
Just for clarification: In my presentations I am using YHVH (Yahuah) instead of LORD, which is a title and not a name and I am using Yahusha instead of Jesus, which is not a translation but a transliteration and really has no meaning, neither in Hebrew nor in English! YHVH (Yahuah) and Yahusha are the actual original names and the true nature and character of them.

Moses does not believe the names "**Elohim**", "**Adonai**", "**Elohim**" and "**the Elohim of your ancestors – the Elohim of Abraham, the Elohim of Isaac, and the Elohim of Jacob**" are convincing enough. He wants something much more explicit. So Moses desires a name that spells out the exact nature of this Elohim who wants to redeem them. It is wonderful to see – both at the beginning of his career and later when Moses faces the frustration of leading the Jewish people through the desert – that he persists in seeking even greater intimacy with Elohim to give him the confidence to proceed with his mission.



**"And Moses said unto Elohim, Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The Elohim of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say to me, What is his name? what shall I say unto them? 14. And Elohim said unto Moses, "Ehyeh-Asher-Ehyeh" (I AM THAT I AM): and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you."
*(Exodus 3:13-14 - CJB).***



Elohim presents him with the wonderfully enigmatic name Ehyeh-Asher-Ehyeh.

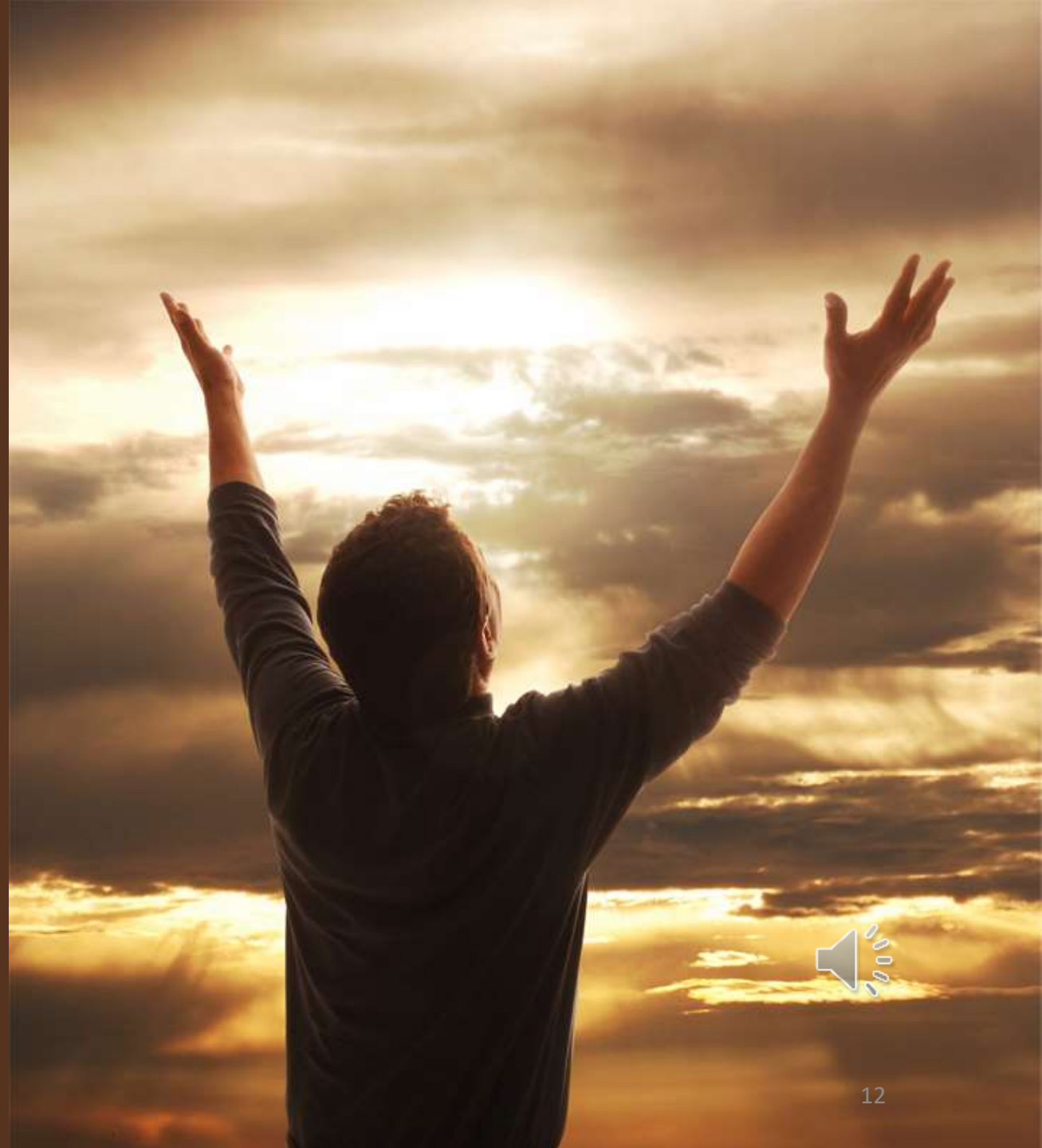

He Creates.

Everything we make is put together with existing materials or built on previous thoughts. YHVH has the capacity of speaking things into existence, not just galaxies and life forms, but solutions to today's problems. Adonai is creative, for us. His power is something he wants us to be aware of and to rely on.



"Great is our Yahuah and mighty in power; his understanding has no limit." *(Psalms 147:5)*

"...where does my help come from? My help comes from YHVH, the Maker of heaven and earth." *(Psalms 121:1,2)*

YHVH is Forgiving.

