1991-1998: Building the Network - Maria Luisa "Ilo" Echevarria-Wallenstein, HS-65, AB/BSC-70

Ilo spearheaded the effort, joined by thirteen members of HS-65, to form the nucleus of the nascent association of alumnae in the tri-state area of New York, New Jersey and Connecticut.

1999-2002: Structuring the Organization - Lenore Raquel-Santos Lim, HS-63

Under Lenore's leadership, the association was established as a corporation and registered as an educational foundation under the name CHS/HGC USA/Canada Foundation, Inc. The plan was to create nine chapters covering the continental United States, Hawaii and Canada.

2003-2005: Becoming CHSNAF – Francisca M. Tayag, HS-65

Under Francis' leadership, the association was incorporated as CHS North America Foundation, Inc. (CHSNAF) in New York City.In 2005, its tax-exempt status was granted under the 501c3 section of the IRS Code. CHSNAF held its first Grand Reunion/Conference in New York City in the same year.

2006-2007: Working as CHSNAF - Ma. Luisa "Ilo" Echevarria-Wallenstein, HS-65, AB/BSC-70

Ilo was elected the first CHSNAF President. Her focus was on building the infrastructure to support the operation of a tax-exempt foundation in full compliance of the IRS code. Another priority was building membership and consolidating limited resources of the foundation to help CHSM and establish CHSNAF as the center of North America-based alumnae to reach out to one another.

2008-2010: Forging a Role for CHSNAF in CHSM's Future – Deanna Go Bio, AB-58, BSC-59

Deanna forged a role for CHSNAF in rebuilding CHSM to the level of excellence it once exemplified. She established relationships with the CHSM Administration, the SSpS leadership and CHSAF. Many joint class projects were completed during her term, e.g., the HS-68 Caritas Hall, HS-73 Bubong Project among others, including fund-raising for the Scholarship Fund and the Faculty Development Fund.

2011-2013: Affirming CHSNAF's Commitment to CHSM – Ellen Young-Gomez, HS-68

Ellen started the use of social media and other electronic means to communicate with alumnae to develop and maintain interest in and commitment to the association. CHSNAF-sponsored projects during her term included refurbishing and air-conditioning of the Paraclete Auditorium. CHSNAF's commitment to CHSM in the areas of scholarship, technology, faculty development and facilities improvement were affirmed.

2014-2016: Celebrating CHSNAF's turning Silver – Mary Anne Tinio-Fadul, HS-72

During Mary Anne's term, deliberations started on the going concern of CHSM. It was also a time of catastrophic disasters hitting the Philippines which led Mary Anne to shift focus from CHSM to disaster relief. CHSNAF rebuilt livelihood projects for pedicab drivers and fishermen in Leyte, built classrooms in partnership with Feed the Hungry Inc and provided water filtration units in Capiz.

2017-2019: Empowering CHSNAF for the Future – Eleanor "Butchie" Dimalanta-Reyes, HS-80

Butchie renewed CHSNAF's commitment to support CHSM's Scholarship and Faculty Development Programs and to strengthen the infrastructure of CHSNAF by enhancing communications among members, CHSAF and CHSM. CHSNAF participated more actively in CHSAF's projects such as the Sagip Aral project and the Laudate Si Garden.

2020-2022: Keeping the Spirit Alive through Turbulent Times – Yolanda Reyes-Lim, HS-68

Undaunted by the turbulence created by the pandemic and the closing of CHSM, Yoly continued to pursue the CHS mission of Veritas in Caritate. Amid this uncertain time, CHSNAF initiated the Poinsettia Feeding Program, the Indigenous Peoples Missions, the SSpS Unified Scholarship Program and the One-Tree Planted Program. A stronger partnership with CHSAF and the SSpS Congregation was forged. Updated By-laws and standard operating procedures.

2023-2025: Establishing CHSNAF as a SSpS Mission Partner – Eloisa "Ellie" Mesina-Cabanayan, AB67/BSC-68

Under Ellie's leadership, CHSNAF was acknowledged as a mission-partner by the SSpS Provincial Leadership and a full partner of CHSAF in keeping Truth in Love alive. The Unified SSpS Scholarship Program, the SSpS IP Missions and the SSpS IP College Program are set at full throttle and a project to bring clean water to the Aeta community in the mountain village of Yangka in Capas, Tarlac will break ground by early 2026. The One-Tree Planted, a global save-the-planet reforestation program is now a beneficiary of our fund-raising efforts as well.

