



Why “I” keep Yahuah’s yearly appointed Feast Days.

I keep Yahuah’s appointed times, because they are still binding for His people today. These are a compacted prophecy of the plan of redemption. Keeping the feast days is considered “Jewish” and are even

despised and ridiculed by Christians and claimed that these ended at the cross, which is false! Over the past two thousand years, traditional Christianity has systematically laid aside the “feast days of Yahuah” and established their own holidays like Christmas, Easter, Halloween and others, which originated in paganism. Even the weekly Sabbath was abandoned in favor of Sunday, the pagan day of the sun, supposedly commemorate Messiah’s resurrection.

The questions we all need to ask ourselves: **Does it matter** to my Creator which weekly day I do keep? The 1st day or the 7th day of the week?



Does it matter to my Creator, which annual holidays I keep? His appointed feast days or man-made holidays? You and I have a choice! The choices we make will affect our eternal destinies, it impacts our relationship with our

Creator, the Elohim of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel!

Consider Yahuah’s words in Malachi 3:6 “**For I am YHVH (Yahuah), I do not change!**” **That means:** YHVH didn’t change his Sabbath to Sunday, He didn’t change His feasts to pagan holidays, He didn’t make unclean foods clean, the pig is still unfit for humans to eat, He didn’t replace his people Israel with the Christian Church, He didn’t do away with his Torah, He didn’t change His son’s Name from Yahusha to Iesous (Jesus), He didn’t send his Son to save

the world, He came only to save the people that accept Yahusha (not the Greek Jesus) as their Savior. Those that repent of their sins, and keep His blood ratified covenant that He made at Mt. Sinai, with Yashar'el with the commandments, statutes and judgments.

It is an established fact that the yearly appointed times are the feasts of YHVH, for He said so in Leviticus 23:2 **“Speak unto the children of Yashar’el, and say unto them, [Concerning] the feasts of YHVH, which ye shall proclaim [to be] holy convocations, [even] these [are] my feasts.”**

These are MY feasts!

Then in Exodus 23 He lists the weekly Sabbath as His first feast and thereafter he lists the three groups of the annual festivals (spring, mid-summer and the fall feasts) namely the Passover, Unleavened Bread, First Fruits, Pentecost, the Feast of Trumpets, the Day of Atonement and ending with the Feast of Tabernacles. Then he said, **these are statutes that are FOREVER. These festivals are about worshipping the Creator and Savior.**

In Acts 5:29 we read: **“Then Peter and the other apostles answered and said, we ought to obey YHVH rather than men.”** KJV This is the stand every believer should take whenever he or she is challenged on Biblical Issues!

We are not being called out of Yashar'el to celebrate Egyptian holidays; we are being called out of Egypt to celebrate Yahuah's feast days listed in Leviticus 23. Yahuah's true people have always been easily identified by the holidays they keep, because whoever controls your calendar controls your life.

The Feast days are not only the original "holidays" of humankind, which inspired the very concept of keeping annual celebrations, but these days are also a part of an ongoing, living law of YHVH specifically given to man. They do not belong to the Jews or any man; they are observances for all the world to keep forever.

The phrase "keep the feast" is in the bible 7 times. Six times in in the Old Testament where it is all too obvious that Yahuah is commanding the children of Israel to "KEEP THE FEAST". Then why is it that in the New Testament, when the exact same phrase is used, we are supposed to believe that the term "keep the feast" means **"DON'T keep the feast"**?




What happened to these feasts of the Creator? How were they lost?

Everybody should be asking questions! There is nothing wrong with honest and sincere questions. How did some of those things come about? When did it start? Who is behind all that?

An enemy has removed them and replaced them with holidays that honor the pagan false gods!

False teachers and prophets within Christianity during the past 2,000 years came in sheep's clothing, but being ravening wolves and changed the truth into a lie introducing a counterfeit Messiah called Jesus Christ, which is a mask for Tammuz!

The covenant Yahuah made with Yashar'el at Sinai is for all time,
 **it has never been cancelled!** That means it is as much in force today as it was then!

Take special note that Yahusha **at no time "loosened" either Torah or the Prophets!** The prophetic Word YHVH gave to His prophets cannot be loosed or annulled, **and neither can the Torah of YHVH.** These are two witnesses that stand as One. The Word of YHVH is both Torah (instruction in righteousness) and Prophecy declaring, foretelling and revealing the Will of YHVH to each generation.