We sin. We tend to do things our way instead of HIS way. And he sees it and knows it. YAH does not merely overlook such sin, but is prepared to judge and condemn people for their sin. However, HE is forgiving and will

forgive us from the moment we begin a relationship with him. Yahusha, the Son of YHVH, paid for our sin with his death on a cross. He rose from the dead and offers us this forgiveness.



"We are made right in Elohim's sight when we trust in Yahusha Ha Mashiach to take away our sins. And we all can be saved in this same way, no matter who we are or what we have done... We are made right with Elohim when we believe that Yahusha shed his blood, sacrificing his life for us." (Romans 3:22,25)

He is **Honest**.

Just like a person who lets you know their thoughts and feelings, Elohim clearly tells us about himself, the possible difference being, he is always honest. Everything he says about himself, or about us, is reliable information. Truer

than our feelings, thoughts, and perception, Elohim is totally accurate and honest in what he says. Every promise he makes to us can be fully counted on, he means it. **We can take him at his word.**



"The unfolding of your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple. Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (*Psalms 119:130,105*)



Yahuah is ABLE!

How would you like to be always 100% right, about everything? YHVH is. His wisdom is unlimited. He understands all the elements of a situation, including the history and future events related to it. We do not have to update him, counsel him or persuade him to do the right thing. He will, because he is capable and his motives are pure. If we trust him, he will never make a mistake, never undercut us or deceive us. He can be fully trusted to do what is right, in all circumstances, at all times!



"No one whose hope is in you will ever be put to shame..." *(Psalms 25:3) New International Version*

Or Psalms 9:10 KJV, "And they that know thy name will put their trust in thee: for thou, YHVH, hast not forsaken them that seek thee."



What hope and encouragement for those, who have faith in this great Elohim of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, Yahuah Elohim!