CHSNAF Lifetime Service Awards

Maria Luisa Echevarria-Wallenstein



"Ilo" spearheaded the creation of the first CHS alumnae association, starting in the Tri-State area of New York, New Jersey and Connecticut. In 1991, the first local alumnae reunion of 85 alumnae took place with a simple potluck lawn picnic. This was the humble beginning of what CHSNAF is today, a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit charitable foundation. During the COVID lockdown in 2020, she learned the new face-to-face platform of Zoom meetings and continued to teach the Word of God through Zoom and herself as Facilitator. Her Bible class has grown to more than 30 participants on Fridays. She leads the Mother Josepha Prayer Weavers, a rosary group that prays daily for the recovery of those with illnesses or death in the CHS family. Ilo dedicates her life by sharing God's love and gifts of the Holy Spirit through her profound knowledge of the Bible to alumnae across the United States, Canada, and the Philippines. Ilo's lifelong service to CHSNAF as one of its pioneers, president, officer, Adviser, and a faithful steward of the Holy Spirit deserves recognition.

Deanna Go Bio



Deanna was invited to join the group of alumnae in June 2004 that later became CHSNAF, a 501(c)(3) non-profit foundation of alumnae of the College of the Holy Spirit, Manila. Deanna spent the last 20 years of her life as a gift sparked by the Holy Spirit that propelled her to be fully engaged in the pursuit of a purposeful life. She was one of CHSNAF's pioneer officers, adviser, consultant, and a great contributor to the CHSNAF mission. Deanna is engaged as a Mission Partner in various ministries of the SSpS congregation and the College of the Holy Spirit Alumnae Foundation CHSAF). Partnering with CHSAF enabled CHSNAF to participate in joint projects to help the Indigenous People (IP). Through Deana's significant efforts, CHSNAF contributed to fund a Two Million Water Project of CHSAF in Yangka, Capas, Tarlac, Philippines, and the complete renovation of a primitive kitchen of the Paidyanan Mission School. She travels to remote sites of our Mission Schools to visit students and nuns. Her strong commitment to education and upliftment of the quality of life of our IP is a lifetime labor of love.

Lenore Raquel Santos Lim



Lenore served as President of the College of the Holy Spirit/Holy Ghost College (CHS/HGC)-USA Canada Foundation, Inc. from 1999 through 2001. She led the organization through a pivotal transition to becoming a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt foundation and what is now known as College of the Holy Spirit North America Foundation, Inc. Under her leadership, the first official alumni directory was published during Las Vegas Reunion, cataloging over 2,000 alumni across North America. That same reunion also sparked the idea of forming regional chapters, laying the groundwork for deeper community engagements. Lenore continues to serve CHSNAF as a former President, and in an advisory capacity to current and former presidents. Although Leonor's artistic excellence has earned widespread successes as a gifted artist that has earned her the title of Artist Emeritus with the Society of Philippine American Artist, she remains faithful to her legacy as an active officer and alumna member, and a servant of the Holy Spirit.

Francis Malonzo Tayag



Francis, HS-65 and BSC-69 is one of the founders and early presidents of CHSNAF. It was through the relentless pursuit of her vision that CHSNAF became an alumnae association with non-profit status as defined under the 501c3 section of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) tax code. When Francis was President, CHSNAF's motto, "Kindle the Spirit, take on the Challenge" stirred up nostalgia and spurred the spirit to action. Francis' casual leadership style belies a dogged commitment to the values of Veritas in Caritate and in CHSNAF as a place for female camaraderie and women empowerment. This inspired a non-alumna friend to bequeath a Legacy Fund to CHSNAF with Francis as Executor for the purpose of expanding and sustaining the organization "where one could truly feel the love and care the members for one another." Francis continues to search, mentor, and build up the ranks of alumnae membership for the next generation of leaders. Her dedication to the CHSNAF mission deserves commendation.