It is insane to what extent Christianity will go to twist the meaning of the word "fulfill" in Matthew 5:17 as an example to make it fit their theology of lawlessness, claiming that the Torah was removed for today's believers.

"Fulfill" means to carry out or to bring to realization, to perform or do, as in a person's duty; or follow the Commandments, statutes and judgments by obeying them (Isaiah 42:21 "YHVH is well pleased for His righteousness' sake; He will magnify Torah and make it honorable.



These are listed in the book of the covenant.
Leviticus 23:14 "It shall be a statute" (H2708)

Unleavened Bread

Leviticus 23:21 "It shall be a statute" (H2708) **Pentecost**

Leviticus 23:31 "It shall be a statute" (H2708) **Day of Atonement**

Leviticus 23:41 "It shall be a statute" (H2708) **Feast of Tabernacles**

Every one of these # H2708 Statutes are the bride's part of the covenant agreement. The bridegroom's part are the #H2706.

Some people keep the 7th Day Sabbath weekly, but do X-mas, Easter, Valentines, etc. yearly. Some ignore the pagan holidays but they also ignore YHVH's yearly Feasts.



The Lamb's Bride is to have no spot or wrinkle! In Leviticus chapter 23 Yahuah calls **the 7th Day Sabbath and the yearly feasts "the feasts of YHVH."**

A Catholic Priest, called Father T. Enright wrote a letter in June 1905, stating clearly that the Catholic Church was the power who had not only abolished the 7th Day Sabbath but also the Feasts of Yahuah Elohim. The Sabbath keeping Church I was a member of for 50 years, used that letter frequently in their evangelistic meetings, but they conveniently never mentioned this sentence: **"but also the Feasts of Yahuah Elohim."** I WONDER WHY?

This was all prophesied in Daniel 7:25

- **"He shall think ... to change times and laws."** *KJV*
- **"Thinking ... to change the feast days and the law."** *New American Bible*
- **"Thinking to change the feast days and the law."** *New Catholic Translation*
- **"He will try to change their religious laws and festivals."** *Good News Bible*
- **"Calendar and ordinance, he shall think to set aside."** *Knox Bible*



What about the timing of the yearly feasts? There is much confusion in this respect.

Some people, including Judaism are looking for the sunset on Friday evening to usher in the weekly Sabbath. They are also looking to the moon (whether conjunction or crescent) to calculate when the month begins, so they can calculate the appointed worship statutes. This is paganism and comes from Babylon while Israel was in captivity for 70 years. There are **no** Torah instructions for beginning any month with any phase of the moon

We have ‘Zero’ Scriptural Permission!

- Consider this website quote: which we copied in the year of 2016, and two years later this was removed from the website; I wonder who was behind the removal?

- **“There is zero scriptural evidence for sighting new moons to determine the beginning of new months. It is based 100% on teachings within the Talmud.”**
- **The ancient [pagan] Greeks** recognized the visible new moon as the beginning of the month when they celebrated the “sickle of the new moon” with offerings and meals. This was also the case with the ancient Babylonians who worshipped the new moon as the goddess Isis, and had her wearing horns, which resembled the new moon.” (Theological Dictionary of the New Testament, vol. 4, p. 639.)
- Yahuah’s 1st day of the new year is the day after the spring-equinox, because it is the spring Equinox / Tequfah that ends the old year. Logically the next day begins the new year.
- This happens to be the First Day of Spring and the 1st day of the month Abib and the first day of the year.
- It is that simple.

- To find the 1st day of the 2nd month, just count to 30.
- The 30th day ends the old month; the next day begins the new month.

The Seven Feasts of Yahuah found in Leviticus 23:1-44 are a SIGN that you are His Bride!

- ☐ The Sabbath not Sunday
- ☐ The Passover not Easter
- ☐ The Feast of First Fruits not Lent
- ☐ The Feast of Weeks (Shavuot/Pentecost) not Mothers Day
- ☐ The Feast of Trumpets not Halloween
- ☐ The Day of Atonement not Guy Fawkes
- ☐ The Feast of Booths or Tabernacles not Christmas

The weekly Sabbath is the 1st feast day listed.