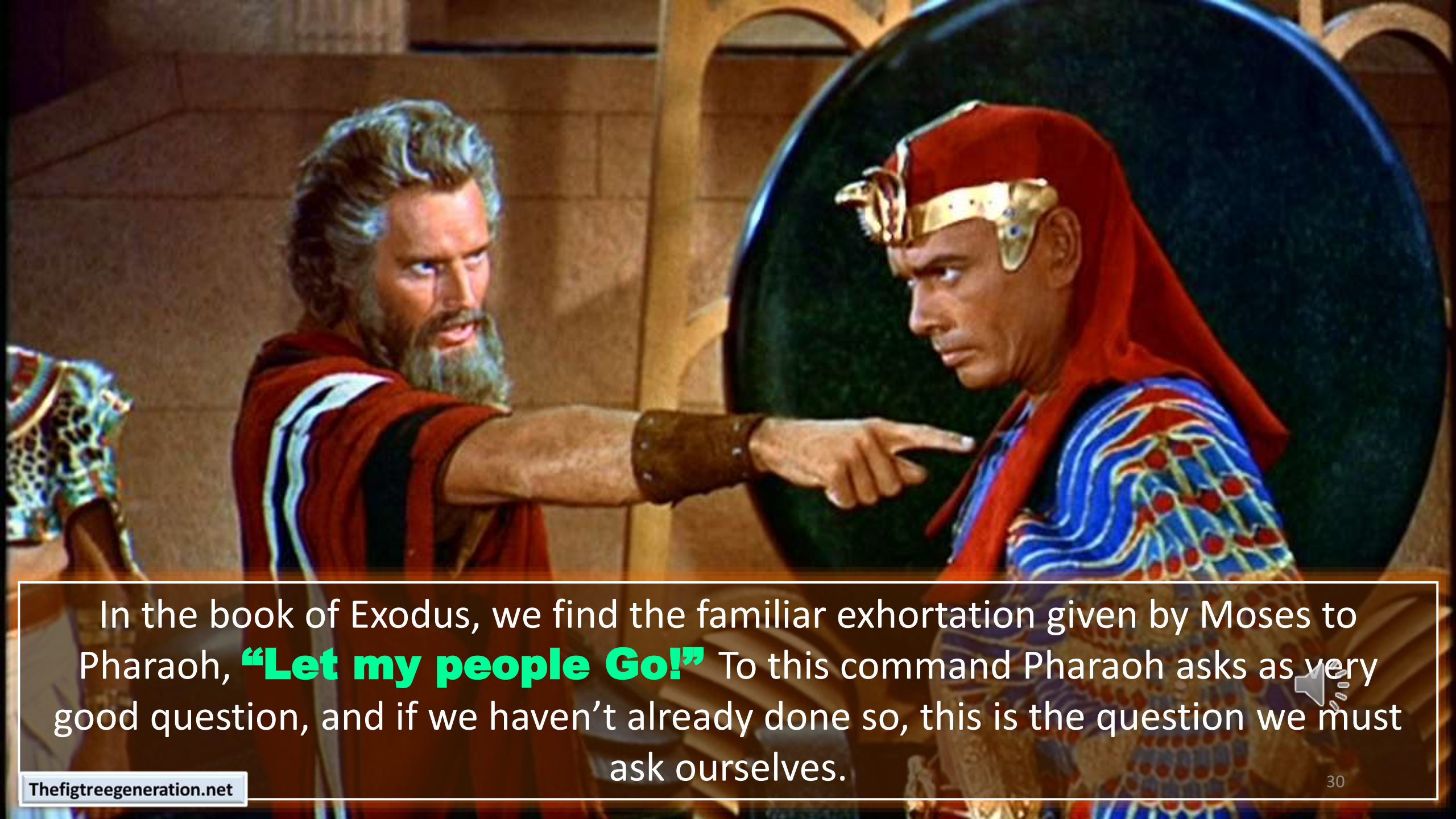
Yahuah's Greatness is **unmatchable, priceless**. Who but YHVH could beautifully design this creation and could spread out the enormity of space, who but Him could set in motion the events of your life, who but Him would love sinners so much to send His only Son?



In this Power Point Presentation there are two essential points that I want to communicate. The first is the concept **of knowing Adonai**, which leads to listening to Him.


