righteousness and that the weekly Sabbath is for all people (Israel and the adopted sons of Elohim) to be a sign between them and YHVH.



Let it be taught that the holidays and festivals are not exclusively Jewish and things of the past. Instead, let it be taught that they are "Biblical" and that they teach about the Messiah – His first coming (the Spring holidays), the giving of the Torah and the Spirit (the Summer holiday), and the Second Coming (the late Summer and early Fall holidays).



Just as Yahusha removed the middle wall of partition at the temple, so we can remove the middle wall of partition in our Bible. It is not a very big page; but its removal will connect Moses and the Prophets with the Gospel of Yahusha the Messiah. It will also set you on the right course to receive the Messiah just as John the Baptist preached about. Malachi, the last prophet, says it this way as he concludes the Old Testament.



Malachi 4:4 “Remember the Torah of Moses My servant, even the statutes and ordinances which I commanded him in Horeb for all Israel.” KJV

**This is written to the end-time generation
That follow the Most-High Elohim!**



By supporting the various Christian Churches and denominations of today, we make ourselves guilty of spreading doctrines and teachings of man. The Father accepts us where we are, that is correct, but He does not leave us there, if we are willing to be led by Him. After all, we are admonished **to first to seek the kingdom of YHVH and his righteousness**, then all the other things will be added unto us (Matthew 6:33).



Let's follow the advice, which