The Seventh day Sabbath starts at dawn The set-apart time is from dawn to dusk. Some people do not agree with me as they believe that all of the 24

hours are set-apart. The Sabbath is a memorial of our Creator and reminds us that when we keep the Sabbath, we can rest in the assurance that our Creator and Redeemer is in control!

1. Passover! Celebrated on the 14th day of the first month, starting at dusk!

When we celebrate the Passover, we learn Yahusha our Passover Lamb was sacrificed for our sins. 1Peter 1:19, 1 Peter 2:24, John 1:29. As Yahusha delivered His people Yashar'el from the bondage of slavery in Egypt, so He intended to deliver them from the bondage of sin.

2. Feast of Unleavened Bread – starts on the 15th day of the first month until the 21st day! The first and the last days are Sabbaths.

The unleavened bread symbolizes the putting away of sin as Yahusha was unleavened, he did not sin. We realize our constant need to obey Yahuah...

3. Firstfruits follows the Seventh-day Sabbath during Unleavened Bread. Thus, First Fruits is the Sunday that falls within this festival week. (Lev 23:10-11).

As the first fruits offered on the first day of Pentecost pointed to the harvest to come, Yahusha's resurrection is the Firstfruits that points to the harvest of believers to be resurrected at His coming.

4. Feast of Pentecost (Shavuot)!

This feast is calculated from First Fruits. After we count seven complete weeks (Sabbaths) which is called the counting of the Omar, Scripture commands that we add a 50th day. This 50th day marks the Feast of Weeks and is where we receive the name "Pentecost." It always falls on a Sunday. Count seven full weeks after the Sabbath day. Pentecost is also called the Feast of Weeks. At Shavuot, Yahuah gave the Israelites the Covenant Torah. Pentecost is also the crowning of Yahusha's Passover in heaven, which was manifested on earth with the outpouring of His Spirit.

5. Feast of Trumpets – 1st day of the 7th month

The Feast of Trumpets reflects the Father's desire to summon His people to repentance, so that He can vindicate them on the day of His judgment.

6. The day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) – the 10th day of the 7th month.

Teshuva (turning away from sin) and the Days of Awe: The Shofar Sounds the Call to Repentance. This is a special time of forgiveness where we both request forgiveness from those we have wronged and extend forgiveness to those who have wronged us.

7. The feast of Tabernacles! This is celebrated from the 15th day of the 7th month to the 22nd day of the 7th month! With an additional added, called Shemini Atzeret!

It is the most joyous feast! It fell during the time of year when the hearts of the people would naturally be full of thankfulness, gladness, and expectancy. All the crops had been long stored; and now all fruits were also gathered, the vintage past, and the land only awaited the softening and refreshment of the 'latter rain,' to prepare it for a new crop.

Shemini Atzeret means "the eighth day of assembly." It is the eighth (8) day or the last day of the Tabernacle feast. The whole feast and especially the 8. Day represents a new beginning, and it is believed by some that this is the first day the redeemed will enter Heaven in order to take part at the supper of the lamb.

Worship on counterfeit worship days dishonors the Creator. Clinging to pagan holidays and refusing to observe Yahuwah's feasts, breaks the divine law and your disobedience will be your eternal damnation.

Yahuah never changed His appointments! Never! The yearly appointed festivals are still valid today for His followers! It was the Anti-Messiah. Satan himself who did away with them.

We celebrate Biblical Feasts because it's a Bible thing, Messiah's Feasts ...

Passover ... the Messiah was Impaled.
Unleavened Bread ... Messiah was buried.
First Fruits ... Messiah was Risen.
Shavuot ... Holy Spirit was given.
Yom Teruah ... Messiah's Second Coming.
Yom Kippur ... The Day of Judgment.
Sukkot ... Marriage Supper of the Lamb.
Last Great Day ... Eternity with Yahuah.
CLARLY, NOT A 'JEWISH' THING!

All festivals have had fulfillment in the 1st application during the first 4,000 years of history.

Yahusha fulfilled His part of all the Festivals during His Messianic time on earth, the second application.

All the Festivals are still awaiting their complete and final third application through Yahusha's Bride, the 144,000 (Revelation 14:1-5). These are completely unleavened people to be chosen as the final Wave Sheaf/First Fruits to be anointed at Pentecost. They will also herald in the kingdom, after the final Day of Atonement where all are "sealed or marked," and then the long-awaited 2nd Coming will finally be realized at Tabernacles.

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