And the second concept is an important aspect of **how one is to identify the will and voice of Elohim.**





In the book of Exodus, we find the familiar exhortation given by Moses to Pharaoh, **“Let my people Go!”** To this command Pharaoh asks as very good question, and if we haven’t already done so, this is the question we must ask ourselves.



Exodus 5:2 (ASV) “And Pharaoh said, **Who is Jehovah, that I should hearken unto his voice to let Israel go**  **know not Jehovah**, and moreover I will not let Israel go.”

Pharaoh had many Elohim, why listen to this one? In our day people have many mighty-ones in their lives that contend with the Elohim Of Yisra'el and His voice. To Pharaoh, the very idea of obeying a Elohim he had never seen, a Elohim of lowly slaves of shepherd stock, was ludicrous! And this Moses was not a very convincing speaker either. What does a leader of sheep know about leading men? And his brother Aaron is only a slave and the son of a slave. Neither Moses nor Aaron possess any quality that would impress Pharaoh.



So, how can a Elohim who
would send a shepherd
fugitive and a slave to deliver
His warning be revered by the
powerful Pharaoh?



Just as Pharaoh had many Elohim with different names, so too today people have many mighty ones that are known by diverse names. You may know a few of them personally. I will name just a few; “materialism”, “television”, “sports”, “video games”, “politics”, “pornography”, “anger”, “drugs”, and finally “oneself”.



This question of “who is Yahuah that I should listen to His voice” goes straight to the core of Deuteronomy 6:4 (The Restoration Name Bible) “Hear, O Israel: Yahuah is our Elohim, Yahuah alone.”




Moses had recently just discovered the Elohim Of Israel personally and was proclaiming this one and only Elohim to the skeptical Pharaoh. This Pharaoh would soon learn the fear of Elohim and would soon know that there is no Elohim like the Elohim of Yisra'el. For those who have personally encountered the awesome power of Yahuah in their life, such a one understands what it means to proclaim, “Who is like you, Yahuah, among the Elohims? Who is like you, glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders?” Exodus 15:11 (*World English Bible*)



For those who know the Elohim of Israel, and have experienced His glorious holiness in their lives and have developed a healthy awe for Him...Such people understand the praise and obedience do to Him and understand that there is none else to whom we owe are obedience to...It won't matter how powerful something is in our life...It won't matter because the fear of YHVH will outweigh any other outside influence in our life. It will govern every decision we make, and every action we take. If we skipped this first wisdom in our walk with HIM, and we truly want to know Him...we should pray that He instills it in us.



He who truly knows the Elohim of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob (Israel) understands who He is and knows why they should listen to His voice, as apposed to the other mighty ones in this world. As Pharaoh makes the statement in question we see that he was about to get schooled through the Divine School. In a relatively short period of time Pharaoh would learn what it takes some their whole lifetime to learn. He would learn the essence of the words in Deuteronomy 6:4 and that there is nothing else to fear besides Yahuah Elohim, the only true and living Elohim, the Elohim of Israel. 

There are many who don't know Yahuah, and thus don't listen to His voice. Some are self-proclaimed unbelievers, some call themselves Christians, and some call themselves Messianic. But it doesn't



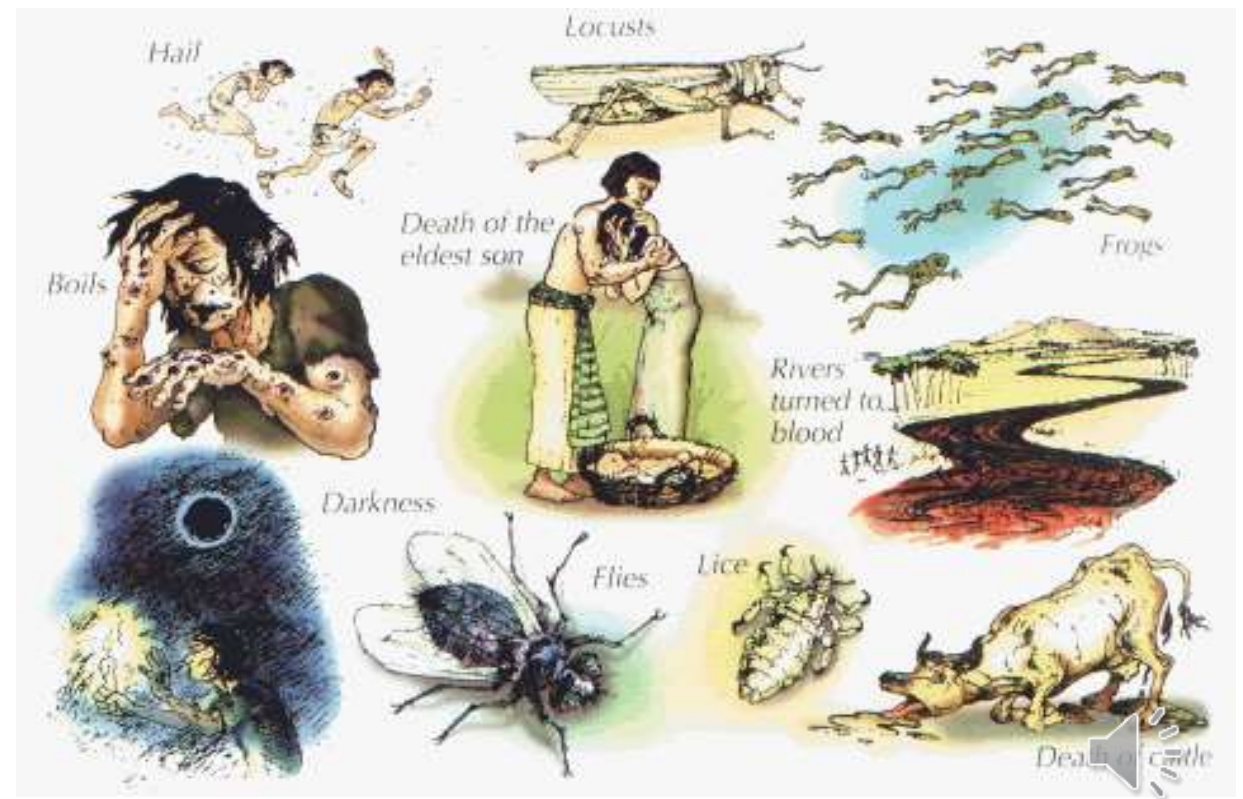
matter what you call yourself...knowing the Father is directly connected to obeying His Voice. This is evident in the second part of Pharaoh's response as we see in Exodus 5:2. **The result of not knowing YHWH is disobedience.** Pharaoh states, **"I know not Yahuah, and moreover I will not let Israel go."**

Like Pharaoh, are there areas in your life where your heart is hardened against The Elohim Of Israel and His will? Will He in His love have to chasten you so that you repent? Believe it or not, the plagues of Egypt were actually a sign of Elohim's love for the nation of Egypt.



In Hebrews 12:5-7 – KJV - we read, “And ye have forgotten the exhortation which speaketh unto you as unto children, My son, despise not thou the chastening of YHVH, nor faint when thou art rebuked of him: 6. For whom Yahuah loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth. 7. If ye endure chastening, Elohim dealeth with you as with sons; for what son is he whom the father chasteneth not?”

Did we ever consider that one of the reasons that YHVH gave Egypt ten plagues was **that He was giving them ten chances to repent out of love for them**? Elohim could have just destroyed them with any one of the plagues. And many of them did repent. Many of them found refuge in the house marked with the blood of the lamb. **Indeed, a mixed multitude joined Israel in their exodus from Egypt.**



Yahuah punishes sinners not necessarily through external punishment but by letting the awful consequences of their own bad lifestyles show them the error of their ways. He even did this with Israel after the Exodus. In Psalms 81:11-14 the author describes Elohim saying, **“How my people did not listen to my voice; Israel would have none of me. So I gave them over to their stubborn hearts, to follow their own counsels. O that my people would listen to me, that Israel would walk in my ways! I would soon subdue their enemies and turn my hand against their foes.”**



Sceptics should know that Yahuah Elohim will punish us by letting us engage in our foolish sins, but as soon as we desire to repent, he will deliver us from our sins. He allowed Pharaoh to wallow in his foolish disobedience. Elohim was not the primary cause of that disobedience and would have allowed Pharaoh to repent if Pharaoh had chosen to do that. Pharaoh's failure to do that and not release the Israelite's says more about his character than Yahuah's.



Pharaoh had his chance to peacefully release the Israelites, **but he ignored Yahuah's warnings and hardened his heart.**

This description of events, preserves Elohim's sovereignty.

YHVH is not thwarted by Pharaoh's obstinacy but has providentially foreseen

it and uses it for the good of his people. As a consequence of Pharaoh's own actions, Elohim allowed Pharaoh's heart to reach its maximum level of stubbornness, and Israel's freedom was purchased at a heavy price for the Egyptians. **It took 10 plaques for Pharaoh to get to know**

YHVH and to submit to HIM, at least for a while.



Many Egyptians, including Pharaoh, rejected the instructions of YHVH. Disobedience to Elohim's instruction put us in a dangerous position. When we neglect one of the precepts found in Torah we are not simply transgressing Torah, we are denying the One who gave us the precept. Indeed, we are denying the dominion of Yahuah in our life when we neglect His precepts and instructions. And, when we keep His precepts, we are accepting HIM and His dominion in our life.



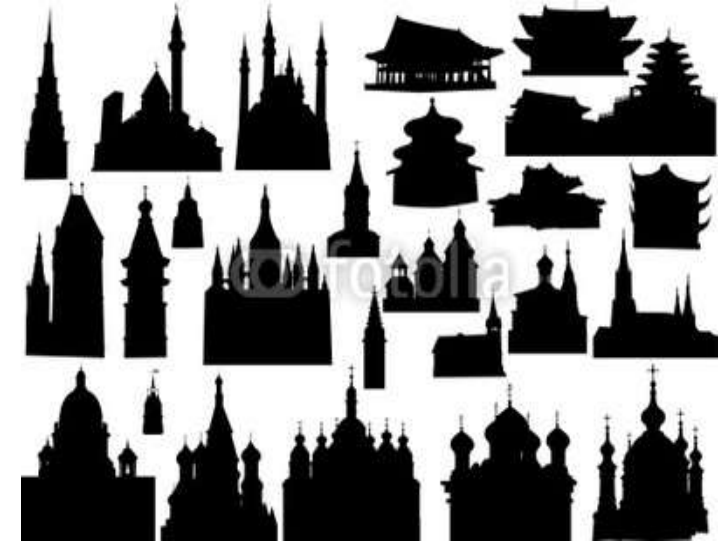
The ten plagues spoken of in the book of Exodus are greatly magnified when we compare them to the future plagues found in the Book of revelation. The purpose of these plagues are the same to judge the false Elohims of this world. As mentioned before, the people of Egypt had many Elohims they served and worshipped and that governed different aspects of their lives and their environment. In the future Yahuah pours out His plagues upon the Earth, He will be judging these false Elohims of this world that people have given themselves over to instead of giving themselves to the one and only true Elohim of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the Elohim of Israel to serve and to walk in his commandments, statutes and judgments.



There are a lot of people today that identify themselves as believers in Messiah, but neither know Him, or The Elohim of Israel. In Matthew 7:21-23, our Master Yahusha states, (CJB) "Not everyone who says to me, 'Adonai, Adonai!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, only those who do what my Father in heaven wants. On that Day, many will say to me, 'Adonai, Adonai! Didn't we prophesy in your name? Didn't we expel demons in your name? Didn't we perform many miracles in your name?' Then I will tell them to their faces, 'I never knew you! Get away from me, you workers of lawlessness!'"



Now, if I got up in the middle of many Churches in America today and proclaimed the message that our Rabbi did in the passage, we just read...I would probably be cast out and be labeled a **“legalist”**. What message would I be cast out for?...the message that proclaims,



“Only those who do what my Father in Heaven wants will enter the Kingdom of Heaven”. And I would certainly be silenced for later qualifying the statement by saying that those who make it a habit, those who intentionally make it their lifestyle, to break Elohim’s Law, His Torah, are those who will **not** enter the Kingdom of Heaven. I have no doubt that I would be thrown out of many churches if I taught this. But I would not be thrown out because I was speaking of my own accord, for **these are indeed Messiah Yahusha’s own words.**



These words of Messiah are somewhat of a paradox. We are not saved by our works, but those who are saved **will have accompanying works**. Many whom proclaim the name of Yahusha, will be completely shocked at His coming when they find themselves pleading to Messiah for salvation, and He turns them away. **And it will be because they accepted the lie, because they accepted a false teacher, and a false prophet.**



In John 10:27 Yahusha states, **"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me"**.

In John 18:37 we read, "Pilate therefore said to him, "Are you a king then?" Yahusha answered, *"You say that I am a king. For this reason, I have been born, and for this reason I have come into the world, that I should testify to the truth. **Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice.**"*



What is this “**truth**” that Messiah Yahusha speaks of here?
Scripture has the answer for us.
In Psalms 119:142 we read,



“Your righteousness is eternal righteousness, and your Torah is truth.”

What is the litmus test to make sure we are not actually walking in the footsteps of Pharaoh instead of the footsteps of Messiah?



Again, Scripture has the answer for us. In 1Joh 2:3-6 it states,
“The way we can be sure we know him is if we are obeying his commands. Anyone who says, “I know him,” but isn't obeying his commands is a liar — the truth is not in him. But if someone keeps doing what he says, then truly love for Elohim has been brought to its goal in him. This is how we are sure that we are united with him. **A person who claims to be continuing in union with him ought to conduct his life the way he did.**”

In 1Peter believers in Messiah Yahusha are described as a Royal Priesthood. In 1Peter 2:7-12 (CJB) it states, “Now to you who keep trusting, he is precious. But to those who are not trusting, "The very stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone"; also he is a stone that will make people stumble, a rock over which they will trip. They are stumbling at the Word, disobeying it — as had been planned. ...



....But you are a chosen people, the King's Priests, a holy nation, a people for Elohim to possess! Why? In order for you to declare the praises of the One who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are Elohim's people; before, you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. Dear friends, I urge you as aliens and temporary residents not to give in to the desires of your old nature, which keep warring against you;



.....but to live such good lives among the pagans that even though they now speak against you as evil-doers, they will, as a result of seeing your good actions, give glory to Elohim on the Day of his coming.”

Is this language of being a holy priesthood unique to the writings we find in 1Peter?
Or do we find its original context in the Torah?

In Exodus 19:3-6 we read the context of being a set-apart Priesthood and those who have been delivered through the blood of the Passover lamb are those who listen to the voice of The Elohim Of Israel.

Exodus 19:3-6 (KJV), “And Moses went up unto Elohim, and YHVH called unto him out of the mountain, saying, Thus shalt thou say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel; 4. Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself. 5. Now therefore, **if** ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth is mine: 6. And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and a holy nation. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel.”



In the book of Revelation in chapter 3:20 Messiah Yahusha states, **“Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, then I will come in to him, and will dine with him, and he with me.”**

Will you join the disciples, the holy ones, the saints of Elohim, in the “The End Of Days” for the marriage feast of the Lamb? **Will you be one of the comparably few that hear His voice and open the door to His dominion in your life?**



**Will you indeed allow this Jewish Rabbi into you and allow Him to live His life through you?
Are you afraid what people will think when people start seeing how much you are starting to sound and look like this "Jewish" Rabbi and how much less people start seeing the one they knew and were comfortable with?**



If today you hear His voice, listen to the words found in the book of Revelation in chapter 18:1-5 (KJV),
“And after these things I saw another angel come down from heaven, having great power; and the earth was lightened with his glory. 2. And he cried mightily



with a strong voice, saying, Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen, and is become the habitation of devils, and the hold of every foul spirit, and a cage of every unclean and hateful bird. 3 For all nations have drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication, and the kings of the earth have committed fornication with her, and the merchants of the earth are waxed

...rich through the abundance of her delicacies. 4. And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues. 5. For her sins have reached unto heaven, and Elohim hath remembered her iniquities.”



But even though we love our Master and find pride in serving Him, let us be circumspect to keep a true servant's heart about us and not become puffed up.



In Luke 17:7-10 our Master Yahusha taught us thus (CJB), “But who is there among you, having a servant plowing or keeping sheep, that will say, when he comes in from the field, 'Come immediately and sit down at the table,' and will not rather tell him, 'Prepare my supper, clothe yourself properly, and serve me, while I eat and drink. Afterward you shall eat and drink'? Does he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded? I think not. Even so you also, when you have done all the things that are commanded you, say, **'We are unworthy servants. We have done our duty.'**”



There are many voices in this world. How are we to know which is from YHVH? We have to be careful not to confuse our own passions, or what we see as right in our own eyes, as the voice of YHVH. The coming anti-Messiah will be characterized by many mighty works and wonders, and will move people, as he speaks great swelling words.



How will you avoid the deception? Like Satan to Yahusha, the anti-Messiah will likely even quote Scripture, or **twist Scripture**, to deceive those who claim to have faith, yet are misled by their own personal carnal passions. The scripture says **that the deception will be so great that it would come close to even deceiving the very elect.**



In Matthew 24:24 (CJB) we read where our Master Yahusha teaches us, “For **false messiahs and false prophets** will rise up. And they will give great signs and wonders, so as to lead astray, if possible, even the elect.”

If someone comes forth or comes to somebody and claims to have received a message from Heaven, this doesn't automatically mean that this voice or message should be accepted and/or obeyed, even if accompanied by signs or wonders. **We must discern the spirits!**



Any message from Heaven cannot contradict what already had been revealed in Scripture starting in Genesis 1:1!

DON'T BELIEVE EVERYTHING YOU HEAR. TEST IT FOR SCRIPTURAL VALIDITY FIRST



Beloved, believe
not every spirit,
but try the spirits
whether they are
of God: because
many false
prophets are
gone out into the
world. 1 Jn. 4:1



The word of Yahuah has already been clearly given to us and is not far away from us that we have to seek some heavenly voice to know HIS will. The word of YHVH, His Torah, has clearly been given to us to discern that which is good and that which is evil, to discern that which is righteous and that which is sin. It is by these words that we are to test the spirits and by these words alone that we are to test any would-be prophet, or teacher. Even if a voice from Heaven issues forth to supposedly clarify something for us, or somebody receives a word from Heaven to teach us something, **we must reject it if it is not in accordance with the already written Torah of Israel's Elohim.**



The truth alone will set us free from a multitude of bad doctrines, many of which are indeed from demonic voices. Adonai's character is revealed in His Torah, and He doesn't change, He is eternal and is The Eternal One.



**And that is who He is that we should listen to His voice,
and His voice alone.**



His will has already been revealed to us and by this His sheep hear HIS voice. If we test all things by His Torah, and have it written on our heart, when HE does speak, we will recognize it, and we will not respond to a foreign master.



Listening to Yahuah's voice is described as obedience in the Scriptures, and **not as "legalism"**. Ideally, as you grow in maturity you will **listen** to His voice out of a passionate love **for the Elohim Of Eternity!**



To listen in Scripture always means **to submit, to do. It means to be open to or to be receptive. The Greek word is the same root as the one for obedience, it means to be receptive!**




Here again the





Elohim!”**




